RIVERY	12/7/18		<p>On the 9th July orders were received to the effect that the Company would move forward on the 12th incl. the Division taking over the HAMEL Sector, on that day Company Headquarters were established at LA NEUVILLE (Map ref. Sheet 62.D. I. 34. C. 90. 85). The Section at SALEUX was withdrawn, & the following details posted: - One N.C.O. & 2 men to the Salvaged Ammunition Dump situated at DAOURS (map ref. 62.D. N. 6. C.). One L/Cpl & 3 men to the Town Major, CORBIE, to assist in both military salvage & the recovery of civilian property. One man to each of the Town Majors of FOUILLOY, AUBIGNY, DAOURS & VAIRE SUR-CORBIE. Also the usual personnel to each of the Brigades. Poulainville continued to be rather during the time the Division occupied this sector, & the salvage section already posted there remained for the receipt & dispatch of Salvage. The men attached to the S.R. Points also remained there, the same procedure for the evacuation of Salvage being continued as hitherto; viz All salvage evacuated by ration Wapons to the Supply Refilling Points & thence, after being sorted, dispatched to Railhead, Poulainville. Two men were also posted at the A.R.P. Querrien & returns will show the immense quantity of Ammunition & Component Parts which passed through the hands of the two parties posted at Daours & Querrien. The section, however, at Daours A.R.P. was totally inadequate to deal with the work there, it was found necessary to arrange for the services of a number of men of an Imperial Labour Coy to give assistance in the sorting & packing of the various Component parts, & to assist in the loading & unloading.</p>

LA NEUVILLE	12/7/18		<p>It was very distressing to note the havoc caused to the town of Corbie since our first visit there in April, for whereas at that time the place had not been shelled it was now very badly knocked about & there was scarcely a building which had not either received a direct hit or the splinters of a shell falling close by. The once beautiful Church - a landmark for many miles around - stands as another witness to the wanton methods of warfare adopted by the ruthless Hun, for the many direct hits by shell fire have robbed it of its beauty, & as in the case of many other such buildings, a large sum of money will have to be spent to restore it. It was, however, very pleasing to note that the scheme we had inaugurated on our previous visit here for the recovery of valuable property had borne good fruit, for an officer had been placed in charge of a party there for this purpose, were carrying on the work on the lines suggested by the 3rd Salvage Coy; viz, the removal & recording of the material, & already many thousands of pounds worth of goods had been recovered. At this period, also, a party of the Salvage Coy. was detailed to collect agricultural machines from abandoned farms, & these were handed over to the Agricultural Officer who was appointed for the supervising of the cutting of the crops for the French. It will be readily imagined, that seeing we were so close to the line, & that this had now become a particularly lively sector, we experienced some very exciting times at Company Headquarters, shells falling frequently all around us, & it is very much regretted that on the 16th inst, Company Hdqrs received a direct hit, resulting in the deaths of N° 4971 Sgt. D. O. Anderson, & N° 1817 Pte. H. W. Evans, the former dying within a few minutes of being very severely wounded & the latter being killed instantly. As a result of the destruction caused by the shell it was necessary to find another billet, & Headquarters was therefore established lower down the street at I. 34. C. 5. 60. From a salvage point of view the HAMEL front did not bring forth much general salvage, but on towing the Divisional Area the A.C. Company discovered large quantities of abandoned ammunition & component parts, & steps were at once taken to get every assistance possible from the D.A.C. Brigades to have this collected, & examined, & whatever was serviceable</p>

