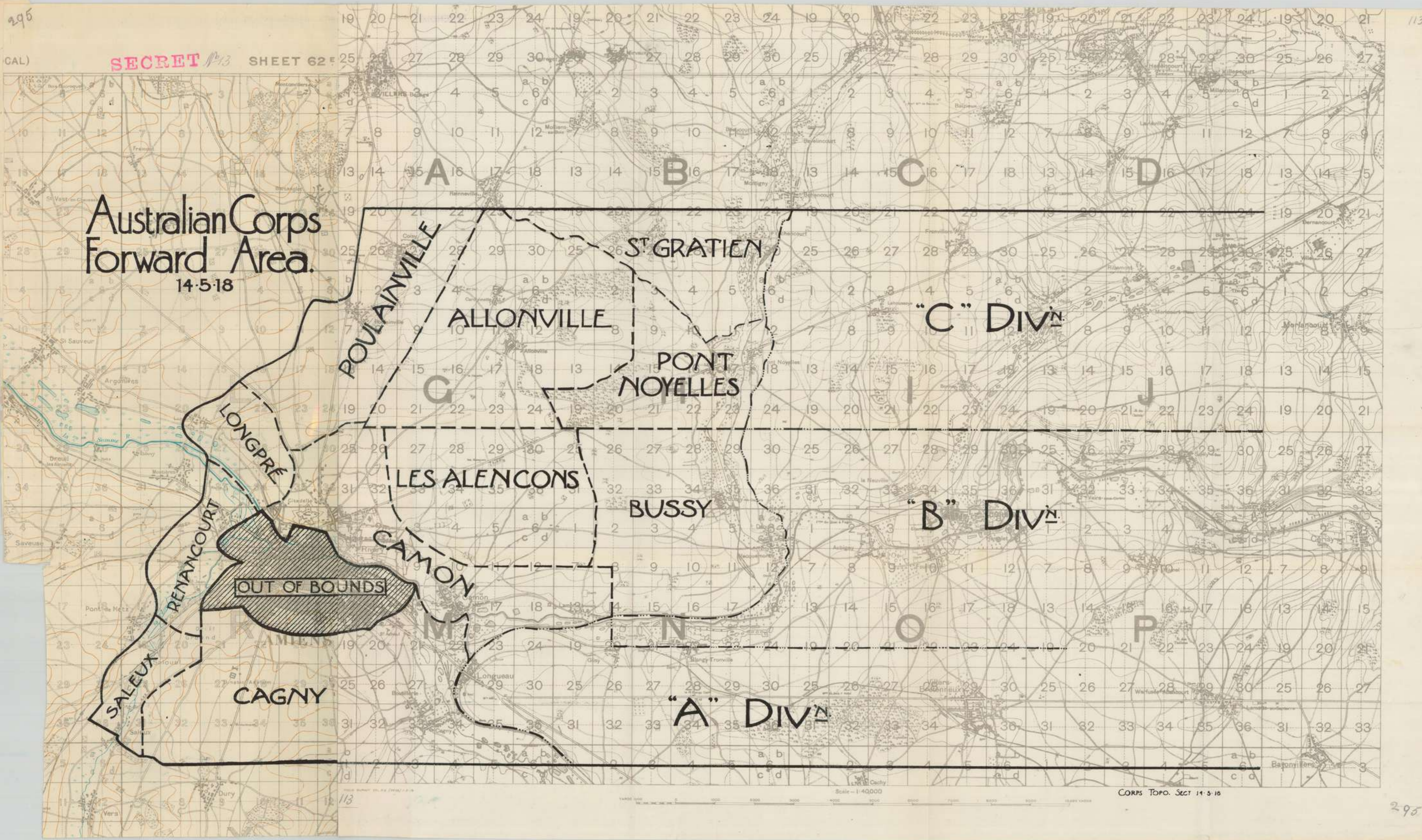

Issued under AUSTRALIAN Corps Order No 98.

1. AREA ADMINISTRATION.

At 10 a.m. on 11th May, 2nd Aust. Division will take over the administration of 'C' Divisional Area including Traffic Control, Police and Straggler Posts.

At the same hour, 3rd Aust. Division will become responsible for Traffic Control and Police in the CAMON - RIVERY - LONGPRE Areas and the Area between AMIENS - DOULLENS and AMIENS - RUBEMPRE Roads (both inclusive) north of the above Areas and South of a Line from S. end of RAINNEVILLE (exclusive) to BELLEVUE FARM.

2. AREA COMMANDANTS.

The Area Commandants provided by 3rd Aust. Division at LA HOUSOYE, QUERRIEU and FRANVILLERS will remain and function under the 2nd Aust. Division.

