1. Consequent on D.D.M.S. 1st Anzac Med. Instructions 45 and 2nd Aust Div Order No 156 dated 10/12/17. the following Medical re-arrangements will take place.
2. C.O. 5th Aust Field Amb will take over from 11th Aust Field Amb A.D.S. at Underhill Farm T.19d 5.3. and A.D.S. BREWERY C.1.d.4.5. including all forward Medical posts of Right Divisional Sector of the Corps Front. Relief to be completed by 4 p.m. on 15th inst. C.O. 5th Aust Field Amb will arrange the proper flagging of routes of evacuation and of all Aid and Relay Posts.
3. C.O. 6th Aust Field Amb. will take over from 10th Aust Field Amb D.R.S. AT ESTHOVE T.19.b.5.4. Relief to be completed by 4 p.m. on 15th inst.
4. C.O. 7th Aust Field Amb. will take over from 10th Aust Field Amb D.S. at PONT D'ACHELLES B.8.b.2.5. Relief to be completed by 4 p.m. on 15th inst.
5. All surplus tentage will be left standing in situ. With regard to Equipment tentage at present standing Ambulance Commanders will mutually arrange to exchange the equivalent. No tents should be struck unless absolutely necessary to complete Unit equipment.
6. Ambulance Commanders will make necessary arrangements for the clearance of sick of their respective Brigade whilst enroute to New Area. C.O. 6th Aust Field Amb will make arrangements to clear the sick of the Reserve Brigade in the New Area.
7. Local sick parades at present being done by 5/6/7th Aust Field Amb. will be handed over to incoming Units. Inoculations incomplete will be handed over for completion to incoming Units viz:-
5th Aust Fld Amb. 23rd Light Ordnance Workshop 36.A.29.b.2.8.
7th do do 196 Land Drainage Coy 36.A.16.c.8.2.
3rd Aust Amm Sub Park. 28.S.29.a.7.2.
1st Anzac Corps Troops Supply Col 36.A.17.a.7.2.
8. C.O. 5th Aust Field Amb will forward on 16th inst a disposition report giving Officers, M.C.O.'s, and men at each post and system of relief. A daily return of blankets and stretchers at A.D.S. and all forward posts will be forwarded to this office.
9. Lists in duplicate of all stores equipment etc taken and handed over will be forwarded to this office within 24 hours after relief.
10. Reports of completion of reliefs will be forwarded to this office by wire.
11. A.D.M.S. office will close at RAVELSBERG at 10 a.m. 16th inst and open at same hour at STEPHENSON.

Reference 1st Anzac Medical Arrangements Operations No 7.

SECRET

1. Medical Situation is shown on appendix 1.
2. Evacuation. Evacuation from B.A.P's to advanced Dressing Stations will be by hand carry, supplemented by trolley track wheeled stretchers, and wherever possible by Ambulance Wagons From the Advanced Dressing Stations to Main Dressing Station by Motor Ambulance Cars. From Main Dressing Station to Casualty Clearing Station will be by Motor Ambulance Convoy Cars. Evacuations to Rest Station, either Corps or Divisional, will be by Divisional Motor Ambulance Cars.
3. Arrangements will be completed to enable the Ambulance site at NIEMPE to be converted into a Main Dressing Station at short notice.
4. REST STATIONS All sick and slightly wounded likely to be fit within 14 days will be treated in D.R.S. D.R.S. at WESTHOFF will accommodate 250 cases, and PONT d'ACHILLES 100 cases. A Corps Rest Station is being established at 38A/W.S.D. Central. All overflow cases from D.R.S. and cases likely to be of a more protracted nature will be sent to this station when open Officers wards in D.R.S. will be closed and all fresh cases will be sent to C.R.S. or if convalescent to Officers Hospital LA MOTTE. Cases evacuated to the latter Hospital will be shown as evacuated to C.C.S.
5. CASUALTY CLEARING STATION. The Casualty Clearing Station allotted to the Corps is No 2 Australian C.C.S. overflowing when necessary to No 33.
6. GAS TREATMENT CENTRE. A small Centre will be established at H.D.S. PONT D'ACHILLES.
7. ADVANCED DEPOT MEDICAL STORES. No 2 at No 2 C.C.S. 36A/W.S.D.
8. MOBILE BACT. LAB. No 5. Canadian BAILLEUL.
9. SPECIAL CASES.
 - SCABIES. All cases of Scabies will be treated at D.R.S. WESTHOFF.
 - DYSENTERY. Cases of Dysentery or Suspect will be sent to special Hospital HARVERDOORNE 28/S.S.d.S.
 - OPHTHALMIC. All cases will be sent to H.D.S. on Mondays. C.O. H.D.S. will make arrangements to forward these men to No 50 C.C.S. on Tuesday afternoon. Duplicate Nominal Roll will be taken with patients. Total number of cases at H.D.S. will be wired to A.D.M.S. by 6 p.m. on Mondays.
10. DENTAL. No 4 Dental Unit will open at WESTHOFF D.R.S. for treatment of Reserve Brigade. No 22 will open at 5th Aust Field Amb NIEMPE for Dental treatment of Pioneers, Engineers, A.S.C., D.A.C., and NIEMPE Battalion of Reserve Brigade. No 24 will open at PONT D'ACHILLES for Dental treatment of Brigades in line and Artillery.
11. Attention of Ambulance Commanders & R.M.O's is drawn to this Office 22/20 dated 17/10/17 regarding Trench Feet.

