As arrangements have now been made for the payment of troops in Belgian Currency, all transactions with the Divisional Paymaster will be on the basis of 5 francs equals 3/9d (Three shillings and Ninepence), which is the official rate of exchange until further notice. C.O's, O's C and Imprest Holders will therefore arrange to have all Acquittance Rolls, Trust Requisitions etc, prepared accordingly.

All ranks will be advised of the necessity to change Belgian Currency into French Currency before proceeding out of Belgium on leave or duty.

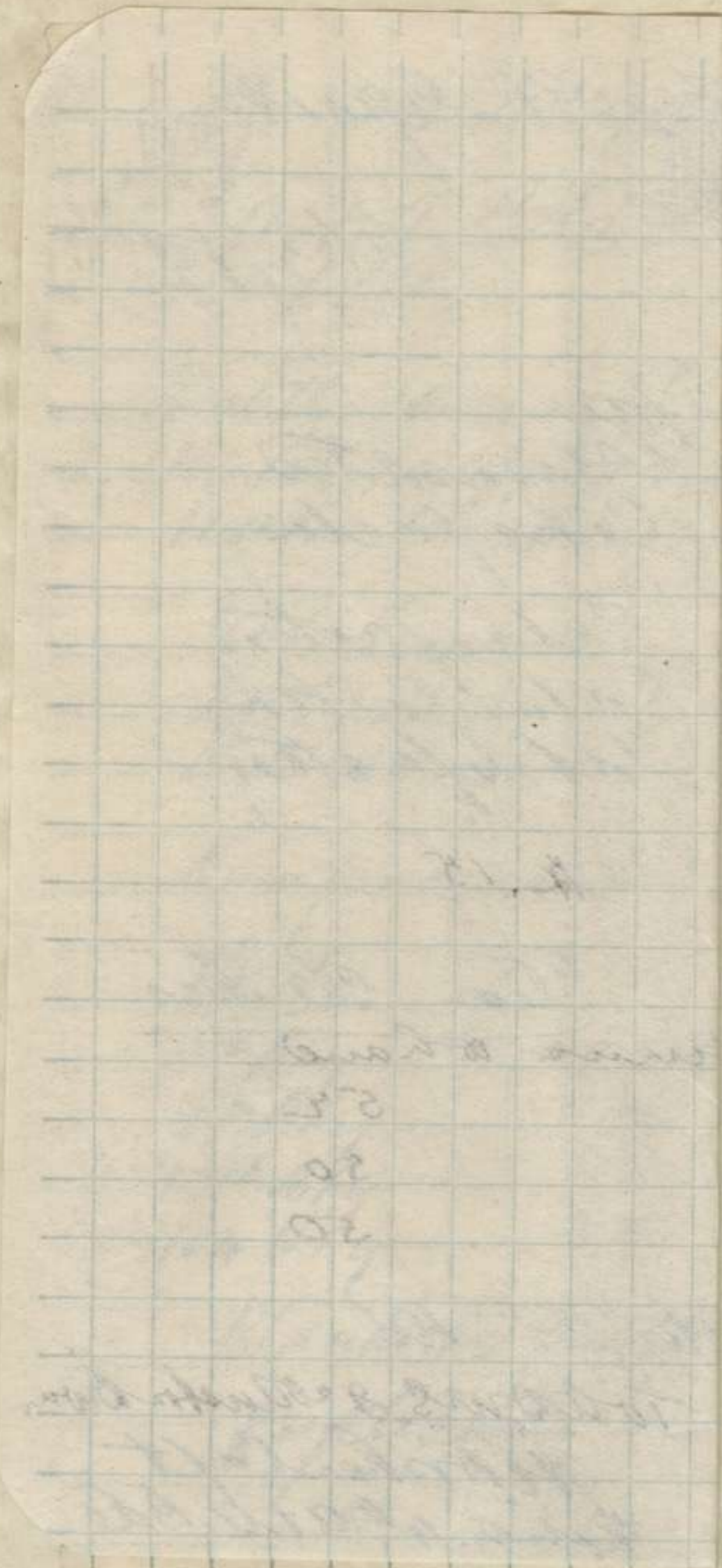