The Area Commandants at MERIGOURT, RIBEMONT, HELLILY and BONNAY will go out with 3rd Aust. Division and the 2nd Aust. Division will take whatever measures are considered necessary for safeguarding property and preserving order in the above villages.

3. REINFORCEMENTS.

2nd Aust. Division will take over the Divisional Reinforcement Staging Camp at 62D/H.7.c. 3rd Aust. Division will distribute their reinforcements to units from ALLONVILLE.

ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTIONS No. 200.

AREA COMMANDANTS.

1. The area to be administered by each Area Commandant, ^{consequent} on the re-organisation of the Corps Area is shown on the map herewith.

2. The Area Commandant will :-

(i) be responsible under Corps Headquarters for the administration of this Area.

(ii) be responsible for quartering in his area the units ordered into it. For this purpose he will communicate direct with "Q" of Corps and will -

(a) Keep a register of all billets.

(b) Select and keep a record of all suitable horse lines, camps and bivouac sites. When a unit requires a camp or bivouac site or horse lines in the area, he will see that a site selected by him is occupied and that new ground is not unnecessarily soiled.

(c) Keep a record of all units in the area and their locations.

(d) Keep a record of the number of tents and shelters in use in the area.

(e) Render Returns as per Tables "A" and "B".

(f) Report by wire to "Q" any unit entering his area of which no intimation has been received.

(g) Report immediately by phone and letter, units leaving their camps or billets in an insanitary condition.

(iii) Ensure that good order is maintained in the area, calling on the units in the area to provide the necessary pickets and bringing to the notice of the A.P.M. responsible for the police and traffic control in the area, any irregularities which occur.

(iv) Be responsible for the good sanitation of the area - calling on the units quartered in it for the fatigues necessary to keep the area clean, and keeping in touch with the O.C. Sanitary Section responsible for the area.

TOWN MAJORS AND AREA COMMANDANTS.

295

606. DUTIES. The duties of an Area Commandant or Town Major are as follows :-

(a) He will ensure continuity in his Area by making himself thoroughly acquainted with all questions connected with billeting, billet improvements, horse standings, water supply, baths and institutions (recreation rooms and huts, canteens, drying rooms, etc.) so that, when formations or Units change he can help the uncoming troops with information on all the above points.

(b) He will work in close touch with the formation in occupation of his Area with regard to matters of billeting and will help them with suggestions as to improvements of billets, horse standings, etc.

(c) He will prepare and keep up to date a Map of his Area.

(d) He will keep a record of :-

- (i) Billets.
- (ii) Recreation Rooms.
- (iii) Hired premises and lands.
- (iv) Horse Standings.
- (v) Stabling for horses.
- (vi) Drill and training grounds.
- (vii) Watering places.
- (viii) Manure and refuse dumps.
- (ix) Public Latrines.
- (x) List of stores in charge of billet wardens.
- (xi) List of Area stores.
- (xii) Baths and Laundries.

(e) He will furnish the Rents Officer with particulars of ground which is longer required, and the B.R.O. with particulars of all hired premises no longer required.

(f) In the event of an advance, he will take over entire control of the Area and will be responsible for all administrative arrangements.

(g) After the Area has been evacuated he will ensure that the collection and disposal of all stores, portable buildings and tents is properly carried out.

(h) He will allot billets, etc., to formations, Units or individuals, in consultation with the Maire. He may move Junior Officers when it is necessary to find room for Senior Officers, and evict Officers and men who are occupying billets without authority. In the event of unavoidable congestion he may require Units or Officers to share billets.

(i) He will act as intermediary between the occupants of billets and the French Authorities, as regards complaints, and will be responsible that the following orders are carried out :-

- (i) Inhabitants found billeting Officers or men not in possession of a Billet de Logement will be reported to the Allied Authorities concerned.
- (ii) The billets are to be kept clean and in good order.
- (iii) A full report is to be made of any damage done.
- (iv) Special care must be taken to see that no rations, arms, ammunition or equipment are left in the billets.

P.T.O.

(v) To ensure that billets are left clean and in a sanitary state, Units evacuating them will, where practicable, leave behind an adequate cleaning-up party under an Officer. This Officer will hand over to the Town Major or his representative any claims that may have been received in connection with the billets occupied by the troops of his Unit.

These claims are to be made on the form below, which will be completed and signed by the Billet Owners and by the Officer representing each Unit. Copies of these forms will be obtainable from the Area Commandant's or Town Major's Office. (See also S.Os. 538 - 547).

(j) He is responsible for the sanitation of the town or area, and that all instructions on the subject are complied with. He has authority :-

(i) To enter and inspect the sanitary arrangements in all billets.

(ii) To make units responsible for cleanliness of roads, etc. in their vicinity.

