

Method of Advance.

(b) The advance from the 1st to 2nd Objective will begin at zero plus 14 hours and from 2nd to 3rd Objective at zero plus 24 hours.

(c) The 62nd Division is responsible for the capture of BULLECOURT and is to attack simultaneously with the attacks on the HINDENBURG line, to the east and west of it. The objectives of this Division are also shown on Map "A",

The advances of the 62nd Division are to be concurrent with those of the 2nd Australian Division, and close touch is to be maintained between the attacking troops of the two Divisions as the advances take place.

The following will be the aarrangements for the attack on the HINDERBURG line by the Second Aust. Division:-



- As battalions advance in the attack, Brigade Sections 6. will, as normally, keep telephone communication in tact. It is advisable to concentrate all efforts on one or two lines instead of running many alternat / routes.

In the event of attack by this Division, the following will be the Medical Arrangements : -

Medical disposition is shown in the attached table.

O.C., 7th Aust. Field Ambulance, with that Unit complete, and bearer divisions of 5th & 6th Aust. Field Ambulances, will be responsible for the evacuation of casualties from the R.A.P's. to the Main Dressing Station. The Bearer divisions of the 2nd & 14th Aust. Field Ambulances will be at his disposal if required. All horse and motor ambulance wagons of this Division will be under

his command, and in addition O's.C., 5th & 6th Aust. Field Ambulances will each place at his disposal 5 G.S. wagons with teams and drivers. 3 horse ambiliance wagons of 5th Aust. Division, and extra teams of A.M.G. Units in 1st & 5th Aust. Divisions, will reinforce the above transport.

3. At Main Dressing Station 6th Aust. Field Ambulance will receive and clear all stretcher cases: 5th Aust. Field Ambulance will receive and clear all walking wounded,

Each R.M.O. will go forward to the Advanced R.A.P. with six squads of four bearers, who will take with them 12 stretchers and 24 blankets.

These squads will join respective R.M.O's. moving up on "Y" night at the Advanced Dressing Station and move up with them. R.M.Os of Units in line before "Y" night will notify O.C., 7th Aust. Field Ambulance of time at which they wish extra bearer squads to report to their R.A.P's.

5. A Relay Post of Field Ambulance bearers will be established at C.4.d.

An Advanced Collecting Station will be formed at C. 10. c. 7. 7 with dump of stretchers, blankets and dressings.

7. O.C., 7th Aust. Field Ambulance will post runners at Brigade

H.Q. C.10.c.9.1 to maintain touch with Field Ambulance M.O. at C.10. 0.7.7.

Horse wagons will work from Advanced Dressing Station by Road to C.14. central and thence overland to C.9.d.5.6. Wagons will be pushed forward, if circumstances permit, in front of NOREUIL.

Horse wagons will be used on road from C. 14. central to LON-

GATTE and on towards BULLECOURT if necessary.

A horse wagon will be posted on the LONGATTE Road at C.22.d. to clear casualties from this flank.

From Advanced Dressing Station C. 20. d. 2.8 cases will be cleared to Main Dressing Station I.l.c., stretcher cases by motor ambulance cars, walking wounded as much as possible by horse wagons. From Main Dressing Station stretcher cases will be evacuated to C.C.S. GREVILLERS by M.A.C. cars.

Walking wounded will be evacuated by 10 motor lorries and buses attached to 5th Aust. Field Ambulance to C.C.S. GREVILLERS.

If walking wounded cases tend to become blocked at M.D.S. they will be sent by DECAUVILLE Train from I.l.d. 7.5 to H. 32.a.3.0, at which place a motor-bus will be stationed to clear cases to C.C.S., GREVILLERS. Cases for D.R.S. will be loaded on empty passing lorries to be taken to 1st Aust. Field Ambulance, POZIERES. 11. R.M.O's. will keep touch with Field Ambulance by sending

notes back by Field Ambulance bearers at frequent intervals during the engagement. All messages must state time of despatch.

In connection with the operations now in progress certain important matters must be kept in mind to ensure effective action and proper co-ordination of effort.

Bombing Operations: It pays far better to undertake this kind of operation deliberately after the necessary organization has been completed. This includes:

- (1) Arrangements for relief of exhausted bombers.
- (ii) Supply of bombs and rifle bombs.
- (iii) Plan of attack to include all Infantry arms, viz.

 Machine Guns, Lewis Guns, rifle bombs, hand bombs,

 Stokes mortars as well as rifle and bayonet.
- (iv) It was found of very great advantage to combine above with Artillery fire. Batteries, after careful registration, placed a barrage on the trench to be captured and, section by section, fire was lifted to enable the bombers to advance.

Those batteries which have lifted can be used to

form a protective barrage on the

Close co-operation between Artillery and Infantry through the Liaison officer is therefore important.

- (v) A scheme and necessary preparations for the formation of a really strong block must be arranged in advance. In this scheme Medium and Light Trench Mortars must be included and ammunition and bomb supply.
- (vi) Behind the block must be a defensive line as wide as possible made either by digging a trench or by occupying shell holes well to the flanks of the trench in which the bombers are operating.
- (vii)As soon as possible wire must be placed across the front of the block.

Objectives of Attack.

The limits of the attack will be the Divisional Boundary, viz. Point U.28.a.8.8. in O.G.1. and point U.22.d.0.3. in O.G.2 and will include the Communication Trench joining O.G.1 to O.G.2. at U.28.b.10.95 to U.22.d.00.25.

Method of Attack.

2. The attack will be carried out by bombing units relieving each other as the advance progresses.

Light Trench Mortars and Vickers and Lewis Guns will

be detailed to assist.

The advance up each trench will be covered and aided by artillery barrages to be arranged by the C.R.A., working in conjunction with the G.O.C. 1st Aust.Inf.Bde.

The artillery will not fire on a line South of an

East and West/through U.28.a.6. 5.

Strong Posts.

3. On reaching the above objectives strong posts will be made -

- (i) at about U.22.d.03. (to fire to north and north-east up the road in U.22.d. as well as to the west);
- (ii) at about U.22.d.03.05;

(iii) U.28.b.10.95;

(iv) at about U.28.a.8,8.

In each case blocks will be established forward of the Posts to prevent enemy bombers from approaching within 70 yards of the Posts without coming out into the open. This will involve filling in the tranches in front with earth or wire.

The Posts will be constructed on a wide front across the trenches to enable ample frontal fire by rifle, Lewis or Vickers Guns and rifle granades to be brought to bear on the enemy.

Attack by 7th Division. 4. The above attack is preparatory to an attack which will be made by the 7th Division on the south-east and southern face of BULLECOURT on the early morning of 8th May.

For the purposes of this attack the G.O.C. 1st Aust. Inf.Bde. will, by arrangement with the G.O.C. 20th Bde., vacate such portion of the railway line in U.28.c. and d. as is required by the 20th Bde. for assembly and forming up. This is to be done tonight.
