


7. APPLICATIONS FOR RETURN TO AUSTRALIA. A very large number of individual applications for return to Australia are being received at Headquarters from "C1" personnel. The G.O.C. desires all ranks concerned to realise that A.I.F. Depots requires large staff of "C1" personnel, as otherwise "A" Class personnel would have to be employed, and thus not be available to proceed Overseas as needed reinforcements to the troops in the field. He also wishes those concerned to remember that just as personnel who have been casualties return to their units in the field on becoming "A" Class, as is their duty, so it is the duty of "C1" personnel to perform in the U.K. any work allotted to them, and only "C1" personnel in excess of the requirements of Depots can be returned to Australia. It would be inequitable, of course, for a man to be returned to Australia if fit for Home Service and required for it, while a man who had become "A" Class had to return to the front.

It is therefore requested that individual applications by "C1" personnel shall be made only by those who consider that there is a special reason why they should be returned to Australia, notwithstanding their being required in the Depots, and it should be remembered that it is only in very special cases that the Defence Department, Melbourne, approves of the return of "A" Class personnel, and also, as has already been said, that "C1" personnel should not be in a more favored position, except where there are special medical reasons for the application.