(iii) To request fatigue parties from the nearest unit for cleaning unoccupied areas, or for other essential sanitary work, and for road mending when necessary. (See also S.Os. 920 - 967).

(k) He will make arrangements to deal with fires in the town.

(l) He will maintain friendly relations with the civil inhabitants and authorities. He will call the attention of officers commanding units to any manner in which they can assist the inhabitants, e.g., with the harvest, etc. He will ascertain that the orders issued to the inhabitants of the town are carried out, and will bring to the notice of the Maire and of the A.P.M. immediately responsible, all cases where these orders are not complied with.

(m) If there is no A.P.M. of a Town, the Town Major will perform these duties under the orders of the A.P.M. of the Corps in whose Area the town is situated. The Town Major or the A.P.M. of a town will invariably inform the Headquarters of Divisions in whose Area the town is situated of all arrangements for the control of the town, and will consult with them as to any alteration in the arrangements that may be required. The wishes of the Divisions concerned will be carried out as far as possible and any changes necessitated thereby will be communicated to the A.P.M. of the Corps concerned by the A.P.M. of the town or by the Town Major as the case may be.

(n) He will keep a register of all watering places and will advise the Headquarters of formations and units as to the capacity and nature of these watering places, and will suggest the allotment thereof. He will be responsible that all Routine Orders as regards water supply and the care of wells, pumps and watering places are brought to the notice of the troops occupying the town or village and will call upon units quartered therein to detail guards on wells, pumps etc. If the water supply is low, he will limit the use of wells or pumps to certain hours in the day.

(o) He is responsible for all area stores in his area.

(p) He will keep lists of all such stores, showing how they are distributed amongst units, billets or camps.

(q) He will watch that those in the hands of the troops are properly handed over from unit to unit when moves takes place, or that they are handed back into his custody when billets or camps are vacated.

(r) In cases where Units remove stores from his area without proper authority, or damage and lose stores by wanton carelessness, he will report the matter to the formation administering the Area.

(s) He will demand and draw any area stores that are required from Ordnance. Stores required for replacement may be demanded direct from the Ordnance Officer concerned, the unserviceable stores being handed in.

In the case of stores required to increase the number already held in the Area, the demand will be sent (through Divisional Headquarters if necessary) to Corps or Army Headquarters, as the case may be, in order that transfer from one area to another may be made if possible.

607. The most important duty of an Area Commandant or Town Major is to make everybody in his area as comfortable as possible.

608. ORDERS FOR FORMATIONS AND UNITS AS TO BILLETS. - Formations or Units to be billeted in a town where there is a Town Major will send billeting parties in advance to report to the Town Major.

609. Staffs, Units and details will apply for billets to the Town Major.

610. Once Units have been allotted billets, they must not take up extra billets, without first consulting the Town Major.

611. Officers commanding units are responsible that the following measures are taken :-

(a) On arrival, a marching-in state will be furnished to the Area Commandant or Town Major as soon as possible.

(b) A list will also be furnished to the Area Commandant or Town Major as soon as possible, showing the billets occupied.

(c) Twelve hours' notice before departure will, if possible, be given to the Area Commandant or Town Major.

(d) The various orders as to sanitation, fires, etc., are brought to the notice of all ranks and are obeyed.

612. TELEGRAMS. All telegrams to Area Commandants and Town Majors must be sent in clear. Messages of a secret nature will be sent by D.R.L.S.

Issued under Australian Corps Order No. 102.

1. AREA ADMINISTRATION
 (a) At 10 a.m. on 22nd May, 3rd Aust. Division will take over the administration of "A" Divisional Area including traffic control, police, and straggler posts, and at the same hour will take over the traffic control and policing of the CAGNY Area.
 (b) At the same hour 4th Aust. Division will take over the traffic control and policing of the ALLONVILLE, PONT NOYELLES, POULAINVILLE, LES ALENCONS, and CAMON Areas.
 (c) 3rd Aust. Division will relieve all officers and other ranks of 4th Aust. Division employed as Area Commandants or Town Majors and as Area Commandant's staff or water picquets etc in "A" Divisional Area.

2. From 21st instant, 3rd Aust. Division Reinforcement Staging Depot will be established at M.5. Central; and 4th Aust. Division will distribute their reinforcements to units from ALLONVILLE.

3. STORES.
Trench and Area Stores including all tents and trench shelters (canvas) will be transferred in situ. Statement of exchange of tents and shelters will be furnished to Corps "Q".

4. BATHS
Bath sets will remain as at present located and will be exchanged between 3rd and 4th Aust. Divisions.

5. RESERVES
Reserves of ammunition, water and rations in "A" Divnl sector will be taken over in situ by 3rd Aust. Division. Receipts will be exchanged and forwarded to Corps "Q".

