



MEMORANDUM ON DEFENCE.

LT-COL. F.W.G.ANNAND, DSO., VD., COMMANDING 2ND AUSTRALIAN PIONEER BATTALION.

In the Field, 1st January, 1918.

In the event of a hostile attack on our Divisional Area, the Battalion will form up on the AVOIDING ROAD W of NEEPPE in B.15. b and d. The following picquets will be posted at once:-

No.1 of one platoon from A Company in trenches S.E. of MILL in

B.16.d. covering road from PONT NIEPPE.

No. 2 of one platoon from D Company in trenches East of NIEPPE near last detached cottage in thoroughfare called TRAIN DE CHARIOT - COUROBLE, about 300 yards from AUBUCHERON ESTAMINET.

No.3 of one platoon from C Company in trenches at COURTE RUE BIOD,

about B.10.d.93.5.

The picquets will send out reconnoitring patrols, listening and observation posts well ahead, and send information and reports to Battalion Headquarters, AVOIDING ROAD, near the southern end.

All the battalion officers should inspect the system of trenches from South West of the MILL in B.16.d. to COURTE RUE so as to be fairly acquainted with them in case the battalion had to man them as a reserve line.

Should the battalion get the order to 'Stand to', the Assistant Adjutant with 8 Headquarters Cyclists will report to Divisional Headquarters for orders, getting into and keeping touch with G Staff and C.R.E.

After assembling on AVOIDING ROAD each Company will send a runner to Battalion Headquarters.

LEWIS GUNS. - B.L.G.Officer will select posts to be occupied by the guns and crews doing anti-aircraft duty in default of any other direct orders being received by them.

He will attach any remaining guns to the picquets detailed above, giving preference to No's. 1 and 3 in that order, but dividing

available guns evenly as possible.

Pack animals will report to R.S.M. at present Battalion Headquarters and be loaded with S.A.A. They will then join their respective Coys on AVOIDING ROAD. Limbers for remainder of ammunition and bombs, and for Headquarters Stationery, etc., will also report to R.S.M. at Present Battalion Headquarters and after loading proceed to AVOIDING ROAD. The Battalion Pioneers to provide a loading party.



PROGRAMME OF WORK.

RIGHT BATTALION. (in order of urgenty).

Maintenance of ULTIMO LANE, ULTIMO AVENUE and ST YVES AVENUE. 1. Draining, berming and revetting where necessary.

Completion of Duckboarding of VANCOUVER TRACK. 2.

Improvement of Front line posts in form of short lengths of trench. 3. Draining where possible, otherwise to be pumped. These posts to be subsequently joined up by a proper constructed and revetted trench.

Improvement of cellars and other accommodation in LA BASSE VILLE. 4. See attached sketch 'A'. This work must be done at night and all precautions taken to prevent its being observed by enemy.

The work at Steenwerck Laundry is now practically complete as required and has effected a great improvement.

Your Sgt. Edmondson who was in charge of the work, took a great interest and made a very good job of it.

Reference visit to STEENWERCK Laundry to-day, will you please arrange to put in hand the following jobs :-

Q. LARGE DRYING ROOM.

1. Patch up furnace and render as safe as possible by erecting wire netting or similar grids over it and part of flues, so that there is no danger of clothing falling on heated surface and becoming ignited. Also remove woodwork close to furnace where there is risk of fire and replace with sheet iron or brickwork.

2. Strip lining from roof and re-lay as ceiling on the beams of roof

principal. Cover on top with tarred felt.

3. Make provision for air outlet through celling round flue at end

remote from fixe furnace.

4. Provide for air inlet fitted with regulator at furnace end either by 2 castiron 4" pipes through furnace or by sheet iron flue on top of furnace. Inlet end to be provided with sheet iron hood and discharge end to be about 2 feet higher than inlet end.

5. Put glass in upper panes of windows and repair any other panes

where necessary with linen.

6. Block up as far as possible all air ingress and egress except specified inlet and outlet.

2. SMALL TWIN DRYING ROOMS.

1. Alter one of these as follows :-

Make and install new flue connected to furnace tragget through top of fire box, thence sloping upwards through drying room to connect to old vertical flue at further end of room. Block up entrance to old flue. Part of new flue outside of drying room should be brickedin or boxed in with sand to prevent radiation and woodwork protected where it passes through wall. Wire protection should be arranged round flue to prevent clothing coming in contact.

