

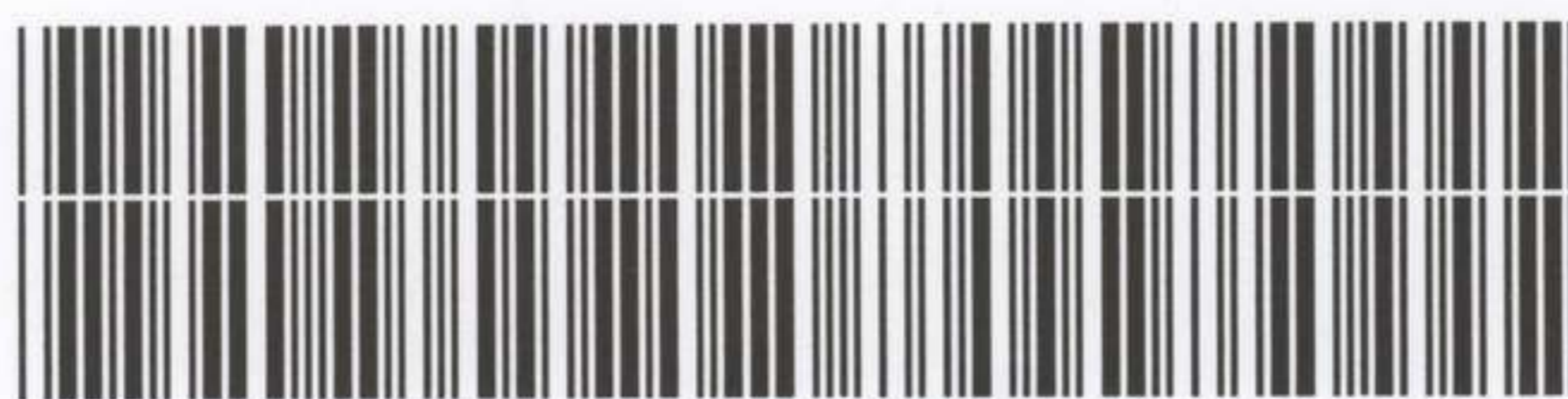

- (1) I was informed that the 1st Australian Infantry Brigade would be the Reserve Brigade for the 1st Australian Division's attack on the 20th inst, on objective shown on Appendix I. 3rd Battalion was to be ready to assist in attack or to meet counter attack if necessary from ZERO onwards.
- (2) On 18th inst "D" Company moved to vicinity of HALFWAY HOUSE I 17 A & C to construct shelters for the Battalion. On completion of this task this Company was used by Brigade for carrying.
- Two Platoons Nos. 10 and 14 were detailed for duty with C.R.E. 1st Australian Division during the operations.
- The Strength actually present with Battalion at ZERO including "D" Company temporarily detached -

PRELIMINARY MOVES. -

- (a) 19th September. - At 1700 Battalion less "D" Company moved from DICKEBUSH AREA to CHATEAU SEGARD Area.
- (b) 20th September. - At 0100 Battalion less "D" Company moved to Trenches near HALFWAY HOUSE I 17 A & C.
At 0740 (ZERO plus 2 hours) Battalion less "D" Company moved in Section Columns to original front line and replaced 2nd Australian Infantry Brigade.
Battalion Headquarters were established in MENIN Tunnell at J 13 B 5 0.
This move was completed at 0930 on 20th inst.
- (3) Distribution of Battalion less "D" Company at 0930 on 20th inst in J14A shown on Appendix I (one) marked in purple.

(5) 1st Infantry Brigade Order No. 49 received on 21st inst. ordered 3rd Battalion to take over GREEN LINE from 8th and 7th Australian Infantry Battalions on night of 21st/22nd inst. Relief completed at 0050 on 22nd inst. Dispositions and Boundaries are shown on Appendix I. marked - Dispositions in BLUE - Boundaries in YELLOW. Battalion Headquarters at J 14 B 2 3.

(6) Whilst in original front line about Seventy Casualties were suffered through hostile shelling. Very little hostile shelling on front line though heavy at times on area near Battalion Headquarters. Enemy Snipers were active and very difficult to locate. Hostile Machine Guns were also active including a good deal of indirect fire. No hostile Infantry Attack was launched on this Battalion front.

(7) 1st Infantry Brigade Order received on 22nd inst. ordered me to hand over my line as follows :-

(a) From - J 15 B 6 3 to J 15 D 3 7 to 9th YORKS.

(b) " - Southern edge of POLYGON WOOD at J 9 D 5 0 to J 15 B 6 3 to 8th YORKS & LANCS.

(c) " - J 9 D 5 4 to J 9 D 5 0 to 56th Aust. Battalion.

The Relief by 8th YORKS & LANCS. and 56th Aust. BATTALION was completed at 2245 on 22nd inst, and by 9th YORKS at 0110 on 23rd inst. without incident, and Battalion moved to HALFWAY HOUSE.

(8) At 1130 on 23rd inst. Battalion moved from HALFWAY HOUSE to DICKEBUSCH Area H 26 B.
