1. The 10th. Australian Field Artillery Brigade will be relieved by the 169th. (Army) Brigade on night May 2nd/3rd. and will move to "A 1" Divisional Area on relief, becoming Mobile Reserve.
2. Batteries will be relieved by corresponding numbers, viz:

37th. Battery	-	376th. Battery R. F. A.
38th. Battery	-	377th. Battery R. F. A.

110th. Battery will draw out on being informed that 379th. Battery is in action in old 41st. Battery position at V.29.c.34.80.
3. When a Battery has been relieved and reported so it will march direct to Rear Wagon Lines and "stand by" to march immediately to new area.
4. Order of withdrawal is as follows :-

39th. Battery	8 pm	to	8.30 pm

5. The Teams and limbers of 37th., 38th. and 39th. Batteries will bring in the Guns of the relieving Battery and take out their own guns - this arrangement will be made known to the Forward Wagon Lines. 110th. Battery will be responsible for its own withdrawal and the 4th. 15-pdr. Battery for its own arrival.
6. Advance parties of the incoming Batteries will be at GROUP HEADQUARTERS at 10 a.m. 2nd. May. One H. C. O. per Battery will be sent to GROUP as Guide to the Party.

7. Liaison and O. P. Duties will as far as can be arranged be taken over by 169th. Brigade at 6 p. m. in order that the incoming Officer may be shown the extent of his duties and the Country as far as visibility allows.
8. NO MOVEMENT OF ANY SORT WILL BE ALLOWED EAST OF HENENCOURT BEFORE 7. 45 p. m. unless the day is a dull one.
9. Receipts in Triplicate for AMMUNITION, MAPS, PAPERS etc. handed over will be given in at Headquarters as soon as possible after the change takes place but before the B. C. leaves for the Waggon Lines. It is desired of despatching these to 2nd. Division before GROUP hand over.
10. B. C's. will be ready to move out of REAR WAGON LINES at 12 midnight and will report by special Orderly any circumstances which have inadvertently delayed them.
11. Advance parties will move off as already arranged to be at 4th. D. A. H. Q. by 10 a. m. tomorrow, 2nd. instant. They have been instructed to send Guide back with fullest particulars as to the Batteries new positions.
12. B. C's will report completion of March to Brigade Headquarters at GLISY.
13. Attached is MARCH TABLE.
14. Baggage Wagons have been ordered to report to REAR WAGON LINES by 11 a. m.



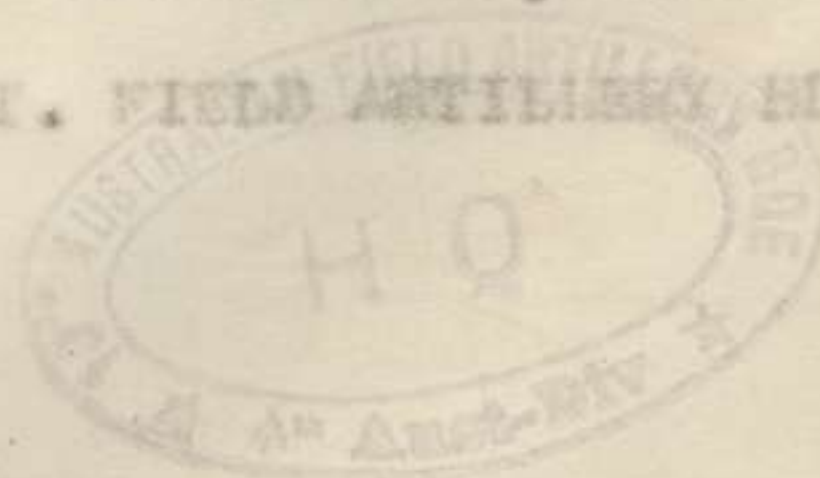

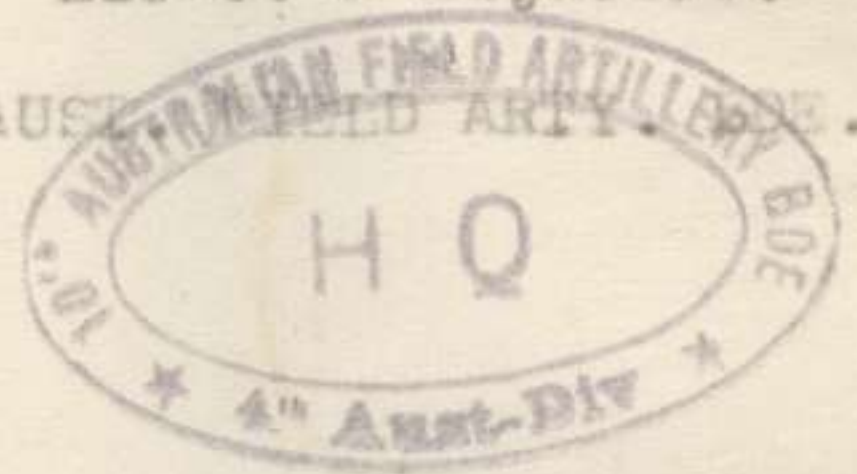
