## MEDICAL OFFICER'S REPORT FOR MONTH DEC. 1918.

*Appendix 1780*

The total number of those reporting sick for the month was 420 an average of 13 per day. Coughs and colds were rather frequent during the earlier part of the month. A slight outbreak of diarrhoea occurred while at AVESNES but it disappeared after 2 days as suddenly as it appeared. 53 men were cared for in the Rest Billet of which number 35 returned to their companies fit for duty. The remainder were evacuated. Evacuations to Field Ambulance numbered 30. Of these 17 cases were of Influenza. There was but one case of Venereal Disease, and that a recurrence of a former infection. As formerly, arrangements were made for Prophylactic and Early Treatment of V.D. cases. As a preventive against Influenza instructions were given for the gargling of men's throats with Condy's Fluid night and morning. When this was strictly enforced, it seemed to reduce the sickness from Influenza. During the 4 days march of the Battalion from AVESNES to AGIMONT, many men fell out during the first three days. This was partly due to new and badly fitting boots, but also I consider that the length of the march without an early enough break for a meal was an important factor in compelling so many men to give up and fall out.

A Delouser is in course of construction whereby it is hoped to remove all lice and their eggs from the men's cloths and blankets. Some difficulty is being experienced in finding dry enough ground, water being struck at a very early level in this part of the country.
