<u>In the Field.</u>	Dec. 1st.16		<p>From the 1st. to the 31st. December Batteries operated in No. 3 Artillery Group under command of Lieut' Colonel King.</p> <p>No major operations occurred during the month, work being purely of routine nature.</p> <p>There were no battle casualties during the period, but on the 5th. December 1916 No. 1908 Dvr. TILLET R.T.B. was found dead in his bed. Post mortem examination showed him to have a diseased and enlarged heart.</p> <p>For the whole period of the month Lieut. Col. R. L. R. RABETT continued as Commandant of the 4th. Aus. Divisional Artillery Training School at MAOURS.</p> <p>On the 4th. December the Majorpart of the 12th. A. F. A. Brigade, Headquarters personnel proceeded from their wagon Lines by road to Maours.</p> <p>Weather conditions extremely trying during the month for both men and horses, the number of evacuations for both, consequently rather high.</p>
