



1st. December 1918.

SUMMARY OF THE MONTH'S WORK.

Training of Batteries was carried out during the whole time the Divisional Artillery was in the LONGPREE Area, but the training was very badly handicapped by the shortage of men.

About the middle of the month 153 remounts were issued to the Div. Artillery; these were of a fairly good stamp.

On the 21st. the Div. Artillery started on a six (6) days march covering a distance of 115 miles. To cover the distance it meant Reveille in the dark and before the Batteries pulled into the new Area it was dark again; this continual work in the dark and the shortage of men told considerably on the personnel, but after a night's sleep in good billets and a day's rest everyone was able to go about their work in the usual manner.

The C.R.A. visited all Batteries and inspected the horses, but notwithstanding the extra work that they were called upon to do during the long march they were not over-tired, nor did they show any particular signs of distress.

The following report from the O.C. 65th Army Brigade R.F.A. is forwarded for your information.

The incident referred to is well worth recording as it shews how Brigade and Battery Commanders can mutually help one another during active operations, and how effective this help may sometimes be.

Will you kindly convey to the Officer Commanding 12th Australian Army Brigade, and to the Battery Commanders, the grateful thanks and appreciation of the Officers of the 65th Army Brigade R.F.A. for the able assistance given to them on September 25th 1918.

\* \* \* \* \*

" The following incident, extracted from the War Diary of this " Brigade, deserves record as an instance of helpful consideration " not too common.

" On September 25th 1918, the 65th Army Brigade R.F.A. was in action East of HESBECOURT, near ROISEL, under the 1st Australian D.A. Orders were received that positions well forward would be occupied near VILLERET on the 27th and that the Brigade would be grouped under the command of Lt. Colonel Lloyd, 12th Australian Army Brigade.

" As the 12th Brigade knew the front, Colonel Lloyd, whose Brigade was also moving forward, got his Battery Commanders to each select 2 positions. Batteries of this Brigade were then given their choice, and every other assistance possible.

" In the conditions then obtaining, this action made an impression on all ranks of this Brigade which, I think, will be appreciated by the G.O.C. "



PUBLICCAST.

1. In accordance with the terms of the Armistice troops of the Allied forces will occupy German territory both East and West of the Rhine.
2. The British Army will hold two sectors.
  - i. The Colonne bridgehead.  
This sector will be occupied by the British 2nd. Army.
  - ii. The sector between the German frontier and the line AVORDS - MAUBOURG - CHAMBOIS - BONNEVILLE.  
This sector will be occupied by the British 4th. Army.
3. The Australian Corps for the present will occupy the S.W. portion of the 4th. Army sector and will subsequently relieve the Canadian Corps in the 2nd. Army sector.
4. The 1st. Australian Division will move to an area just S.E. of Chambois. The date of the move has not yet been fixed but it is not likely to be earlier than 4th. December.

1. 1st. Aust. Div. Arty. will commence march on the 21st. inst. and the 3rd. Army Brigade, Aust. F.A., on the 22nd. inst. to CARTIGNES area  
March will be in accordance with attached march table.
3. (a) Transport will be brigaded (under an Officer) and will march in rear of Brigades in same sequence as batteries to whom it belongs.  
(b) Water Carts, Cooks Carts and Cookers will accompany the Units to which they belong.
4. No lorries will be available for Brigades; transport available will be usual allotment of baggage and supply wagons ex Divisional Train.  
In addition 1st. D.A.C. will provide 4 G.S. wagons for baggage for each of the 1st. and 2nd. F.A. Brigades.  
Ammunition (boxed) on these 8 wagons will be left behind under a guard until such time as it can be collected.  
1st. D.A.C. will arrange with Area Commandant, LONGPRE to accommodate and ration the guard.  
In addition D.T.M.O. will send 2 G.S. Limbered Wagons to each 1st. and 2nd. F.A. Brigades for use of their Headquarters on move. 1st. D.A.C. will supply 4 animal teams and drivers for those G.S. Limbered Wagons.

