



Laverton	25-10-1	6	When the 3rd Squadron, Australian Flying Corps, under the command of Capt. H.H.Storrer, marched out of Laverton Camp (old site) at 3 a.m. on 25th October 1916, the remaining 26 men together with Lieut. A.K.Stronach were taken command of by Lieut. Andrew Lang who was enlisted from the N.S.W. School of Aviation, and constituted the nucleus of the 4th Squadron, Australian Flying Corps.	ppendices
			The work of the Squadron whilst at Laverton consisted of technical work in connection with the aircraft at the C.F.S. Laverton, primary physical training, musketry, etc. All men upon entering the camp were subjected to a mechanical test and if they failed to satisfy the Examining Officer were immediately forwarded to Royal Park for inclusion in some other branch of the Army.

T.Hewson All of the above Officers attended daily at the C.F.S. for primary instruction in aviation and passed through their initial stages in G.W. Box Kites and Maurice Farman S.H. However they each flew for about 30 minutes dual only.	
			The Squadron was mobilised by 10th January 1917. Lieut. A. Lang had in the meantime been promoted to the rank of Temporary Captain. The Squadron with the Officers previously mentioned embarked aboard the R.M.S. OMRAH at Port Melbourne Pier and together with 21 first reinforcements sailed at 1 p.m. the same day. Lectures on all aeronautical subjects were given during the voyage.	
			The Squadron arrived at Plymouth on 27-3-1917 and marched into No.6 Camp, Perham Downs, the same night at 11-40 p.m.	
			On 28-3-17 the Squadron was inspected by General Sir Newton Moore, and rested in Perham Downs Camp until it proceeded to Castle Bromwich aepodrome on 2-4-1917.
