



The usual quota of Officers, N.C.Os. and men markhed out to 13th LA KREULE Nucleus. Major A.H. Darnell D.S.B. is appointed to command the Nucleus Bn. contd. Lt Elliott M.C. marched out on leave and Lt Sharpe reported from hospital. The relief passed off without incident. There is every indication of a strenuous time before 'us salving, and getting the line in order -- our usual fate, The Battalion is disposed s under; --BHQ, and HQ. details .. the Brickfield, STRAZEBLE-ROUGE CROIX Road, "C" Coy. Line Right Left "B" Coy. "D" Coy. Support "A" Coy. Reserve our patrols have been active both by night and day. The sector is moderately ujet, except for 14th STRAZEELE sniping and machine gun fire. Shelling below normal. The weather unfortunately is threatening Tonight we readjusted our line to conform to the extended front allotted the Brigade. The 2th Bn. took over our left post while. "D" Coy was moved up on the right of E "C", taking over from the 2nd Batt. "C" Coy. also took over 2nd Battalion's Support Coy. position. To meet the difficulty of carrying, the C.D. has decided to send up all rations to line Coys. on mules. This will save the labour of 80 men. It is the first time the Battalion has tried this stunt. The enemy has been shelling "D" Coy very mafeseverely and also BHQ. The feeding is excellent at present and the mules went O.K. though one was knocked by wshellfire and the Transport Corporal got a nice little Blighty. No casualties today. The weather is fair. loth Enemy activity is about normal and his shelling more vicious. He stoned BHQ. today but Allah was good and they were all "overs". There were no casualties. Tonight we readjusted the line andxxxxx on a two-company basis, "C" Coy. being withdrawn to Supports. The G.O.C. inspected the trenches today. Enemy shelling was brisker but so fat no counter-attack has even-20th tuated. The Divl. Commander visited the Battalion this morning and had a conference with the C.A. The weather is good. This afternoon we advanced our line to conform to that of the 9th Batt. 21st capt. cJ.S.D. Walker M.C. was killed in action. at about 7 p,m, hust prior to ZERO. Lieut L. A. Riches took command of the Company and the following work was carried out: --At 7 p.m, supported by artillery and Trench Mortars, the Left Coy. of the X 11th Battalion advanded and captured GERBEDEON FARM and cross toads at F. 1. a. 85.25 (Sheet Strazeele). Three of the enemy were captured at F.2.a.84and 4 others were killed. RTD Two Minenwerfers were captured. Artiller shelling and heavy machine gun fire were encountered during the operations. Our outpost line was generally advanced. The work of Lieut. W.A.W. Gudgeon M.C. was specially admired commendable. Lieut. F.W. McKean was evacuated to hospital and the followings officers reported to Nucleus Btn. # -- Capt W.R. Hallahan M.C., Lieuts H. Colvin, F. Dale and A.W. Warrington. We were relieved tonight by the 10th Battalion and moved back to the Support Battalion lines with Battalion Hyrs. in the Small Chabeau, PRADELLES. The Battalion is disposed as under: --"D" Coy. NORD STREET and COURTE CROEX. "B" Coy. STRAZEELE Defences. BA" COY. STRAZEELE AVENUE. "C! Coy. Reserve line, PRADELLES. The relief was completed without incident. The weather is good. PRADELLES Band The men were able to clean up after their trip into the line. Aclean change was issued to all ranks and a canteen has been opened in PRADELLES, a case of beer being sent up to each company nightly. The rations are very good. We supplied about 30 men tonight on working parties for the Engineers improving the forward area and constructing shelters in the line of respetance. Two other ranks in "D" coy. were wounded by shell fire. The enemy shelled "D" Coy severely during the day and dropped a few around BHO. without result. 
MOUNTED (651) No Officer in the Battalion will in future send to Horse GROOMS. Lines for mounted groom without the written authority of Commanding Officer.