2. Provide air inlet by flue sloping upwards from a hood fixed over fire door and leading into drying room. Opening of hood should not be

less than 18" x 12".

3. Provide for outlet, with regulating device, round flue where it penetrates ceiling.

4. Strip part of roof and use boarding for ceiling on collar ties.

Glaze windows with glass in lieu of linen.
 Block up all air leakage as much as possible.

7. Improve system of drying racks.

3. NISSEN HUT DRYING ROOMS.

1. Repair all damaged windows with linen and block up all unnecessary holes.

2. Re-arrange stoves and flues with more system and to give more heating surface.

3. Provide for definite system of air in-draught and out-draught.

The above alterations should be done as far as possible without interfering with work of Laundry. The only stoppage for any extended period required should be in repairing furnace of big drying room and fitting air inlet pipes. This should only require one days interruption

Trollies will only be issued to officers or N.C.Os. or the men who present an order signed by an officer and bearing a unit stamp.

The individual to whom a trolley is issued will sign a receipt therefor, and will be personally responsible that the trolley is returned to the Depot from which it was drawn within 12 hours.

When a trolley is returned to the Depot the relative receipt

will be handed to the one who returned the trolley.

Receipts for trollies that are unredeemed after 12 hours will be sent to D.H.Q., for disciplinary action against the delinguents.

In the Field, Jan. 26th 1918.

INTENTION.

1. Battalion will march out of this camp on 28th instant to relieve 3rd Aust. Pioneer Battalion on Corps Work, taking over billets now occupied by that Battalion, as well as works being done by them.

ROUTE.

- 2. H.Q., (including Band) via NEUVE EGLISE to DRANOUTRE. Coys to arrange own routes.
- MARCH DISCIPLINE.
- 3. As laid down in previous orders, to be strictly maintained.
- 4. (a) H.Q., (including Band)
 (b) Companies and Transport will march out and move independently to new billets.

STARTING TIME.

H.Qrs. at CEMETERY on Rue de la Gare, at 10 a.m. Companies to arrange own time and place. Company Transport to accompany respective Companies and return to LURGAN CAMP at completion of move.

ADVANCE PARTY. 5. Party consisting of a Officer and 1 Sgt. per Coy proceeded to various locations on afternoon of 26th inst., to take over Camps and Works of Coys of 3rd Aust. Pioneer Bn. Lieut. C.L. Henry and 2 Signallers from H.Qrs will proceed to H.Q., 3rd Aust. Pioneer Battalion on 27th inst., to take over all billets for personnel and transport. Advance Parties to take over all maps, official papers, stores, etc., giving receipts for same and certificates re billets.

CAMPS IN THIS AREA. 5. Camps at present occupied by all units of this Battalion will be left thoroughly clean, including shelters camp lines and adjacent areas. A certificate to the effect that this has been done will, after a searching inspection has been made by an officer, be forwarded to Battalion H.Qrs. by 9 a.m. on 28th instant. Inspection of hillets, lines, etc., will not be made until every man is on parade in full marching order (not including blankets) ready to march out.

If after Coys or other units of the Battalion have marched out, it is subsequently found that billets occupied by them Have NOT been left clean when this could, and should have been done, orders will be given to the unit concerned to detail a party under an officer, to return the following day

and clean up.

All surplus good food will be taken and handed over to Coy Cooks orto Battalion Store.

FIREWOOD AND FUEL.

It is suggested that Coys make arrangements to carry any firewood or fuel obtainable in this area, with them on the march, in order to guard against men taking timber from billets in new area on arrival there. Disciplinary action will be taken against any man offending in the hatter respect.



No prevailing diseases or cases of trench feet in this month, although the weather changed from a hard frost to a thaw, that required most of the men to walk and work in slush and mud for several days.


The great improvement in comparison with January 1916 is probably accounted for in part by being in more comfortable billets and the careful attention to regular foot baths and massage by French method under the Coy Chiropodists. Hot drinks were provided for all night parties.

There were few cases of venereal disease, and generally the health
