

Dear Sir/

I have much pleasure in giving you at outline of Y.M.C.A. work amongst our men during June 1918. On account of moves and attendant difficulties the work has been somewhat disjointed, but it has gone right along and filled, I am glad to know, a very definite place in the lives of our men in the field. The general work was directed from a well fitted base at the 1st and 2nd Sections of the D.A.C. where a Canteen with a very passable stock catered for not only the men of the D.A.C. but for our men from the lines, also crowds of English troops and workmen. Practically every evening some enjoyable stunt was staged in the Marquee. The variety included band concerts, variety shows, debates and general musical evenings as well as devotional and study circles which are well attended. A very liberal supply of magazines and books, also writing materials has been available, also games inside am outside. From this centre a very useful work was carried further afield.

Large, safe dugouts, capable of holding 50 or 60 men were fitted out for the use of our fellows in the lines of the 49th, 54th, 53rd and 55th Batteries, tables and seats were furnished, also games, reading and writing material, successful evenings such as concerts and debates were run off in these places. The work being helped along by the Padres. who also made use of the shows for parades and services. These dugouts were made useful distributing centres for forward work. Baxes of comforts were sent to Battery Lines including a section of Trench Mortars. These parcels contained cocoa 75 lbs, milk, 5 doz. tins, biscuits, smokes, matches etc., also magazines and a few books. I had the pleasure of sharing some of these things during night shoots, forward. One special feature, was a two hours entertainment, run under ground at the guns. This brought forth the remark, "Blimey 'Arry, thewar 's getting too good to be true, the Y.M. bringin' concerts and things right up to the line". 'Arry agreed that 'it would do him. The move to the Rest Area cut short much useful work, still much helpful and necessary work has been followed up. During our "rest" period, practically all of our Artillerymen were reached in one way and another and we feel that our work has filled a useful and important space in the lines of the men, even though the real significance is difficult to show on paper. We are grateful forthe very cordial and wholehearted cooperation of the Officers of the Division. The position of the Y.M.C.A. man is a happy ones wholesale appreciation is reaped from men who are helped personally in may ways. The spirit of good cheer has been kept alive, and men often helped to see supposed difficulties from the right angle.

In closing I desire to thank you, Sir, for your sympathy and help.
