

	1917. Sept. 1st 2nd 3rd 4th 5th 7th 8th 15th 15th 25th 26th 28th	out - but at 12.45 a.m. order came through to "stand fast". At 11 p.m. enemy long range gun dropped two shells in 2nd. Battery Wagon Lines wounding one other rank and killing five horses and one mule and wounding three other animels. Quiet day. Portion of batteries remaining in line were busy showing relieving Battery Commenders about. All Units at Wagon Lines. do. do. do. do. Received orders to be in readiness to move on 7th. instant - and later received message to say move would be postponed to 8th. instant. Billeting Party went forward to ARQMES to arrange for reception of Brigade. The Brigade merched at 8 a.m. via RENINGHELST - HAZEBROUCK to HONDEGHEM. Brigade merched at 10.15 a.m. via STAFEE - FORT ROUGE - ARQUES - to FORET de CLAIRMARAIS. Spent in cleaning vehicles and equipment and care of horses. General Sir Claude JACOB K.C.B. &c Commanding II Corps - to whom the 1st. Australian Divisional Artillery were attached from 19th. July 1917 to 3rd. September 1917 - came and inspected the Brigade - and thanked officers and other ranks for good work they had done while under his command. At 9.80 a.m. Memorial Service was held in 3rd. Battery lines by the Brigade for officers and men who fell in recent operations. At 12.15 p.m. the Brigade was drawn up and inspected by LieutGeneral Sir William BIRDWOOD K.G.B. &c who presented ribbons and medals to men who had been awarded decorations. Brigade still in FORET de CLAIRMARAIS camp training. 2/Lieut. J. C. DONCHUE reported for duty and was attached to 1Clst. How. Battery. Lieut. C. A. ARCHER M.C. acted as Adjutant vice LITTLE on leave from 18th. to 23rd. inst. Major G. McLAUGHLIN M.C. acted as C.O. vice LtColonel S. M. ANDERSON D.S.O. on leave from 18th. to 30th. inst.
