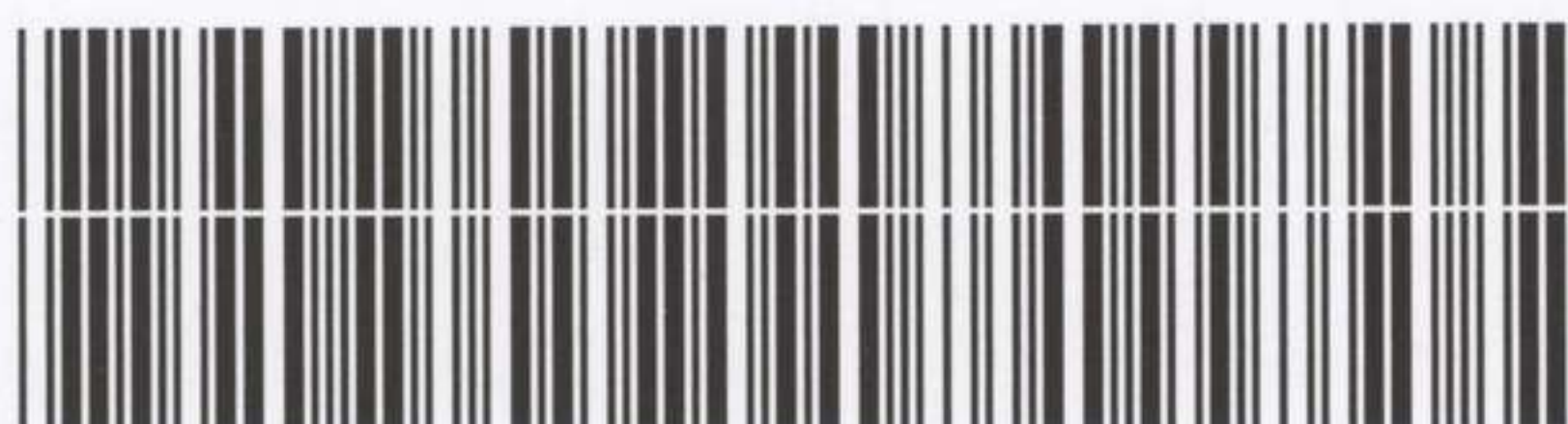

Many were mild.</p> <p>Some were extremely severe and a greater proportion moderately so. No cases of tetanus or other anaerobic infection occurred amongst the surgical patients.</p> <p>There was no undue proportion of pyogenic wound infections not of infectious diseases of a medical nature.</p>
