O.</p> <p>On the 11th inst the 4th Field Coy. Moved back to Fricourt Brigade Camp for work under C. R. E. Corps Troops.</p> <p>13th Field Coy. moved forward same day for work with 13th Brigade.</p> <p>12th Field Coy. moved up from Vignacourt to Dugouts in Bulls Run on same date.</p>	
	20th Jan.		<p>Major V. A. H. Sturdee, D. S. O. reported and took over duty as C. R. E.</p> <p>4th Field Coy. moved from Fricourt Brigade Camp to camp in forward area.</p>	
	21st to 31st Jany.		<p>Two sections of the 258th Tunnelling Coy. were placed at the disposal of the C. R. E. for work on dugouts, for hospital accommodation at Bernafay terminus, for Divisional Headquarters at Bazentin, for Brigade, battalion, and artillery accommodation in Delville Valley. Two coys. of the 5th Pioneer Battalion, and a detachment of the Anzac Entrenching Battalion employed on second line defences.</p> <p>Field Coys. were distributed as follows :- One Coy. timbering at Bazentin House (accommodation for Divisional Headquarters) stabling and various hutting requirements in Div. camps, bunking &c. in dugouts. One coy. excavating dugouts, laying tramways on double duckboards. (This line to be used for pushing only) wiring and trench maintenance. One coy. on Intermediate line M.
