

IEUPORT	2/8/1		2/Lieut. KRAEFFT and 12 O.Ranks. were detailed to assist in manning Guns of the 168th. Brigade R.F.A. which had had many casualties. Lieuts P.A. HOCKENHULL and M. BUZZARD proceeded to England, the former to proceed to an Infantry Training Batallion and the latter to the Reserve Brigade Australian Artillery, LARK HILL for further training. Infantry Operation Order for forthcoming Operations received. The 45h. 46th. and 47th. Batteries fired a Barra	
	3/8/3	7.	ge in support of Raid on Enemy Trenches. The remaining 4 Howitzers of 112th. Battery moved into position on the night of the 2/3rd. inst. Nothing to Report. Enemy shelled F.L.T. with T.Ms. The Brigade fired in retaliation at 6p.m. 534 Rounds were fired. 1st. ANZAC wired Brigade to instruct 2/Lieuts. KRAEFFT & MOSSMAN to report to 4th. Aust. Div. Arty. C.O. pointed out that 2/Lieut. KRAEFFT'S original Unit was this Brigade Wagon Lines reported to be Water-logged, and arrangements are being made to move them to LA PANNE. Throughout the night the enemy shelled the vicinity of H.Q., Batteries, and Roads. Enemy Aeroplanes dropped bombs close to Headquarters.	
	7/8/3	17.	2/Lieut. MOSSMAN proceeded to rejoin the 4th. Div. Arty. C.O. decided not to move Wagon Lines to LA PANNE as the situation was worse there than at GHMVELDE. On the night of the 6/7th. 312 Gas Shells were fired (4.5") as neutralization of Enemy Batteries. During the night of 7/8th. inst. 103rd. Bty. (att'd to this Brigade) and 47th. Bty. fired, supporting a raid by our Troops, 103rd. Battery firing Gas Shell. Enemy Shelled Roads, Brifges, etc? in the vicinity of H.Q A5834 Wt.W4973/M687 750,000 8/16 D.D.&L.Ltd. Forms/C.2118/13.

GOLDFIN-CH, 2/Lieut. R.C. SMITH proceeded to attend a course at 4th. Army Artillery School. Major ROBERTS-THOMSON visited the Batteries. Battery Commanders reported that during the night the visinity had been shekled with Gas Shell. Batteries fired 478 Rounds 18-Pdr. and 170 Rounds 4.5" on S.O.S. 	22/8/1	7.	45th. 46th. and 47th. Batteries fired practice Barease with success, 342 Rounds were fired. Hostile Aircraft brought down in Flames in Enemy's Lines. Batteries shelled by 4.2 Guns. No. damage done.