5th Bde. sick were cleared and evacuated by 5th Field Amb. at L'Estrade
 D.R.S. 6th Bde by 6th Field Amb. to Bailleul D.R.S. 7th Bde by
 7th Field Amb. to STEENWERCK D.R.S.

Arrangements in each case were made for cars to call at Battalions
 daily to collect for evacuations.

5th Field Amb. L'Estrade D.R.S. were capable of holding 100 sick.
 6th Field Amb. Bailleul. D.R.S. " " " 150 sick.
 7th Field Amb. Steenwerck. D.R.S. " " " 100 sick.

Thus there was ample accommodation for D.R.S. sick and evacuations
 were made to 1st A.C.C.S. and 2nd A.C.C.S. at Outersteene and Trois
 Arbes.

Bathing accommodation for troops was adequate and little difficulty
 was experienced in sterilisation of blankets and clothing. Laundry
 arrangements were quite inadequate and necessary clean clothing
 had to be washed at Army laundry Abbeville.

The billeting accommodation was excellent and the time was given up to
 less rigorous training football matches and other sports. Canteens
 (Wet & Dry) were established in all camps and for the month 15th Nov
 - 15th Dec the men lived under most excellent conditions and were in
 the best of health and spirits.

Under Corps Order dated 11/12/17 the 2nd Division made arrangements
 to take over line from 3rd Division.

5th Field Amb. took over evacuation of line from 11th Field Amb. and
 were relieved at L'Estrade by 9th Field Amb. H.Qrs. at Nieppe.

L. A.D.S. Underhill Farm near Hyde Park Corner collecting posts at
 Dead Horse Corner and U.9.a.7.2. the former clearing the Right the
 latter the Left R.A.P. for the 2 Battalions Left Brigade in line.

Clearing R.Battn by carry and tram line.

L.Battn by carry and then both by motor to Underhill.

R.A.P.'s situated 1400 yards from line.

A.D.S. 5000 yards from R. and 6000 yards from L. No Ambulance M.O.
 was located further forward than Underhill Farm.

R.A.D.S. R.Bde was at Brewery Ploegstoert. This cleared only Batt(L)
 R.Bde from R.A.P. Though it supervised collecting post Motor Car
 Corner. Situated 2500 yards when in line. Hand Carry and Wheeled
 Stretchers Underhill Farm, Brewery, Motor Car Corner with Ambulance
 stationed at each, sent patients direct to M.D.S. Pont D'Achelles
 (7th Field Amb.) 4 miles.

R.A.P.'s with exception of extreme left were commodious and comfortable
 capable of retaining patients and giving R.M.O.'s an opportunity for
 careful attention.

M.D.S. Pont D'Achelles in addition to M.D.S. was a D.R.S. carrying up
 to 150 patients and composed of Nissen Huts both large and small.,
 from here patients were sent to D.R.S. Westhoff.

C.R.S. (1st A.C.C.S.) 500 patients.

C.C.S. (2nd A.C.C.S.) and Officers D.R.S. La Motte.

7th Field Amb. took over Pont D'Achelles from 9th Field Amb and were
 relieved by 10th Field Amb.

6th Field Amb. took over D.R.S. Westhoff from 10th Field Amb and were
 relieved by 71st Field Amb. Units made mutual arrangements to suit
 each other in reliefs which were complete at 4 p.m. 15th inst.

