Bde. took over command of H Group.</p> <p>Group in command of Lt Col. Ring C.M.G. and consists of 4 How Btys 110<sup>th</sup>, 111<sup>th</sup>, 4, 15<sup>th</sup> A.F.A. Btys.</p> <p>Harassing fire on Roads &amp; approaches of Group Zone.</p> <p>H Group reconstituted and consists of 10<sup>th</sup> A.F.A. Bde complete. Enemy planes very active and flying low over our trenches but although severely harassed by our AA guns remained over our line for half an hour.</p>

	14 <sup>th</sup>		<p>Operation against Warneton line commenced at 7.30 pm. H Group Bty. engaged on breaching &amp; protective barrages till 9.30 pm. How. on special task. Hun barrage appeared irregular on Group front and rather thin. Shrapnel appeared to be bursting very high. Our infantry were observed leaving our trenches and appeared to be moving well. All objectives were gained and consolidated. Prisoners were taken also. machine guns and one Field Gun.</p> <p>Brigade dump was blown up by enemy shelling at 6 pm. 110<sup>th</sup> How Bty had fatigue party working on dump at time but very man became a casualty to the extent of 18. killed and 8 wounded. Members of battery recommended for gallant work in securing wounded comrade.</p>

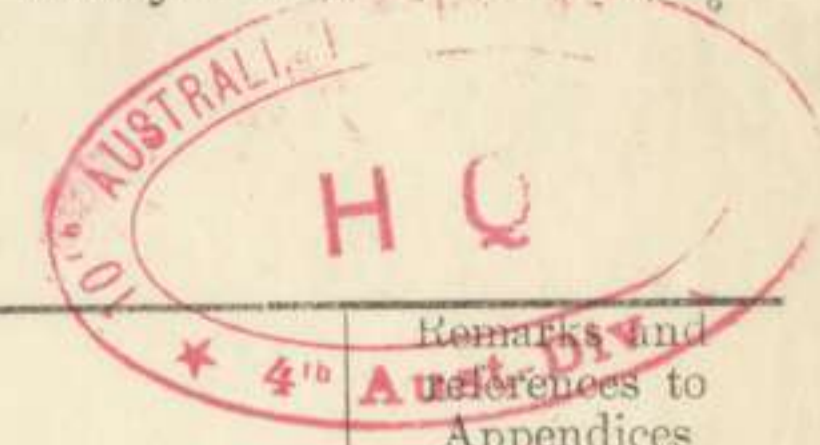

	15 <sup>th</sup>		Enemy planes very active and appear to be very keen on keeping back our observation planes. Dump at about U35 bentral blown up by our heavy artillery	
	16 <sup>th</sup>		Brigade withdrew from line and were relieved by 25 <sup>th</sup> Div ARTY. and proceeded to rest camp at 530C23	Sheet 28 SW
	17 <sup>th</sup> to 29 <sup>th</sup>		Sports and usual routine work was carried out. Sports were witnessed by Gen Holmes. On night of 23 <sup>rd</sup> enemy planes dropped about 50 bombs in vicinity of camp but caused no damage.	
	30 <sup>th</sup>		One section per battery proceeded into action as a preliminary for the relief of 1 <sup>st</sup> Div F.A. Brigade covering the Warneton front
