



Energ artillery from the direction of ChitVILLERS, LITTLE WOOD and FYS, was active throughout his day.

OUR ARTILLERY.

early morning, retaliatory fire by 18-pdrs was directed on to Minenwerfers at M.17.a.0.6. The Regimental Headquarters at M.11.d.8.5½ and the DRY DITCH in M.12.c. were subjected to special ettention. The enemy front line system, communication trenches and tracks were searched during the hours of darkness. The BAPAUME ROAD was swept by occasional bursts of fire between 8.p.m. and 4.a.m. During the day the whecking of ZERO LINES and the registration of new points and calibration of guns was carried out.

HOSTILE ARTILLERY.

considerable activity was crimced throughout the day, the shelled area being mainly MARTIN-FUICH and vicinity. The calibre of the guns varied from 77.m.m. to 8. inch and all the shelling appeared to come from the direction of LOUPART WOOD and GREVILLERS.

AIRCRAFT.

hostile 'planes in flights from 5 to 9 in number flew over our lines at 10.a.m., 10.30.a.m. 11.30.a.m. and 5.30.p.m. The plane at 11.30.a.m. appeared to be observing the enemy shelling on and around MARTINPUICH. At 10.16.a.m. a hostile machine was observed to drop two white smoke rockets, one of which burst into two red stars, while flying over M.15.o. in the direction of BAPAUME.

TRENCH MORTARS

The enemy trench mortars at M. 17. a. 8\frac{1}{2}.3. and M. 17. a. 0.6. (QUARRY) were extremely active between 8.p.m. and 11.10.p.m., but were both silenced by 18-pdr fire, which was asked for by the infantry in retaliation.

MACHINE GUNS

Machine gun reported probably on the S.W. corner of the BUTTE in M. 17.a.

OUR ARTILLE Y.

Between 10.30. p.m. and 10.42. p.m. rapid searching fire was directed on the front line system in M. 17.a.. Under cover of this hombardment the medium Trench Mortars fired on the BUTTE, and on the Minenwerfer located in the QUARRY (M. 17. a. O. 6.)

LOUPART ROAD, LOOS CUT and the tracks and communication trenches in the neighbourhood of WARLENCOURT were subjected to bursts of fire by the lo-pdrs, between 8.p.m. and 7.30.a.m..

The SUNKEN ROAD in M. 5. c. and the DRY DITCH in M. 10. a. and M. 4.c. werebarrages by the 4.5" Hows. during the hours of darknoss.