5. Motor transport of D.A. Section No. 1 Co. M.T. and 3rd. Army Brigade Park Section will be allotted as follows :-

EXTRACTS FROM NOTES OF CONFERENCE HELD AT PERONNE  
13th. November 1918.

SITUATION AND ACTION BY THE CORPS IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

The terms of the armistice are very hard, though they are theoretical only, the Armistice terms practically embody many of the peace terms. Peace and the date in which it may be expected to be consummated depend on the stability of the German Government about which there is at present some doubt. As we are uncertain of the ability or willingness of the enemy to carry out the terms of the Armistice we must take certain lines of action in view of the fact that there may be further fighting. The amount of action that is necessary on our part is somewhat indefinite at present but we are learning daily as we get information of the enemy's evacuation of territory and compliance with the terms of the Armistice. The outstanding feature is the fact that the evacuation of the occupied territory must be completed by the 26th. inst. and we are learning daily that it is going on methodically.

The Army of occupation has two functions :-

1. To occupy the territory in order to reduce the German ability to resume hostilities.
2. To enforce terms of Peace.

To do this it may be necessary to retain an army of occupation for some considerable time in the enemy territory.

The army of occupation composed of armies of BELGIAN, BRITISH, AMERICAN and FRENCH working from North to South, each with a definite frontier on the RHINE to hold defensively a definite piece of enemy territory to administer.

The march into enemy territory is a difficult problem requiring considerable march organisation and preparation.

NOTE. It is not anticipated that this Divisional Artillery will move from present area before the 4th. December at the earliest.

CENSORSHIP There will be many relaxations which will appeal to the troops. Censorship regulations may be relaxed forthwith. The same restrictions of course re complaints regarding treatment and administration must be retained but permission will be given for men to state in their letters their location, names of units, persons, localities and what they and their units are going to do and where they are going.

Cameras may be used.

REINFORCEMENTS. The normal system will be carried on, certainly as regards casuals rejoining. All arrangements for leave will go on without change. Receiving of reinforcements regularly will still go on, particularly in regard to Artillery.

BAGGAGE. Much of this must be left behind. This may involve some hardship particularly for the last few days of the march. Chairs, tables, stoves, beds and the like cannot be taken. All extra stuff must be jettisoned and records sent to Base.

TWO BLANKETS per man will be taken and lorries or auxiliary M.T. will be supplied to carry.

NO-ONE at present knows what will happen on the Eastern frontier. We may help hold the bridgehead at COBLENZ, holding a 30 kilo radius on either side of the RHINE and a 10 kilo "No man's land".

In Divisional areas civilian authorities will carry on municipal government under military control. Of course, the troops on the RHINE littoral will be placed tactically, but the greater portion will be doing sentry duty in military charge of bridges, munition factories, telephone offices etc.. We should strengthen up this side of our work. It is essential that every sentry should know what to do.

RELATIONS WITH GERMAN PEOPLE. We have nothing to gain by oppressing rather have all to loose. The best principle is to leave the German population severly alone. By this we are likely to get better and more useful reparation. We will have our military rules re "Lights Out", Persons Congregating etc., and the civilian population must obey them, if not they will be punished. If they do obey them they should be well treated. A proper key note in regard to this should be at once set. All Officers should be notified of the policy and the men talked to and the policy explained to them.. They should be told that the war is over and that their duty has a definite political significance and not a military one.

The respect that will be given to our soldiers will depend largely on the soldiers themselves and their bearings, their saluting and the other outward marks of discipline.

When in GERMANY preparations for reviews of Brigades and Divisions should be made. The Corps Commander would like to see the entertainment of the men catered for apart from concerts, etc., also tours to places of interest in the vicinity. It is proposed to issue guide books and Officers would lecture to the men on the history of the town.

In regard to concurrent matters preparation for demobilisation are being gone with by a staff which is being formed in LONDON. They will no doubt shortly ask for information, statistics, etc. Units should take measures to ensure that those receive prompt attention, if possible begin to collate information regarding points about which it is anticipated enquires will be made.

The Director of Education will also set a definite scheme going regarding the Educational Schemes when we settle down.
