

ASCAR.	14.3.16	Sgt. W.O. JACKSON (who came from 1st. Div. Artillery) and Lieut. A. SHERRINGTON promoted 2/lieuts, and posted to Batteries. Lieut's G.L. DEAN and JOLLY on strength from 6th. A.F.A. BRigade.	
	15.3.16	General Sir W.R. BIRDWOOD visited the camp.	
	17.3.16.	The 13th. Battery entrained for ALEXANDRIA en route for MARSEILLES, they are taking most of the horses and are going on a horse boat.	
	18.3.16	H.R.H. The Prince of Wales and Gen Sir W.R. BIRDWOOD visited the camp. All troops fell in at the head of their lines and cheered the Prince as he passes. During the evening the Brigade assembled at MOASCAR Station and entrained for ALEXANDRIA leaving at midnight. Other ranks travelled in open trucks and officers in covered trucks. Light rain fell during the trip but the spirits of all were at their highest in looking forward to the trip to FRANCE.	
EXANDRIA.	19.3.16	Arrived at 8 a.m. The 13th. Battery embarked on board H.M.T. "S.S. Haverford" and the remainder of the Brigade on H.M.T. "S.S. Minnewaska"	
	20.3.16	Sailed at 10 a.m. Guards mounted and every precaution taken against submarine attack	
AT SEA.	21.3.16 to 23.3.16	Excitement prevailed during the trip on receiving a wireless meesage that the H.M.T. "S.S. Mineapolis" (sister ship to "Minewaska") was torpedoed within 10 hours of us.	
MARSEILLES.	24.3.16	Arrived at 4 p.m. The horses of other units on board the "Minewaska" were unloaded, also our baggage. All ranks remained on board during the night, no leave available.	
	25.3.16	The Brigade except the 13th. Battery left by trains at 2 p.m and 7 p.m. for LE HAVRE. The journey by train although a long one proved most interesting and was beautiful, passing through RHONE Valley and arriving at LE HAVRE during the night and early morning of _	
E HAVRE.	28.3.16	Disentrained and marched to No. 1 Camp. Very wet, cold and muddy. Tents only were available, and the camp site being on the top of a hill overlooking the sea was open to all the weather. Action Wt W5300/P713 750,000 3/18 E 2688 Forms/C2118/16.

HAVRE.	29.3.	16 to	Very wet and muddy weather experienced, a great contrast to EGYPT.  Batteries and B.H.Q. kept very bisy drawing Guns, wagons, stores and equipment from the Britist Ordnance Depot.  A very strong wind raised the camp to the ground.  Advanced parties of Gun detachments under Lieut's R.C. OSBORNE and R.V. DIAMOND proceeded to the Line and joined 2 R.F.A. Batteries for experience at HOUPLINES and the vicinity of MARMENTIERES.
