



. Education Report for Month of January 1919.

1. The work of the Education Service has made very good progress during the Month. The following figures indicate the state of the Register at the end of each week:-

The fall of the average attendance percentage for the second week was due to the Instructor of the French class being on leave, causing this subject to be temporarily suspended. Fruit Drying and Canning was substituted, but the attendance and interest were so poorin this subject that it was dropped in favour of an extra lecture on Woolclassing.

The work of the Department during the third week was confined to four classes. The decrease in the average attendance was caused chiefly by the return to Australia of several of the members of the classes.

A cinema show also had a considerable effect, in that bit drew a number of men away. On its departure the classes again became normal. At the end of the fourth week the Register still showed a decrease, but not to such an extent as the previous week. This decrease was due to the same causes as before. The Register on the 31st showed a decrease in the enrolment, but an increase in the average attendance. This was caused by the dropping of the class in English, as its attendance did not warrant its continuance. The resumption of the class in Motor Engineering caused the rise in the average attendance.

2. The following is a brief resume of the ground covered in the vari-

ous subjects now in hand:-

french. Rules of pronunciation; nouns, and their gender; rules for forming the plural; present tense of the auxiliary verbs "Avoir" and "Etre"; Construction of simple sentences; careful and repeated pronunciation of each new sound and word by individual members of the class.

In this subject great interest is taken by the men, and with the arrival of text books in sufficient quantities, it is expected that the

enrolment of the students will increase.

Motor Engineering. The aim in this subject has been to give the men an insight into the working of the Internal Combustion Engine, and to familiarise them with its principle and parts, without touching too much on technical detail. Instruction was given as follows:-

Principle of the I.C. engine; cycle of operations; names of parts and their relation to each other; valves; timing of valves. Lectures were

illustrated by rough diagrams on the blackboard.

Woolclassing. Wool; the mechanical structure and chemical composition of the fibre. Fleece; how it is removed, and composition of the yolk. Sheep; points on selecting for breeding purposes. Sheep; (with live animal) previous lecture revised, and demonstration given in how to detect disease. Definitions of terms used in dressing wool; classing; wool definitions; rolling and advantages of skirting properly.

An examination was held towards the end of the month. Eight men attended, and the results were very good, the highest marks being 93%.

At the next lecture, the mistakes were explained, and points on the

examination paper, which were not quite clear, gone over carefully.

Armthmetic. The work of the month has been principally hampered by the absence of text books. At the beginning it was difficult to set suitable work when each student was at a different stage of proficiency. The work of the first week was devoted to mental and written exercises on the first four rules. The class was then divided into (a) beginners, and (b) advanced students. Each group received instruction as follows:-

(a) Easy examples on the first four rules, simple money problems,

and easy examples in simple proportion.

(b) Examples in percentages; selling and buying; simple and compound interest, and bankers discount. Finding cubic content of surfaces

and cylindrical tanks. Calculating the weight of hay in a stack.

Some of the students are at a very elementary stage, as they have not had educational advantages in early life. These students show great interest in their work, being willing to come earlier that they may

183 . mariled (2) at . viti . Jen receive extra tuition, and are very keen to do work in their spare time Text books will be of great advantage to these men. The advanced. students show a fair standard of proficiency, and, for the most part, only need brushing in the various branches of arithmetic. They are men keen on working problems that occur in everyday life, rather than mere book problems. Book-keeping. General principles; need for accuracy and neatness of figures and writing; errors and alterations; definitions of Debit, Credit and Folio. 3. The results for the month have been, despitesuch handicaps as lack of text books, cinemas, etc., very satisfactory. At present it is impos ible to include No 1 Section in the scheme of instruction, except to a very limited degree, owing to their isolated position and want of accomodation, but it is expected that a but will shortly be available, and this will remove the difficulty. Towards the end of the month a lecture was given by the Rev. Mr Gay on "Charles Dickens, and his Characters". This lecture was very well attended, and proved to be of greatinterest to the men.
