

No.2 Camp. Sutton Veny. August 1918.			<u>General Report for the Month of August 1918.</u>	
			<u>Parades and Training.</u> The usual parades have been carried out on Battalion Parade Ground, where training has been carried out according to the weekly syllabus of training attached. Training is now carried out by the Battalion by and under the supervision of Battalion Officers, instead of Brigade. The change came into force at the beginning of the month. Under the new arrangement the standard of training appears to be very satisfactory. The number of men becoming fully trained during the period is 6. This apparently low number is explained by the fact that a large number of reinforcements who arrived in February last became fully trained in July. No reinforcements were then received until July last, when 4 Officers and 91 O/R marched in. The weather on the whole has been very satisfactory for training. Four route marches were carried out. Foot inspections were conducted by Company Officers after each march, the state of the mens feet being very satisfactory. Night operations in wiring and gas drill were carried out twice during the month.	App.1
			<u>Lectures.</u> Two lectures were given during the month by Medical and Company Officers, one on V.D. and one on Anti-Gas Measures.	
			<u>Medical.</u> Two muster parades were held during the month for V.D. examination. The health of the Battalion in this respect is satisfactory. The Medical Officer's report, together with the Dental Officer's report is attached. The weekly summaries show number of evacuations by R.M.O. and discharges from Hospital, while the number of men attending Sick Parades and under dental treatment is shown on graphs attached. The Medical Report shows that the influenza epidemic has abated, only two cases being reported. A very mild form of dysentery has been experienced very generally and this is attributed to the prevalence of wasps in the Camps. Eleven cases were reported during the month. Apart from this the health of the troops is very good.	App.3 App.4
			<u>Movements.</u> The number of Officers and men marching in and out of Camp is shown in the weekly summary, with reasons for their movements.	App.2
			<u>Works.</u> The monthly report of the Works Officer shows in detail the work that has been carried out in and around the Camp. The detached party at Devizes reported back early in the month, having completed their task. Blue prints of the works on which they were engaged will be forwarded with next month's Diary. 			<p><u>Schools.</u> During the month 10 Officers and 27 O/R have marched out to schools and 9 Officers and 17 O/R have marched in from schools. Of those who have taken courses of Instruction, the results, as far as have been notified, have been very satisfactory, a qualifying pass having been obtained in all cases.</p> <p><u>Crimes.</u> The return of crimes continues to show a very satisfactory state of discipline in the Battalion. During the month 19 cases were brought before the C.O. 2 of which were remanded for D.C.M..</p> <p><u>Gardens.</u> A fatigue party for gardening has been detailed every day and the condition of the gardens is generally satisfactory, frequent showers being very favourable. Owing to the fact that the Battalion has moved into a neighbouring Camp, the amount of work which was formerly done has naturally, decreased and no new planting has been done. No new gardens have as yet, been started, labour being at present unavailable.</p> <p><u>Quarter Master's Department.</u> A report from the Regimental Quarter Master is attached which shows work done by this department during the period.</p> <p><u>Weather.</u> The weather on the whole has been very satisfactory, both as regards training and gardening. Occasional showers have benefited the vegetable crops and the weather has generally been bright.</p> <p><u>General.</u> The general behaviour and moral of the men in camp is excellent. Very few complaints have been heard and the men appear to be satisfied and well contented. The concert parties and Y.M.C.A. entertainments in the neighbourhood have been well attended by the men of this Battalion. On the 27th the Battalion moved into No. 2 Camp from No. 6 Camp and the shift entailed a slight break in training. The move was carried out in a very expeditious manner and was practically completed in two days. The Battalion paraded on the Musketry Range on the occasion of the visit of the Hon. the Prime Minister of Australia, Mr Hughes, on the 19th and his speech was listened to with attention and interest by all ranks. 




War Diary Aug 1918

During the month of August the daily messeng strength of this Battalion (Barks Mess) was 360. During this period we have had very satisfactory results with the messing and supply of meat. Difficulty has been encountered at times with the supply of meat on account of quality of mutton supplied by A.S.C. The quality of mutton (coarse) has practically reduced the merrations of meat from 5 oys to 3 oys per day and at intervals costly substitutes have been supplied to make up the shortage. Complaints have not been so general as they were as previous month.

Sausages of an inferior quality are still being supplied but though frequent reports have been forwarded resanche is action has been taken in the way of curtailing the supply. The supply of sausages in lieu of meat has been increased during the above period from 20s to 5 oys per man.

The Bread is still of a very poor standard but this cannot be overcome on account of the ~~quality~~ of flour issued to A.S.C.

Frequent inspections have been made by the District Messing Officers a satisfactory report have been received from him in regards to Messing Department.

Enclosed are copies of Deschets covering the period of reference.

## Units that prefer it may have Dinner in the Evening instead of at Mid-day.

Salt, Pepper, and Mustard should be placed on Mess Tables at all meals in suitable containers. Draw 1 oz. Flour daily in lieu 2 oz. Bread.—20% weight of Flour should be Potatoes, boiled and riced. To cook Rice properly cook in twice its weight of water and milk. Milk allowed, 180 pints per week. The amount of Dripping shown in recipes for the preparation of dishes is not to be exceeded.

## Headquarters is however to be advised as to the decision arrived at.

All Beef should be cleaned from bone before leaving the butchery. One tin of Condensed Milk should be dissolved in 2 pints of water.
