1. EMBARKATION. Troops will fall in on the wharf, strictly of the order in which their names appear on their Unit Nominal Rolls, each man will carry his kit. Paybook & Returnee Card will be handed in at the Gangway and wold be carried in the hand to facilitate rapid embarkation. The E.S.O. will direct order in which Units are to embark. Fatigue Parties and Officers Batman will not be required for Duty at the Ships side and must embark with the Formation to which they belong.

Akl Officers must parade with their Units. Squadrons & Troops etc will be preceded by Squadron & Troop Leaders respectively.

- 2 TROOP DECKS. Troop N.C.O's of Advance Party will be in possession of complete Nominal Rolls of the Troop, or party they represent. They will be shown the Mess Table to which each Troop etc, has been allotted and on the arrival of their Party at Ships side \*\*\* they will parade at the foot of the gangway and conduct the Troop to their proper quarters. Officers will accompany their Unit to the Troop Deck and will be responsible that the men proceed direct to the Mess tables, that Kit Bags are stowed neatly in the overhead racks, and that no articles are \*\*\* hung upon the hammock hooks. They will instruct the men that they are to remain seated until permission is given to leave the Troop Decks. No Officer is to leave the Troop Deck until everything is in order, after which N.C.O's will be responsible that no smoking is permitted between decks.
- 3. BAGGAGE. All Baggage will be loaded by the E.L.C. under instructions of E.S.O. and no departure from this procedure will be permitted.
- 4. INSPECTIONS. On receipt of orders immediately after embarkation is completed, all ranks will parade at their Mess Tables; Sergeants seated in their own Mess. Officers will stand by with their Troops, Squadrons, etc for Ships Inspection by O.C. Troops.
- 5. DISCIPLINE. Strict Discipline will be maintained during the voyage and all concerned are warned that any punishments inflicted on board will NOT be remitted on arrival in AUSTRALIA.
- 6. DISPOSAL OF RUBBISH No paper, rubbish, clothing or articles of any description are to be thrown overboard, but will be disposed of in accordance with orders to be issued on board.
- 7. DOGS, ETC. All ranks are warned that no dogs or monkeys are to be taken on board. If any such are found after commencement of voyage, they will be destroyed.
- 8. LIQUOR ON TRANSPORTS. Attention is drawn to para 52 of SO. for the A.I.F. which prohibits the sale or supply of alcoholic liquor to all ranks of the A.I.F. on Transports.
- 9. DRESS. Working suits at the rate of one perxxxx other rank will be issued on board and will be taken into use immediately on issue, after which no other dress will be worn by Other ranks, unless specially ordered. Officers will be in Uniform at all times.
- 10. MESS KIT. Will be issued to Advanced Parties by Troops and receipts given. These receipts will be collected and a consolidated receipt given by the O.C. Unit, who will be responsible for any deficiencies at the end of the voyage.

4. BAGGAGE. Officers & Regtl Baggage will be stacked in front of Orderly Room by 0730. Sgt MURPHY 2.0/Rs. H/Qrs, 2 0/Rs.per Sqdn, Will act as loading Party & Guard. Parading at R.H.Q. at 0800. These will Report to their Sqdn at Ships side.

Room".
