





They appeared to be retiring on to bridge. Waited about 20 minute and then attempted to move forward. A M.G. opened at once from about U.30.a.90.90. then came back to about U.24.c.20.00. Here I found a track leading forwards to MOAT FARM. Between this spot and MOAT FARM I picked up a telephone wire. I cut a piece out of this: split my party into three groups and surrounded MOAT FARM on Southern, Eastern and Western sides. I myself with 5 men followed the wire. When we got to within 30 to 40 yards of the FARM, we heard sounds of tins or iron rattling. At the same time a flare went up on the extreme left. By its light I saw 8 or 12 men moving in single file N.E. along the MOAT at U.23.d.9.3. Owing to darkness and broken ground we could not follow them. At the same time a messenger from party on Southern side reported that a party of about 5 men was moving in the vicinity of U.30.a.3.7. About 5 minutes later a M.G. opened from vicinity of DOLLS HOUSE firing straight into MOAT FARM and at the same time the M.G. at U.30.a.90.90. (already mentioned) opened. I consider it probable that the former party retreated from U.23.d.8.2. to U.24.c.2.5. (river bank) thence south along river to DOLLS HOUSE (tracks visible in photo No.69 B.194) Just about sufficient time elapsed between the time of their departure from MOAT FARM and the opening of M.G. from DOLLS HOUSE for them to have covered the distance to opposite DOLLS HOUSE. I did not deem it advisable to proceed further. After 10 minutes I withdrew and came in via KATHERINE POST.

The ground was beginning to thaw but was everywhere quite passable. No flares were thrown up on the battalion sector during the time of my patrol except on the extreme right. Sounds of traffic were heard at times from DEULEMONT - like the sounds of road metal being unloaded and of carts moving over newly metalled road.

PONT ROUGE bridge is an iron structure about nine feet wide with thick iron railings about eight feet high. It is very similar to English rallway bridges. About the centre of the river the bridge has collapsed leaving a space of about ten feet of water. On the eastern side of the break is what appears to be a pontoon about four feet by three feet. On the northern side of the bridge is a single raised duckboard track about two feet above the water. It has wooden railings about four feet high.. It is quite undamaged and I am of the opinion that it has been used by three men within thr last 24 hours, as there are tracks across it on the snow which lead to cellar at U.29.b.45.38. and along river bank for about 20 yards southwards from bridge. There is concertina wire running from about U.29.b.50.30 to U.29.b.60.40. It is practically no obstacle. Another double duckboard bridge runs across river from U.29.b.70.38. to U.29.b.75.30. It is also undamaged and has been used fairly recently. The duckboard continues along hedge to about U.29, b, 50.60 There is a well worn path on the river bank between the two bridges. Sounds of stifled coughing and whispering could be heard from the opposite bank of river about U.29.b.55.25. A searchlight played once from about U.29.d.70.60. There was no M.G. fire and no flares while the patrol was out.

The marsh alongside the bridge at this point is very thick and impassable. Went from this point to hedge at

In accordance with Para 4 of your memo, all concerned were informed by a wire sent at 3.25 p.m. that the test would take place at 8.45 p.m. on 21st inst.

When it was decided to hold the test at this time the weather was threatening and a drizzling rain was falling. Unfortunately, at about 6 p.m., the weather cleared and the visibil-

ity from 7 p.m. onwards was excellent.

Each S.O.S. position and repeating station was issued on the afternoon of the 21st inst. with four red lights and 2 Very pistols. No one within the Battalion beyond the Headquarters Staff was informed of the time of the test. The only instructions given to the personnel manning the stations were that a test would be carried out during the present tour in the line, and that for the purposes of the test, the red flares issued would be substituted for the genuine S.O.S. signal.

At 8.35. p.m. the two forward Fullerphone stations (G x 4 and G x 5) were connected through direct to Battn. H.Q. and instructed to speak the word "Fired" as soon as the initial signal was observed. At the same time arrangements were made to signal the time that the final signal of the chain was fired at Support Coy.

H.Q., CONVENT LANE.

The Intelligence Officer fired the initial signal from about U.23.d.20.90. Owing to the good visibility, all the signals could be seen from Battn. H.Q. The signal was repeated first at left Coy. H.Q., then at the post at U.22.d.25.05, then by right support Coy. H.Q.







#### ADMINISTRATIVE MEMORANDUM No.1.

Reference - 18th.Battalion Order No.7.

- Arrangements for the move of personnel and transport are given in 18th.Battalion Order No.7.
- 2. Billeting Lieut.A.V. Irvine M.C. and one N.C.O. per Coy. will proceed on 29th.inst. to LUMBRES Sub Area as billeting party and will meet battalion on arrival at LUMBRES Station. It is probable that Battn.H.Q., "B" and "D" Coys. will be at AFFRINGUES, and "A" and "C" Coys. at SENINGHEM.
- 3. Routine 31st. January 1918 will be as follows:-

Reveille - 6 a.m. Breakfast - 6'30 a.m. Sick Parade - 7'30 a.m. Dinner - 10'30 a.m.

Kitchens are to be in readiness to leave at 11'15 a.m.

On arrival at LUMBRES Station, hot cocoa etc. will be provided by the Y.M.C.A.

Extra dixies are being sent forward by motor lorry and as complete mm a meal as possible will be prepared for troops on arrival at billets.

4. Entrainment - Strict discipline will be maintained on the march to DE KENNEBEK, during entrainment and throughout the journey. As far as possible, it will be arranged that a N.C.O. is in charge of each compartment.

Orders will be issued as to discipline during train journey and

will be strictly complied with.

- 5. On arrival at billets, accommodation will be arranged as far as possible so that Sgt's and W.O's are billetted separately and that a Corporal is in charge of each billet. Coy. Commanders will also arrange as far as possible to billet each platoon together.
- 6. Fire Orders for precautions against fire are contained in S.S. 611 and Battalion Standing Orders, each of which has been issued to Coys. A certificate will be forwarded to Battalion H.Q. by noon 30th.inst. stating whether these are in possession. A copy of S.S.611 will be posted in each billet and its terms stringently enforced at once and continuously.
- 7. In the new area -Baths will be located at SENINGHUM.

Divisional Canteens will be opened at HENNEVEUX and HARLETTES on 29th.ir

Brigade Cinema and Concert Troupe will be opened at a time and place to be notified later.

Brigade School, will re-assemble in continuation of the present course, on 1st. February 1918. Staff will report on that date at 10 a.m.; N.C.O. students will report at 2 p.m. 2nd. February 1918.


