


Report of Conference held on 17th May, 1918, at General Headquarters. Present: Commander-in-Chief, Chief of the General Staff, and Major-General Hon. H.A. Lawrence, commanding No. 5 Section, Canal Defences.

SLOLINA

The question of the method of occupying the QATIA District was carefully considered. After some discussion, it was agreed in principle that to carry out and maintain a line of communication right through the QATIA District to its Eastern limit would not be essential. The Commander-in-Chief considered that if the railway were pushed out to some point about the latitude of UNI UGBA, and a strong advanced defensive position were to be maintained in front of Eailhead, control of the Eastern portion of QATIA District (i.e. from OGHRATINA to BIR EL ABD) could be satisfactorily maintained by our mobile troops operating from the advanced defensive position.

It was therefore decided that General Lawrence should select and prepare a strong advanced position facing approximately East, astride of the CATIA - EL ARISH road, between UM UGBA and HOD EL RESHAFAT. This position to be designed for about 4,000 Infantry, and sufficient Mounted troops to ensure the effective control of the country further East, as far as BIR EL ABD. A second position, to be selected and prepared by General Lawrence, covering ROMANI and MAHEMDIA; this position to be designed for about 2,000 Infantry, and proportionate mounted troops. The works at DUEIDAR to be extended and improved in order to accommodate a garrison of from 500 to 1,000 Infantry.

Eauge railway should be run from a point North-west of ROMANI up to MAHEMDIA. The Main line to be carried on from ROMANI up to the rear of the advanced position near UM UGBA. The light railway to join the broad gauge line at a point to be selected by General Lawrence, and to be reported to General Headquarters later.



On the occasion of the Commander-in-Chief's visit to FERDAN this morning, the G.O.C., 11th Division brought up the case of Captain Barry. The main points are as follows:-

Captain Barry who has hitherto held a temporary commission in the Manchester Regiment, is employed as Brigade Machine Gum Officer, 34th Infantry Brigade, in which capacity he is of very great value, and would be most difficult to replace. Recently, however, Captain Barry has been appointed to a regular commission in the Manchester Regiment, and had accordingly been ordered home to join a regular battalion. General Fanshawe has made application that this Officer may, instead, be posted to the Service battalion of the Manchester Regiment with the 34th Brigade, in order that he may be retained in his present employment. If this is found to be impracticable owing to the condition of the sand, please furnish a further report as to the possibility of constructing a cheap road between TOUSSUM and DEVERSOIR, via SERAPEUM, on the west bank.

Such a road would be rarely used, and metalling would probably be unnecessary. It is suggested that the removal of surface sand and the laying of rushes or litter covered with clay would probably meet the case.

With reference to your telegram No. 70 of yesterday, the establishment of a Brigade Machine Gum Company for a Dismounted Brigade is the same as that laid down for an Infantry Brigade Machine Sun Company. With regard to the surplus machine guns at present in possession of the Highland Mounted Brigade, the position will be as follows :-Two Lewis guns per regiment will eventually be issued to each of these regiments. Their Vickers machine gums, together with those belonging to the other regiments of the 2nd Dismounted Brigade, will be used for the formation of the Brigade Machine Gum Company. As it will be impossible to find personnel for more than the Machine Gum Company authorised, it would not be possible for the regiments of the Highland Mounted Brigads to use their surplus machine gums, even and they should keep them. Transport for the Regimental Machine Gun Sections cannot be increased ; nor is it considered advisable to form sections partly of Lewis and partly of Vickers machine guns.

With reference to your 17512/Q of 19th May, it is regretted that these papers were not forwarded through you, as would have been the correct procedure. The Commandant, School of Instruction, ZEITOUN, however, was not to blame for this, since he acted under instructions erroneously given.

with regard to matters of discipline connected with the School of Instruction, the Commandant has already been given authority to communicate direct with General Headquargers in certain cases. It has been found necessary to give him authority to return officers under instruction to their units on account of acts detrimental to discipline, notifying the unit by wire accordingly, and forwarding the written report to General Headquarters, and to the Headquarters of the formation to which the unit of the officer in question belongs.

Except in so far as special authority of the above kind may be given from time to time, the School will be under your command for administration, and corresponds direct with General Headquarters only on questions connected with training.