LA NEUVILLE	16/30/7/18		<p>reissued to Batteries. This work was taken up very keenly by the different Brigades each unit endeavouring to show a better valuation return for the week than the other, but in some cases an excess of zeal was shown, inasmuch as there were cases of units removing what appeared to be abandoned Ammunition but which was really only temporarily abandoned, the Battery having only shortly before taken up another position, & returned to the old position to find the ammunition lifted. This of course caused some inconvenience, & it became necessary to instruct units to report all Ammunition Dumps (seemingly abandoned) to the D.C. Company before removing same, when information could be obtained as to whether the ammunition was permanently or only temporarily abandoned, & instructions issued accordingly. A Dump was formed by Brigades for the receipt of all live Ammunition so that same could be examined & what was found serviceable immediately reissued, thus saving transport in taking same to the A.R.P. Dours, only to be returned again to Batteries.</p> <p>A vast quantity of Engineering material was discovered in the Divisional Area, & so that same could be properly dealt with an Officer & NCO of the Pioneer Battalion were attached to the Salvage Company, who toured the Area & reported daily on the material found, on which report a return was drawn up & forwarded to the C.R.E. of the Division, who was thus able to take the necessary steps for the immediate utilisation of this material, & as return will show, much useful work was performed by Lieut. Howard & Cpl Summery.</p> <p>Another item noted in the Area was the immense quantity of cable wire lying about & abandoned. This was taken strongly in hand by the Salvage Company, with beneficial results, & we were constantly called upon by sections of the Signal Company to supply cable for urgent needs.</p> <p>By the 28th inst., the villages of Aubigny, Souilly, Dours & Vaire-sur-Corbis were clear of salvage, & the men attached to the Town Major, Corbie, had</p>

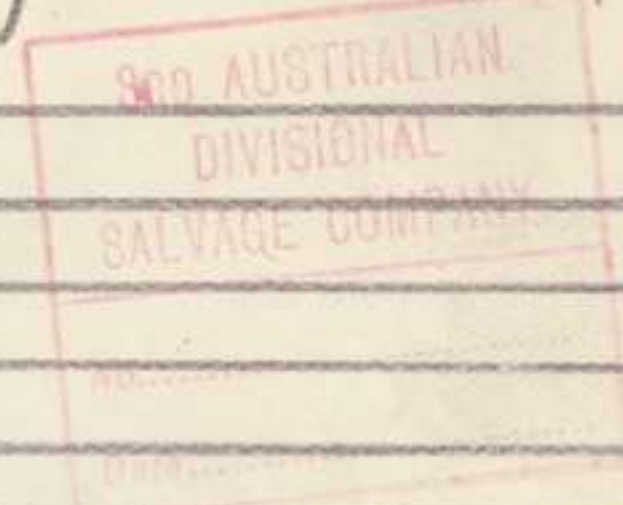

From Brigades etc., through the usual channels to Brigade refilling points - from thence to Railhead.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR CPL. JOHNSON IN CHARGE OF EVACUATION OF SALVAGE.

You will continue your duties of evacuation of salvage to Railhead, and will ensure that the following is effected:-
That all salvage from Refilling Points is cleared to Railhead same day as received.

That personnel at Refilling Points tie rifles ready for dispatch to Base: these are required not to be sent loose in trucks, but should be tied according to classification in such a manner as to be easy of examination of bolts. Personnel at Refilling Points will also tie clothing together according to its class. Also they will keep as far as possible Equipment etc., separate in its different classes, and will be responsible that they receive no material other than military.

As salvage N.C.O. in charge at Railhead you are finally and absolutely responsible for the correct classification and packing of salvage before its despatch to Base, and as such you must exercise the strictest supervision, and no matter how consignments are labelled they must be thoroughly examined before despatch, to obviate any chance of complaints being received from the Base, etc.

Your personnel should be instructed immediately that under no circumstances must ammunition; empties; or component parts of ammunition empties etc., whether heavy or S.A.A. be received at either the Refilling Points or Railhead, and any personnel endeavouring to deliver same to Refilling Points should be instructed that these things must be taken to the A.R.P. at 62 D. N. C. C.

It is essential that the salvage of R.E. material be placed on a more systematic footing, and exploited as fully as possible. Large quantities of material are required for winter hutting, and a large percentage of what we require is available in the form of salvage. Each Division will detail an officer of Engineers or Pioneers to supervise the work in communication with the Divisional Salvage Officer. A Corporal of Pioneers will be attached to each Divisional Salvage Co. who will search the area and report to the Divisional Salvage Officer the location and quantity and the expert personnel for its recovery. The Salvage Officer will then make the necessary demands on Divisional Headquarters for working parties and the work will be carried out under the command of Pioneer Officer detailed for this duty. The salved material will be handed over to the Divisional Units in need of them for dispatched to Corps dumps. To this end the Salvage Officer and Engineer or Pioneer Officer on salvage duty will keep in touch with the C.R.E., O.C. Pioneers and Engineer Officer attached to Heavy Artillery.

Complaints have been received by me of Units salving from Gun positions serviceable ammunition.

