

SHADING OF CAR ARD LORRY LIGHTS.

I have experimented with verious methods and find the only effective system is to slightly tilt the lamps and set them a little inwards so as to throw the beam on the read, a metal shade to be fixed to the lamps in the manner here shewn.

and the lamp is properly tilted the shadow will cut the road at lö yards for lorries and 25 yards for cars, which will give planty of driving light for any area and will not throw upwards at all and will not illuminate houses on the sides of the road.

I would suggest the following order :-

1. All Head Lights to be shaded with metal shade as per sketch -

Radius of curve to be half diameter of lamp face.



Highest point of shade to be just below the outlet of burner.

- 2. All headlights to be set downwards and inwards so that the chadow cast by the metal shade will but the road at 15 yards for lorries, Ambulances and Box Cars and at 25 yards for all cars.
- 5. All oil side lamps to have top third of glass shaded.
- 4. All other side lamps to be shaded and set as to headlights.
- 5. Tail Lamps to be allowed lit after dark.
- s. These instructions to apply to all motor vehicles including staff cars and to be rigidly enforced.

apply to all vehicles, not only is the desired object lost, but accidents will occur owing to drivers being dazzled.

I can quote several instances of ditched and damaged lorries which have occurred owing entirely to this cause and I have myself several times had to stop and allows cars to pass that had very bright lights which, as my lights were shaded to comply with orders, completely blinded anyone in my Car.

I shall be glad to arrange for Car, fitted as above to report for inspection as you desire.







- 12. When halted or broken down, show a rear light and side light.
- 13. See that your headlights are screened a full half-way down the glass.
- 14. Put out your headlights during air raids.
- 15. Stop your engine when halted.
- 16. In frosty weather take all the precautions detailed in your C.O.'s orders to prevent your radiator freezing.
- 17. Obey all orders given to you by traffic control posts.

WHAT A BOX CAR OR LIGHT TENDER DRIVER SHOULD NOT DO.

- 1. DON'T double-bank.
- 2. DON'T overtake unless you are sure of getting through.
- 3. DON'T exceed the speed limit (15 miles per hour).
- 4. DON'T give lifts to civilians.
- 5. DON'T stop on a bridge.
- 6. DON'T halt outside an estaminet.
- 7. DON'T stop within less than 50 yards of cross-roads.
- 8. DON'T stop in the main streets of a town or village.
- 9. DON'T stop opposite another vehicle.
- 10. DON'T leave your vehicle unattended.
- 11. DON'T cross a railway unless you are sure that no train is passing.
- 12. DON'T get on the rails unless the far gate is open.