6. SUPPLIES
3rd Aust. Division (less Div. Art.) pack will be transferred from POULAINVILLE to AILLY -sur-SOMME.
4th Aust. Div. Pack will be transferred from AILLY-sur-SOMME to POULAINVILLE.



1. The Field Punishment Compound was introduced in order to free Divisions from the necessity of providing a Compound for men undergoing Field Punishment for more than 7 days, and of providing the necessary supervising staff and guards.
2. Sanction was subsequently given for Divisions to send to the F.P. Compound for safe custody, men awaiting trial and commitment to prison. It was only intended that advantage should be taken of the Field Punishment Compound to provide safe custody, and it was no part of the scheme to throw upon the officer in charge, the responsibility for carrying out any portion of the official procedure connected with the commitment of the man to prison, beyond his actual despatch by train to the Base.
3. It has been found that some commanding Officers have been attempting to throw the responsibility for drawing up or completing the necessary papers on the O.C., F.P. Compound, and this has led to irregularities and delays which the Corps Commander cannot permit.
4. In future no man will be received for safe custody in the F.P. Compound, unless he is accompanied by properly prepared documents as set out in Table "A". The O.C., F.P. Compound has orders to return to the unit, any man sent by units for safe custody who is not accompanied by documentary authority. When men are taken to the F.P. Compound under arrest, by the Police, the O.C., F.P. Compound will immediately apply for authority to hold them to A.P.M. Corps, who will at once take steps to arrange for their disposal.
5. When approval is received from Army Headquarters for a man to be committed to prison, the responsibility for preparing the documents, even though he may be held for safe custody in the F.P. Compound, lies entirely on the O.C., Unit who will forward the completed A.F.B. 385 B, to the O.C. F.P. Compound who will then despatch the man to prison.

GRATIEN will on receipt of written instructions order the civilian population to immediately move to the rear following the routes set out to their defined destinations. Maps and instructions have been prepared for issue to the traffic controls directing the civilian population along their proper courses.
4. Written instructions to Corps Units will be sent by Corps, direct or through the Area Commandants in whose area they happen to be, for their move at once to the rear. The route and destination will be defined in each case.
 Written instructions will be sent direct or through Area Commandants in whose area they happen to be, to Headquarters of the Labour Groups, to immediately put into operation the confidential orders that have been issued to them in advance by the Labour Commandant, which orders will clearly define the route and final destination of each Labour Company.
5. The Area Commandants of areas as set out in para. 3 will receive written instructions to move to the rear together with their Staffs on completion of their duties. The route and destination will be defined in each case.
6. The Commanding Officer of the Corps Cavalry has earmarked men to carefully familiarise themselves with the tracks as laid down for the civilian population in the maps supplied so that they can direct and control the traffic.
7. The Control men for the civilian population will on receipt of instructions from Corps through the Commanding Officer of Corps Cavalry immediately take up their stations where the course set out crosses main lorry routes, to prevent the use of the main roadways by civilian transport and refugees.
8. Heads of Departments, vide Table "A", have instructions prepared for the Units under their control.

D.F. 1st AMENDMENT
to

ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTIONS FOR DEFENCE SCHEME.

The following amendment in the Scheme for the evacuation for the Civilian population in the AUSTRALIAN Corps Area will come into operation from midnight of 24th/25th May. This cancels the arrangements as set out for the evacuation of the Civilians, in paras 2 and 3 of the original Scheme:-

- "1. The Order of general evacuation by Civilians of the Villages in the AUSTRALIAN Corps Area will be given by the G.O.C., French mission, attached G.H.Q.
2. On receipt of this Order, the Mayor of each locality, or his representative, or failing both, the Interpreter detached on duty in this locality will instruct the inhabitants as to the route they are to follow:-
 - (a) to the entraining station at POULAINVILLE (or should POULAINVILLE be rendered untenable, VIGNACOURT) if they are leaving without their personal belongings.
 - (b) to LONGPRE - LES CORPS-SAINTS (red route) or POIX (blue route) if they choose to go by road with cattle and carts.
3. Arrangements have been made for trains and rations at POULAINVILLE and VIGNACOURT. Interpreters will be at these Stations.
4. Lorries will be provided by the French Authorities and the Army for transport of sick and old to entraining Station. These lorries will assemble at Corps French Mission to be detailed with Interpreters as and where required. Such lorries to follow lorry roads as laid down on M.T. Circuit map (10/5/18).
5. Cattle will be disposed of by French Purchase Boards at LONGPRE and POIX.
6. AUSTRALIAN Corps will provide guides to keep all Civilian traffic on roads and tracks selected for this purpose while in the Corps Area."
