

Hour, Date, Place Remarks and references to Appendic Summary of Events and Information 1/3/1916 TEL-EL-KEBIR. Memo received from D.A.D.O.S. Indents not required for Equipmentwhich will be supplied on demand on production of Mob Table. Captain Stokes, Lieut Prior and Dreyer reported for duty from the 2nd Div Artillery and were posted to Brigades. One Farrier Serjeant, 1 Serjeant, 1 Corporal 2 Batmen of 2nd D.A. also reported for duty. 2/3/1916 Lieut Collings and 10 others of 2nd D.A. taken on strength and posta to Brigades. Colonel Christian interviews Infantry Brigade commanders. 4th F.A. Brigade taken on the strength of the Division temporarily. 3/3/1916. Conference of Brigade Commanders held at Head-Quarters re training 6 the personnel at present with the Division. Decided for the 1st Period to commence with individual training and to instruct the personnel (who will make the future instructors) in the system that will be adopted throughout the Division. Colonel Christian confers with C.D.A. 1st Aust Div re new formations and new Establishments. B.Q.M.S. Thomas reported from 1st D.A.C. for duty at D.A. Head-Qrs. Commanding Officer and Brigade Major proceed to ISMAILIA to inter-4/3/1910. view General WHITE D.A.& Q.M.G. ANZAC re the new Establishment. New Orders issued - 4th F.A. Brigade withdrawn from 5th Division and the Formation of the 13th F.A. Brigade by the 2nd D.A. cancelled. Artillery to organize on War Establishment Part VII. NEW ARMIES. and each Division to form a Howitzer Brigade, but three (3) Btys instead of four (4). Arranged that a conference of Artillery commanders to be held under the presidency of General WHITE and that definite lines be laid down with the regard to the attachemnt of reimforcements to Units and also the number of men that could be passed over by the exisiting Divisions to the new Divisions . Points raised and results obtainedin accordance with shedule attached. It was also decided in addition to the personnel already sent that Major Caddy would be transferred to the 5th Div as a Brigade Commander and Lieut Vowles would also be transferred. Conference of Brigade Commanders held at H.Q. The necessity of obtains ing recruits impressed on Brigade Commanders who were instructed to obtain as much personnel from other Units as possible. Colonel Christian returns from CAIRO. Colonel COX-TAYLOR in order to obtain volunteers from the L.H. re-

inforcements there. Captain McCLEAN ex R.A.G.A. interviewed by Col Christian re the

command of the D.A.C.

3? 9/5/1916

Major CADDY and 2/Lieut G.H. Miller reported and were posted for duty to the 13th F.A. Brigade. --

Conference of Brigade Commanders held- Personnel divided up between

the Brigades and D.A.C. Officers posted to Brigades. Nine (9) Officers of the 2nd Div Artillery reported for duty and were posted to Brigades. Captain GRAINGER, Capt EDMONDS, Lieut STEELE Lieut LENEHAN M, Lieut JOSE, CULLEN, SCOTT, 2/Lieut CHASE, FULLERTON-

ANDREW. The Commanding Officer interviewed Officers desirous of transferrening from Infantry Units to the Artillery. Telegram received from Lieut-Col COX-TAYLOR reporting that 90% of the new batch L=H. volunteers had volunteered for Artillery service.

10/3/1916

List of Artificers desirous of transfer from 5th Infantry Div received. Brigade Commaders each inspect the men of Infantry Brigades allotted them and select the most suitable men.

Application of roughly of 400m men of 15th Infantry Brigade for transfer to the Artillery sent for approval of 5th Div Haad-Quarter Applicants names for Artificers selected, sent to Brigade H.Q minth for the necessary authority to be obtained for their transfer. Commanding Officers interviewed Officers and two O.R. of 8th Inf Brigade wishing to transfer as Officers to the 5th D.A. Application made for these Officers to be transferred to this Div.

Telegram received from Col Taylor stating first batch of volunteers from L.H. are ready to be sent down but necessary approval could

not be obtained.

Artificers from the 14th and 15th Infantry Brigades reported and were posted to Units.

Wire received from A.P.F. H.Q. statking that Infantry Units were to call for volunteers for the Artillery.

List No 35 of appointments, Commissions and rewards from the A.I.F. published. Captain THORNTHWAITE, Lieut NEWMARCH and Lieut ORR appointed respectively, Brigade Mjr Staff Capt and A.D .C. temporarily. Lieut NEWMARCH promoted to Capt temporarily. Colonel Christian left for Cairo to inspect volunteers for Arty from the Light Horse.

Information received that Col S.E. Christian C.M.G. was appionted a CROIX de ' OFFICE LEGION de' HONNEUR . Capt LISTER reported and was taken on the strength.

Ammiommm Remaining Artificers from the 15th Infty Brigade received and posted to Units . Colonel Christian returned from CAIRO.

Camp of 4th F.A. Brigade taken over by 5th Div Artillery. Bdes each take over the Tents and Camp Equipment of a Battery and B.A.C. of the 4th F.A. Brigade.

Guns and vehicles of 4th F.A. Brigade taken over and parked in Units lines.

Officers and men of 1st D.A.C. handed over to 5th Div at CAIRO, Total 4 Officers 47 O.R. Tjis party under Lieut BORWICK take over the vehicles of the 2nd D.A.C. and mount Guard on them at ZEITOUN.

Colonel Christian proceeded to ISMAILIA for the purpose of interviewing the D.A.Q.M.G. ANZAC Returned the same day. Inoculation of all ranks for TYPHOID and PARA-TYPHOID commenced . 4 Officers of 8th Infty Brigade reported and were attached to the Units. Capt MCCLEAN Lieut BARNETT, GOLDSMITH and WEBBER.

15/3/1916 TI	EL-EL-KEBIR	401 Men of 8th Infty Brigade arrived and wre posted equally to Units. Battallions were kept intact and personnel of each Battn posted to the corresponding Brogades. Captains Walker and Crombie and Lieut Lowis reported and were posted to Units. The personnel forming the nucleus of the D.A.C. were withdrawn from Units and posted to the D.A.C. which camp was placed in the Site occupied by the 4th F.A. Brigade Ammunition Column. Captain McClean was appointed provisionally to command. It was decided to leave all the personnel of the D.A.C. with the Brigades with the exception of the nacleus abovementioned. Brigades commenced the formation of their 3rd and 4th Battery.
16/3/1916		400 men of the 14th F.A. Brigade arrived and were posted to Units- of these 47 had to be returned as they were unfitted for Artillery work. Colonel Christian having received permission to obtain volunteers from Training Battallions at ZEITOUN proceeded to CAIRO for this purpose. Recommendations for promotion of Officers to temporary rank in order to complete establishment were forwarded. Lieut Vowles reproted for duty and was posted to 15th F.A. Brigade.
17/3/1916.	*	350 men of the 15th Infty Brigade arrived and were posted to Units Arrangements made to have section GunDrill pamphlets printed as they are unobtainable in CAIRO.
18/3/1916	"	Remaining details of 15th Infty Brigade arrived and were posted to Units. Brigades expand into one more Battery in each case.
19/3/1916	**	4 Corporals A.A.M.C. arrived and were posted to Units. Lines of the 4th F.A. Brigade cleaned as they were left in a dirty and insanitary stage.
