

| Havre 1918 Jany 3 | Slst | There is not any previous record of a War Diary in connection with the Australian General Base Depot but the circumstances of its original formation are as follows:- The authorisation for the formation of the Australian General Base Depot is contained in I.G.C./A.D./7239 dated 3th September 1916 as per copy of Routine Order No 1 gopy of which is attached marked 1. This Base was formed for the purpose of accommodating Casuals and Reinforcements of Units other than Infantry and Pioneers and was formed at Camp "Z" Etaples. Lieut Horniman was appointed Acting Adjutant on the 28th September and Captain Holland was appointed Medical Officer about a month later On the afternoon of the 23rd September 1916 all Reinforcements and Casuals of Divisional and Corps Units marched into A.G.B.D. and the following day similar units arrived, those on the 23rd being from the 1st A.B.D.B. those of the 24th being from 2nd, 4th and 5th A.D.B.D. On the 12th October 1916 the A.G.B.D. was transferred to "R" Camp Etaples to make room for New Zealand Troops. The A.G.B.D. remained in "R" Camp until the 29th May 1917 when it was moved from Etaples to Havre Base Area Camp 24, Lezarde Valley. Lieut Horniman remained Adjutant until Captain Kimber was appointed on the 7th October 1916. Lieut Jacob appointed Adjutant vice Captain Kimber evacuated to Hospital Sick during December 1916. Lieut Foord appointed Adjutant vice Lieut Jacob evacuated to Hospital sick on 20th Mpril 1917. Captain J.B.Shand marched into A.G.B.D. from Electrical, Mechanical and Boring Coy during October 1916 to take up position of Quartermaster. Lieut Purves was appointed Quarter- master vice Major Shand evacuated to Hospital Sick during June 1917. | |
| | | The appointments of Lieut Col Tumbridge, C.M.G. as Commanding Officer, Lieut Foord as Adjudant and Lieut Purves as Quartermaster terminated on the 18th December 1917 on which date the A.G.B.D. was reorganised as referred to later. From 18th December 1917 to 24th there was snow on the ground and continuous wind. A thaw set in on 24th and ending on the 26th when most of the snow has disappeared. A few light falls of snow occurred again but about the 6th January 1918 the weather became abnormal and almost spring conditions prevailed. This continued until 27th January. Buds appeared and it looked as if the trees would soon belch forth into bloom. However pests appeared and saved a probable disaster to all succulent vegetation by checking before they opened out. Troops are inspected on arrival and before despatch as described in my diary of the 3rd Australian Division Base Depot.