It is requested that immediate steps be taken to instruct Units that these must be avoided by parties salving. Obviously clean and serviceable ammunition should be left in position and the location notified the Divisional Salvage Officer immediately.

I would add that the taking of serviceable ammunition back to the A.R.P. necessitates the calling from Corps and Army, Ordnance Officer Experts to pass or condemn same, and of course they naturally require to know under what circumstances it was salved, and upon investigation by me the evidence is often conclusive that Battery positions evacuated temporarily are immediately cleared of the whole of the ammunition left in the Gun positions by salving parties of Units who do not seem to trouble whether it was permanently or only temporarily abandoned by the Artillery.

ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTIONS No. 185 B

S A L V A G E.

Consequent on the installation of Light Railways, and the formation of Australian Ordnance Ammunition Units, Administrative Instructions 185 A are cancelled and the following substituted:-

1. Collection of salvage in the Corps Area will be carried out by means of returning transport as far as Brigade and Divisional Supply Dumps and A.R.Ps.
2. Salvage Dumps will be formed at Wagon Lines and in close proximity to Divisional Supply and Ammunition Refilling Points. Salvage will be taken to these Dumps by returning Transport, and from Wagon Line Dumps to Divisional Dumps by Transport proceeding to fill.
3. From Divisional Dumps, all salvage other than Ammunition, ammunition components, ammunition boxes, fired brass cases, etc., will be despatched to Supply Railheads.
4. Salvage will be despatched to Supply Railheads from the Reserve Division, and from the Division in 'A' sector by lorries after they have completed supply duties.

The Division in 'A' sector will demand lorries as required from S.M.T.O. for this purpose. The Division in support will use lorries which bring forward their rations, and which are not detailed for further duty.

Salvage from these Divisions will be returned to Railhead packed ready for dispatch to Base.

5. (a) From Divisions in 'B' and 'C' sectors, Salvage will be dispatched by Light Railway to the Corps Salvage Dump at POULAINVILLE Railhead to receive, sort and dispatch.

Representatives of the Divisional Salvage Company will be stationed at each Brigade Supply Dump on the Light Railway to receive salvage, place it in sacks roughly sorted and dispatch it to POULAINVILLE.

(b) Each Sack will be labelled "Salvage (Unit _____)" and each truck "Australian Corps Salvage Dump POULAINVILLE, from _____ Brigade Dump."

(c) In addition to men at Brigade Supply Dumps, as in para 5 (a) the Divisions in 'B' and 'C' sectors will supply a small party (minimum 3) to check salvage arriving at POULAINVILLE, and to obtain for the Divisional Salvage Officer records of salvage returned.

(d) The personnel for the Corps Dump at POULAINVILLE will be provided from the Salvage Company of the Division in support.

(e) In view of the shortage of Light Railway Trucks and the fact that trucks after the delivery of rations are often derailed for further duty without return to POULAINVILLE, trucks must be definitely demanded for salvage.

A permanent detail can be arranged, or trucks demanded daily as required.

(f) If trucks are demanded daily, such demands must reach Corps Light Railway Officer, Australian Corps H.Q. not later than 3 p.m. on the day previous to that on which trucks are required.

Stanchion trucks and not box trucks will be required for salvage.

(g) The disposal of salvage from the Dump at POULAINVILLE will be under Corps arrangement.

6. (a) Salvaged Grenades, Trench Mortar ammunition and German ammunition will be returned to FRESCELLES Railhead from Divisional A.R.Ps by returning Ammunition Lorries.

(b) Empty Ammunition cases, Clips, Fired Brass cases, Cartridge Tins, Fuse Cylinders, etc., will be returned to FRESCELLES or SALEUX Railheads by returning ammunition lorries.

(c) Salvaged Heavy and Field Ammunition, if undoubtedly serviceable, will be handed over to the nearest Artillery Unit.

52 (d) Salved Heavy and Field Ammunition, about the serviceability, of, which there is any doubt, and salved components which could be utilised in repairing unserviceable ammunition, will be dispatched to Australian Ordnance Ammunition Units at BALLARAT (O.20/B.20.d) or WAGGA (62 D/R.21 c) Dumps. Lorries for this purpose will be arranged by Corps Salvage Officer on application from Divisional Salvage Officers.