FRONT LINE. Extended over 6000 yards and held by 4 Battalions in a
 series of posts. The conditions in the line were good. All saps
 duckboarded and those posts which did not have dry standings were
 quickly put in order by Battalions. Many posts were only held by
 night and men retired to better cover during the day. From the first
 day, when snow fell, the weather was cold and frosty, and most days
 the sun shone which lent a good deal to the high spirits of the men
 when compared to their first winter in France. In consequence of the
 cold a few cases of frostbite and Trench Fever occurred. All ordinary
 anti-trench foot precautions were observed. Clean socks daily and
 foot rubbing with Talc Camphor Powder twice daily. No puttees worn
 except sandbags and rarely gum boots. Hot meals cooked near the line
 or 1000 yards behind, were liberally served. Most Battalions had
 X 2 hot meals interspersed with 3 hot drinks during day and night and

these were carried up in hot food containers.

The Talc and Camphor supply was at the outset limited by Corps to 500 lbs per Division per week in the line but this was found more than ample for all requirements.

Foot washing was not always practicable but was carried out once every 4 days. All Battalions were uniformly keen in attention to detail and Officers generally realised their responsibility personally in this matter. Chiropodists To ensure mens feet being properly cared for. One Chiropodist per Company was appointed and carefully trained in the duties by R.M.O.'s.

Casualties have so far been very few (Jany 5th) Maximum day 11, and sometimes none at all. Clearing is therefore being done by $\frac{1}{2}$ the bearers of one Field Amb who while they were in the line had every comfort and attention.

Disposal of Sick.

M.D.S. 7th Field Amb Pont D'Achelles

D.R.S. (1) 7th Field Amb Pont D'Achelles 150 cases and Gas Centre.

(2) 6th Field Amb Westhoff 225 cases. Scabies centre.

Corps Rest Station. 1st A.C.C.S. Outersteene. 500 cases including a few Scabies.

C.C.S. 2 A.C.C.S. Trois Arbes.

D.R.S.'s of Nissen Huts both large and small with dining and recreation rooms. Lighting and heating had to be improved and the sufficient supply of fuel has proved the only obstacle.

Bathing at D.R.S. was quite inadequate but tubs were used and Water heating apparatus was erected by C.O. 6th Field Amb to deal with Scabies cases. For other cases use was made of Palmer baths and in case of 7th Field Amb. Pabot baths.

Disinfection and Bathing. On Dec 5th 10 days before taking over A.D.M.S approached A.D.M.S. 3rd Aust Division with a view to discovering the facilities for bathing of men, laundry arrangements and disinfection. These were found hopelessly inadequate and then immediately representations were made to "Q Branch" that steps were necessary to obviate the conditions which would immediately arise in the new area. No steps were taken and as late as Christmas we found ourselves only able to bathe 1300 men daily, when the baths were worked at a maximum. This was rarely done and at the end of a week only 4000 men had been bathed, meaning a bath for the Division once a month.

Disinfection was on the same footing relying practically on the efforts of a half worked Foden Lorry. Representations were made to work the Foden Lorry double shift. Sterilise the clothing done at our own laundry (3000 pieces daily) by Cresol disinfection and clothing above this to be only sterilised by Foden Lorry and sent to Army laundry. to bathe the men every 10 days (Div strength 18000) required 5400 garments daily. 2400 to be only sterilised. Foden Lorry would do this by working two days in eight at laundry the remainder to be spent in doing blankets 80 per hour, 16 hours daily, this would do Division's blankets 36000 in 30 days. This plan was adopted Jany 1st, but Jany 4th, Corps Foden Lorry was released to us for use and obviated the necessity for Cresol sterilisation at the baths.

Bathing.

Pabot Baths	600 daily.
Nieppe	400 daily.
Palmer	150 daily. allotment.

Jany 4th we handed over Nieppe Baths to 58th Division, and new baths are being established at Hyde Park Corner and Pont D'Achelles.

Jany 1st A Corps conference took over from Jany 14th Bathing and Laundry in the Corps Area thus in future the chaos will not prevail. Bathing at the present moment is more inadequate than ever but in a few days should right itself.

D.R.S. for sterilisation of blankets have had to rely on Foden Lorry and this has sometimes presented difficulties.

Drying Rooms at Steenwerck laundry are only qualified to disperse heat and not dry clothes. These are however being renovated so as to double their capacity on which the utility of the laundry depends. With double capacity all Divisional clothes will be washed at the Steenwerck laundry.

Ironing. has not yet been adopted at baths or in Battalions but

65 Representations have resulted in the intention to have this carried out. Detached parties present the difficulty of ensuring that all ranks are bathed once every ten days. Men in some cases prefer to avoid ablution in the cold weather. Until it is regarded as essential and not optional Vermin and Scabies will abound. Efforts in this Division are in the direction of having this recognised. Scabies at present are overloading our Rest Stations 90 at present are in the D.R.S Westhoff.

Sick Parades. Daily sick parades in Battalions are averaging 25 in rare instances 50 parade.
