## O.P. end LIAISON DURIES.

- 1. Instruction No. 25 is omcelled.
- 2. Owing to reorganisation of Infantry Brigades holding the line, the present Centre Battalian Headquarters becomes the Right Battalian Headquarters and Ist. Field Artillery Brigade will do alternate duty with 64th (Army) Brigade, R.F.A. in providing Lisison Officer.
- 3. Four off Duty at Battalion Headquarters will be for five days.
- 4. The Brigade O.P. will be manned daily from 4 am. to 9 pm. by an Officer according to rester attached, but when Maison Officer at Battalion Headquarters is from this Brigade, the O.P. and Maison duties will be combined by two Officers as at present.
- 5. Officers doing O.P. or Limison duty will take one telephonist and two linesmen with a telephone.
- 6. In the event of enemy action developing at any time, an officer next for duty as F.O.O. will receive instructions from Brigade Headquarters to go forward and man auxiliary O.P. situated in a tree at W.28.A.20.40. Telephone lines are already laid.

This Officer will take with him two telephonists and two cyclist orderlies, and he will keep Brigade Headquarters advised as to the development of enemy action.

The event of enmy action developing the Officers at Battalion Headquarters will be available for full Liaison with Battalion Commander, and will as early as possible advise Brigade Headquarters of all alterations in the situation. Should telephone communication fail from Battalion Headquarters messages can be sent to Auxiliary 9.2. for transmission to Brigade Headquarters.

# INSTRUCTION NO. 20.

Headquarters, 19th. July, 1918

- In the event of an attack by the enemy on this front, in order to obtain full use of Field Artillery available, all Batteries must be prepared to turn the fire of their units at right angles to their normal front, either Right or Left.
- It is considered advisable that gun limbers should be kept in proximity to Battery positions, and that a limited number of teams should be maintained in the neighbourhood of Battery positions, in the event of battle being imminent, somthat guns may be moved on an emergency, to deal with critical situations.
- all Battery positions whether "battle" or "normal" positions must have an O.P. prepared ready for occupation, close to Battery; preferably sufficiently close for voice control.

  In the event of enemy breaking through owing to disorganisation which ensues, control would be almost entirely in hand of Battery Commanders. They must clearly understand that their duty is to turn their fire on to any of the enemy who should succed in breaking the line, irrespective of whether they are at the time occupied in firing a barrage on the front or not.
- Battery Commanders will take steps accordingly and advise this Headquarters of locations of these positions of assembly.