(e) Attention is directed to Army standing orders No.655.

7. The Area Commandants will establish salvage dumps in their own areas for the collection of miscellaneous salvage, notifying the location of the dumps to the Corps Salvage Officer.

When approximately a lorry load of salvage had been collected, the Corps Salvage Officer on receiving notification from the Area Commandant will arrange for its removal to the Corps main Salvage Dump -AILLY-SUR-SOMME.

8. The Corps Salvage Officer will have detachments at FRESCELLES, SALEUX, and AILLY-SUR-SOMME Railheads to receive salvage. These detachments are for the purpose of loading and dispatching only, and all salvage sent to these Railheads must be properly sorted and packed ready for dispatch to Base.

All empty shell cases must be properly boxed or bagged before being returned to Railhead. (See G.R.O.4513).

9. The Salvage Company of each Division will nominally work its own Divisional Area and will accompany its Division on relief unless otherwise ordered. To ensure continuity of work, the Salvage Company of a Division in the forward area will not be withdrawn until relieved by the incoming Salvage Company.

10. Salved Paper, Cardboard, and Jam Cartons will be returned through the above channels to AILLY-SUR-SOMME and POULAINVILLE Railheads, where they will be baled ready for dispatch to ENGLAND.

As different types of paper are distributed to different centres in the United Kingdom, and mixed bales all have to be opened and re-sorted at the Base ports, Units should as far as possible dispatch paper to Railhead, sorted into the following categories:-

- (a) White
- (b) Colored (other than brown)
- (c) Brown
- (d) Newspaper
- (e) Sundry

11. The Salvage ~~organization~~ organisation exists for the collection of abandoned derelict material, and for its disposal by those channels through which it will be brought into use again with the least delay and to the best advantage.

To carry this out it is important that no serviceable article which is required in the Forward Area, should be returned to the Base.

The G.O.C. 3rd Australian Division instructed me on the 16th inst., as Divisional Salvage Officer to submit any suggestions I may have to make for the more speedy clearance of salvage from the Divisional Area when in line. etc.

I regret that owing to the death of my sergeant and my chief clerk, my work was slightly disorganized and it was not possible for me to submit my suggestions before this.

The following suggestions are enumerated:-

(1). BRIGADE SALVAGE OFFICERS. One Officer per Brigade to be detailed for the specific duty as Brigade Salvage Officer. This Officer to be responsible for the clearance of his Brigade Area, whether in line or at rest. He should be in the closest touch with the Divisional Salvage Officer, who will advise him and direct the broad outlines of salvage operations in the particular area of his Brigade. The Brigade Salvage Officer should also have the authority to call upon Staff Captains of Brigades to supply personnel for special salvage work outside that performed by Battalions, - where it is possible for such personnel to be supplied. During battle action the Brigade Salvage Officer to be attached to the Divisional Salvage Officer: this would ensure a co-ordination of all salvage work.

(2). ARTILLERY. In like manner should one Officer be detailed from the artillery personnel, to ensure the clearance back to Railhead of all artillery salvage from gun positions. This Officer also to be responsible that serviceable ammunition in line and unavoidably left by Batteries changing positions is again taken up to the guns at the earliest possible opportunity. He should also be responsible for the prevention of accumulation of salvage at the A.R.P.'s.

(3). ORDNANCE REPRESENTATIVE. One Representative from D.A.D.O.S. to be attached to the Salvage Company for the purpose of supervising the retention of Stores for reissue to Units. This Representative to have a knowledge of Small Arms and Machine Guns. By keeping in constant touch with D. A. D. O. S., this man will ensure that the absolute minimum demands on Base are made, and should have power to issue on direct demands from Units. As the amount of Stores that can be retained is very small owing to no congestion being allowed at Railheads, it is more than necessary nowadays that someone in daily touch with D. A.D.O.S. should be at Railhead, and that he also should have an intimate knowledge of the immediate requirements of the Division, so that the maximum amount of salvage may be utilized for reissue without delay.

(4). OUTLINE OF WORKING IN BRIGADES AREAS. The Method obtaining at the present time; i.e. each Battalion or other Unit having a definite Area to salvage, in my opinion cannot be improved upon, but in detail, I would suggest that Commanders of Formations have power to call upon any working party employed in his Area (whether the working party belongs to his Brigade or not) to manhandle back salvage upon its return from work, arranging of course beforehand with the Commander of the working party where it is to be dumped, and that it is dumped within the line of march of the returning party.

