

"I" SECTOR.

A. a and b. In this area localities most suitable for positions for Artillery are available chiefly in the Northern and Southern ends of the sector, where the positions are covered.

The best positions are shown on the sketch herewith.

On the eastern edge of the forest and near the roads gun positions could

be prepared if time allowed.

In the western and central portion of the sector the country is flat and provides little cover for the positions and is remote from the best O.Ps. Temporary positions; the northern end of the sector provides frequent positions for Batteries to wheel into action "semi-covered" off the main roads, but observation would not be easy especially in retirement unless the position happened to be near one of the O.Ps. marked on the sketch. Only the most suitable positions are marked in this sector though many others less good are available.

B. (c) Observation; - The chief points suitable for observation are situated in the northern part of the sector, near Biesmeree and Stave, thence along the eastern edge of the sector and again at the southern end near Franchimont.

The remainder of the area is either flat or covered with dense forest

and observation is bad.

The best points for observation are at or near;-

(1) 3I 1872 NE to SE, good.

2) 3H 7045 narrow arc over Biesmeree and to North.

(3) 3H 9528 NE and E. (4) 4I 0597 NE and E.

(5) 4H 9070 Several good points, wide field of view.

(6) 4H. 5030 E and SE.

Except at the North and the South ends of the sub-area observation across the area is not possible.

- (d) RELIEF; The surface of the area is easy for movement, and except at the South end is not broken up by deep valleys.

 At the North end it falls away to the East and West, but the remainder of the area is more or less flat with its longest reentrants coming in from the East and South East.
- (c) STREAMS; Except the small stream running from Stave to Biesmeree there are none to impede movement of Artillery, and it, even in the absence of culverts, would not be a serious matter.
- (f) FORRESTS; -A large portion of this sub-area is covered with dense woods and forests, all impassable to horse drawn artillery except where traversed by roads, these are often little better than forrest tracks, and would soon be cut up.

(g) OTHER FEATURES, - There is no marsh country, as far as could be judged with snow on the ground.

Tramways, - FLORENNES to ROSEE, The rails of this line have

been removed by the enemy.

At 3H 6756 there is a large clay-pit and from it a narrow gauge tramway (in good order) runs along the main road to STAVE Rly Stn. 3H 8639, This is not shown on the plan, NAMUR 8 1/100000.

"J" SECTOR.

Reconnaissance was carried out when the whole of terrain was covered in snow & a slight thaw had set in resulting in more or less of a quagmire. The first class roads were in good order. Second class roads were good on the crown only. Third class and bushtracks were impassable.

c. 3H.1.3 Chimney stacks. 3H.3.5. CORROY FARM to North of PAVILLONS (3H.45.23) Factory at Florennes.

N.B. There being so much wooded area to East and on our Front suitable observation posts were few. The only practical method to gain observation would be to erect 0%P platforms in trees on Eastern edge of Forest.

d. Mostly undulating 5/8ths of area wooded roads running West to East are passable for horse drawn Artillery other than as already noted in

bushtracks etc.

e. Rivers LES PRIES, LAYLETTE, GERINAUX & GRAND PRIX. Roads running West to East cross these streams. In mobile warfare these streams could be crossed at almost any spot by the aid of a Pontoon or Pioneers could construct a bridge in an hour to allow the Artillery and Echelons to pass over. The nature of Terrain when recconcitred was almost marshy in the vicinity of these streams but under ordinary weather conditions it is not so.

f. Bois de Corroy. Bois de L'Eveque Bois du Princeare impassable for Field Artillery. Bois Tilford & Bois Brule are passable the roads through these

two woods being in fair condition.

g. 3H.13 Lake and stream. The area to the South interspersed with waterholes renders movements of Artillery up this valley impracticable. Reentrants are all on the East roads into FLORENNES-VILLERS LE GAMBON & VODECEE are so many that no difficulty would arise, in the event of any road or area being shelled, in finding another way round.

h. Country recconcitred mostly wooded, only a few roads running West & East and other than from enemy ballon observation these would not be under

observation.

Mobile warfare in an offensive would be rendered difficult by the wooded areas being mostly impassable for horse drawn Artillery. In the event of these areas being circumvented Artillery would work along the sides of the ridges quite easily-carrying Pioneers with the necessary material. All streams could be crossed.

NATURAL LINE OF DEFENCE

The natural linesof defence are good.

First line of defence & offence would be the Railway line running from Villers Le Gambon to Florennes, then to Pavillons thence by the eastern edge of the wooded area.

Bois du Prince & Bois de L'Eneque to the main road near Oret. Second line consisting of the first class road from Vodecee to Florennes

thence by second class road to Oret.

In an offensive the forests already noted would be drenched with gas as well as the valley leading up to the East. The wooded areas to be taken would be full of Machine Gun posts-the crown of the ridge as well as Valley could be readily swept by Machine Guns and numerous natural Machine Gun positions are in the area. Machine Gun positions would be posted in Quarries and Woods in vicinity of 3H.20.45 & 3H.25.30.

The difficulty would be the squeezing out or Circumventing the wooded areas on the ridges and in the Southern Extremity of the area reconnoitred. With ample artillery Brigades and the Essence of surprise being fully seized there would be little difficulty in achieving a success. Feeding the gins with amunition could be readily done for nearly all the

roads are free from direct observation other than by Balloon.




"K" Sector.


- A. On the map supplied the suitable Artillery Positions are marked in Bule blue. In all the cases marked these positions are well screened from observation.
- B. The Howitzer positions are marked in Green. The selected positions are ideal for Hows.
- C. During reconnaisance only two observation positions, which obtained a large field of view, were obtained.
- D. The country is undulating to hilly in the Sourhern Portion, the roads being under observation from the following points, churches at Vodecee and Villers le Gambon. From the Factory at Villers le Gambonand an observation of most of "K" Sector is obtained.
- E. No streams in K Sector would offer any difficulty to Field Artillery but Heavy Artillery would have to keep to the roads.
- F. No Marshes were encountered, but an old trench system is in voguein the Bois Tilfort, which has two roads running due North and South also awo third class roads running due East and West through it. Much material suitable for light railways was noticed in the Bois Tilfort, comprising Rails, trucks &c.
- G. "K"Sector is mostly undulation to hilly and offers manypositions suitable for Field and Heavy Artillery, both for offensive and defensive operations. The chief drawback to these positions is the lack of good observation points. Plenty of natural cover is offered and water is abundant in the certre of the Sector.

 The roadways which are mostly second class, are in good state of repair in they all lead through the villages which would be subjected to shelling N.N.W. of the Bois Tilfort there exists at present a system of wiring wiring to prevent the advance of Cavalry or Artillery.

 The farms at present contain very little fodder and a few stock. All watering arrangements are f the "well system" in the villages.