It will probably be arranged that in the event of reinforcements being required for the Eastern front, they will either take over the duties of garrison battalions or some of them, releasing the latter, or arrangements should be made to bring them over to the Canal zone themselves. As some of the Base Depots seem very strong in view of the negligible wastage just at present among the troops they serve, I am considering whether we could not actually take over some of the garrison duties with the Base Depots immediately, and release a garrison battalion or so. War Establishments, Part VII only allow for one Medical Officer and two Orderlies ( one a Corporal), whereas actual Medical Officers approved for an Army Corps are one Deputy Director of Medical Services, one Assistant Director of Medical Services (Sanitation), and one Deputy Assistant Director of Medical Services (who corresponds to the Medical Officer shewn in the War Establishments above quoted), vide War Office telegram No. 4267 (S.D.2 dated 29th March 1916.

No office staff for the Deputy Director of Medical Services has ever been approved, nor have orderlies for water duties, as is the case in Divisions, and I request therefore, that the above Establishment may be sanctioned, as at present, the necessary clerks have had to be obtained from Field Ambulances, who cannot well spare trained R.A.M.C. personnel for this purpose.





The Commander-in-Chief, when visiting the posts at EL KUBRI to-day, was far from satisfied with the work that he saw. In many cases he considered that the siting of the trenches had not been well arranged and that the work should by this time be far more nearly completed. Means of communication left much to be desired, wiring was in some cases ineffective, and general measures for protection were not, in the Commander-in-Chief's view, adequate.

The strength of the garrisons allotted to works did not appear in some cases to have been sufficiently considered in relation to the size and design of the work and the purpose for which it was constructed.

In the Commander-in-Chief's opinion an active and well led enemy might prove a serious danger if he should attack this portion of the line, and immediate and vigorous measures are necessary in order to render the KL KUBRI position secure. He wishes to make it clear to you that he will hold all officers concerned personally responsible that these measures are taken immediately and with the most unsparing energy. He emphasizes that all isolated works such as these, whether the garrison be large or small, must be made impregnable to any attack that is not strongly supported by artillery.

The receipt of early information of the approach of an enemy, especially in preparation for an attack at dawn, is a matter of the first importance. In this connection it is by no means enough to trust to a few weak listening posts within the wire defences for sufficient warning to get the garrison under arms and in position to resist attack.

The number of posts held must depend upon the number of troops available. To hold more posts than the available troops can adequately secure is to court disaster.

It appears to the Commander-in-Chief that the work carried out in this part of No. 1 Section is decidedly inferior to that which he has inspected in the other sections of the Canal Defences.

It is understood that the spit is only about 1 mile wide at this point. 

Information has been received that the best point at which to out the spit is near the disused buoy marked on the 1/125000 map.

You should arrange to reconnective the coast in this neighbourhood, both from the point of view of the dredging operations and from that of the provision of a pier, etc. inside the Lagoon. The Senior Raval Officer, ERYPT, has been requested to communicate with you direct if he should wish a Naval Officer to accompany this reconnaiseance.

Report received from Colonel Kelly that force under his command successfully occupied FASHER 10 a.m. twenty third May. Main action took place near Village BERINGIA twelve miles north of capital, where enemy numbering between two and three thousand held strongly entrenched positions morning of twenty second. Camel Corps successfully induced them leave this position and to attack our troops with utmost rapidity and desperation. Enemy's attack met with withering fire, but some penetrated to within 10 yards of our lines. Our troops counter-attacked, totally defeating enemy whose minimum losses estimated at one thousand. Sultan Ali Dinar reported fled with small following early twenty third instant. Our casualties, Major H.C. Maydon severely and two Egyptian Officers slightly wounded. Rank and file, killed five and wounded nineteen. Only other casualty Lieut. Slesson, Flying Corps, slightly wounded, to whose gallant air reconnaissance I referred in my telegram of twenty third instant.



Fairly reliable reports have reached me that parties of Turks and Germans have been landed from submarines and possibly also from steamers on DENOHAZI coast, and that an attack on SOLLUM is contemplated - SOLLUM is quite ready and I have also a monitor and a sloop in SOLLUM BAY. I have, through my Italian Military Attache who is at SOLLUM, asked Italian commander at BARDIA to co-operate if possible in order to ensure a decisive defeat of the enemy if he should attack SOLLUM. I do not anticipate any assistance from the Italians, as apparently they have orders to remain strictly on the defensive, nor is Italian help essential to me. I let you know this, however, in case you should hear of this from the Italian Government.