(5). REPORTS. That the following system of reports be instituted, so that if necessary D.H.Q. may be in a position within a few days of its going into line of estimating approximately the amount and nature of salvage work to be performed.-

Each Brigade to be responsible for reporting upon its whole area in detail, square by square; within four days of taking over in line. This report to be rendered to D.H.Q. and the Divisional

Salvage Officer simultaneously and to embrace salvage of all descriptions, and to be concise and clear: such wordings as "a lot of barbed wire" and "a good many shells and shellcases" lying about somewhere in -----" to be avoided. Definite map locations, and if possible the exact pin prick should be given.

130 To obtain a thoroughly and reliable and satisfactory report; it is suggested that Battalions on being allotted their different area should detail an Officer or a thoroughly reliable N.C.O. to go over that particular area square by square, and this Officer or N.C.O. should personally sign the report, which should be countersigned by the C.O. Unit.

These reports would then be forwarded by Brigades, as suggested above.

No. 6 BATTLE ACTION. As for when in Line, except that the Divisional Burials Officer to keep in close touch with the Divisional Salvage Officer, that the following personnel be attached; -

One Gas N.C.O. to examine all gas salvage, especially enemy.

One Armourer, with tools for immediate repair where possible of salvaged Lewis and Machine Guns, and if necessary German Machine Guns, to make same ready for immediate use.

Also that a definite scheme for salvage operations when in Battle action be drawn up and promulgated to all concerned, as the system which obtains while in Line is not adaptable in its entirety to Battle action conditions; neither does there appear to be any instructions issued from Corps or Army that permits for the co-ordination for salvage work between Divisions, Corps, and Armies, in the event of a general advance. The instructions issued under "Salvage" pamphlet S.S/640 dated March 1918 apparently deals with the matter from the view point "fixed positions" or the "limited objective" in its reference to salvage, and the most comprehensive scheme (though not the best that could be devised) that I have seen upon the subject was that issued by 2nd Anzac Corps in 1917, which allowed for salvage operations being definitely defined during "war of movement" with "long distance or unlimited objective". This matter may of course have already been arranged, but personally I am aware of no Australian Corps scheme to this effect.

No. 7 ENGINEER PERSONNEL. Corps circular 170/364 dated 14/7/18 received this day fills a much felt want, but if the N.C.O. referred to therein had a knowledge of signal and telegraphic apparatus, in addition to his other technical qualifications, it would be of great help in connection with signal apparatus, cable, etc.,

No. 8 SALVAGE PERSONNEL. The Divisional Salvage Company to be kept as far as possible up to full strength; i.e. one Officer, 69 O.R. so that they may be allotted as follows, which is absolutely essential for effective salvage work when the Division is holding the Line:-

One N.C.O. as Brigade Salvage Corporal.

One man per Battalion for each Brigade.

One man each for Pioneer and Machine Gun Battalions.

One N.C.O. and 9 men for Railhead and S.R.Ps, for sorting, packing and clearing to Base.

One N.C.O. and 2 men for Artillery A.R.P. for supervising and checking Artillery salvage.

Two men S.A.A. and Grenades Salvage Dump, attached to A.R.P. to deal with all salvaged S.A.A., Grenades, Bombs, etc.,

One man to each Field Ambulance.

One N.C.O. and two men to D.A.D.O.S. for checking, sorting, classifying and packing salvaged clothing etc.,

This would leave approximately 30 O.R. from which would have to be taken Company H.Q. details, the remainder being utilised for special work; for example, i.e. salving villages, or other special work in the forward zone etc.,

It will thus be seen that the Salvage Company, even if up to full strength, would have its time fully employed. THE COMPANY AT PRESENT IS ONE THIRD OF ITS PERSONNEL UNDER ESTABLISHMENT.

May I respectfully add that owing to the need for intensifying of salvage operations generally, and for the effective carrying out of salvage duties by all concerned with a view to getting the maximum amount of result with a minimum amount of effort, that the foregoing suggestions be favourably considered for adoption where possible, especially relating to the appointment of Brigade Salvage Officers and the keeping of Salvage personnel to its full strength.
