



#### REPORT OF MEDICAL DIVISION FOR FEBRUARY, 1919.

There were 525 patients in hospital at the beginning of the month and in the course of the month 980 were admitted and 1025 were discharged.

There was a recrudescence of Influenza and Broncho Pneumonia and 328 patients were admitted with a diagnosis of Influenza and 21 with a diagnosis of Broncho Pneumonia. Also 63 cases were diagnosed Broncho Pneumonia after admission. These cases of Broncho Pneumonia were on the whole less severe than those seen during the last four months of last year. Apart from this comparative mildness the characters of the disease were much the same. Among the severe cases the mortality was high. There were 15 deaths.

All members of the Staff carried out prophylactic measures using a gargle and nasal douche twice daily.

Everyone employed in wards where there was Influenza or Pneumonia wore a gauze mask while working in the wards.

Three Sisters were sent to hospital and one of them had Influenza.

Fourteen Other Ranks were admitted to hospital and 10 were discharged and 4 evacuated to England.

There were 8 cases of Trench Fever and one of Pulmonary Tuberculosis. - No other case of notifiable disease occurred.
