

ST MAXENT.	8		Weather cold 14 degrees frost. Everything frozen hard and dozens of men participated in skating and sliding on the village ponds.

	10		The chief interest on these days was the arts and crafts exhibition held in a long shed belonging to a sugarmill at MARTAINNEVILLE which is only about a kilo from St MAXENT. the exhibition was a fine one and aroused much interest in the Division. Members of this Battn put in a fair number of exhibits and in most cases secured prizes. Besides the exhibits, a stadium was erected and the spectators beheld some keenly contested boxing bouts. the bands enlivened the fair with selections and the "COOEEES" gave two excellent shows daily, especially in the afternoon when extracts from the "Mikado" were rendered. Lieut. W.M. McLean was appointed Assistant Adjutant.	
	11			
	12		Capt. G. Thomas resumed regimental duties and Capt. A.P. St John "MC" was appointed to the education service. In the evening the St MAXENT Draught Club held a tournament, and Headqrs Coy had another card party, where it is rumored everyone did not play his best owing to the "Booby" prize being a nip of S.R.D.	
	14		The thaw set in and the village resumed its Venetian charm plus the mud. "B" Coy had a successful euchre party thst night.	
	15		Capt R.O'Brien who proceeded on Demobilisation duty to Havre, was struck off strength.	
	16		Lieut. H.Crail and 2/Lt J.H. Gill were struck off strength. The first results of men detached from the unit on Educational subjects were received. The results for the school, which was on care, breeding and selection of sheep, showed our selection to be a happy one, as the lowest obtained by any man was 66%, a good pass.	
	17		An incident of note from now on to the end of the month was the increased activity of our brass band, due no doubt to their drawing first boat in the Brigade. Daily in St MAXENT or DOUDENAIVILLE, where "A" and "D" Cos were, they gave us good programmes.	
	18		Lieut K.A. Murdoch was struck off strength.	
	20		The Elementary Motor Mechanism class running at St MAXENT held an examination on the previous fortnight's work. It is stated that it is due to the thirst for knowledge of these engineering gentry that the Battalion car cannot leave the shed under its own power.	
	21		Word came through that owing to industrial in England, sailing of troopships was further delayed.	
			Lieut G.Baxter was dismissed the service by sentence of General Court Martial dated 18/12/18. Following officers taken on strength - 2/Lts F.H.Byrne, L.M.Smith, C.B.Forster, F.A.Colville, H.HAMILTON, H.Gilmour. Pte J.Moffat died from G.S. wound in the chest at 46th C.C.S.



C. O's REPORT for the Month of FEBRUARY.

The month has passed quietly. Daily inspection of Billets and Cookers has been carried out and the results published in Routine Orders.

In the early part of the month we had heavy snow and then a freeze. At the middle of the month a thaw set in and St Maxent, always wet, was very muddy. It was however milder and continued getting warmer towards the end of the month.

Owing to the shortness of boots and the number of men with bad footwear, the weekly route march was cut out.

An event much appreciated by the men is the weekly issue of rum, to keep down influenza.

Generally speaking the health of the troops has been good.

Educational schemes are progressing favorably and daily men are going to situations arranged for them. During the month no less than 6 officers and 60 other ranks left us under this scheme and for repatriation the Corps Commdr visited us but did not stay for any time

The draft of the Battalion History was read daily before men from the different companies who had been present with the Unit at the periods alluded to and much information which would otherwise have been lost, was gained. Mr Bean's successor visited us.

With the ground getting softer a reviving interest is being taken in football and after the great victory over the 50th Brigade we look forward to the match that is being arranged with the 17th British Division.



7. MARRIAGES BETWEEN BRITISH SOLDIERS AND FRENCH OR BELGIAN WOMEN.— I. With reference to G.R.O. 5724 and 5871 it should be noted that all children born in FRANCE or BELGIUM, of marriages between British soldiers and French or Belgian women are British subjects.
2. Unless, however, steps are taken to have such births properly registered inconvenience and possible hardship may result in after life to the children concerned.
3. Consequently every Officer or soldier who becomes the father of a child born in FRANCE or BELGIUM of marriage with a French or Belgian woman should forthwith communicate with the British Consular Officer nearest to the place at which the birth occurs. The British Consular Officer will be able to furnish all information as to what is necessary in order that the desired registration may be effected. Particulars of such registration are forwarded in January of each year by British Consular Officers to the Registrar General in LONDON, and the effect is therefore exactly the same as

7. if the birth of a child had been registered at home by a District Registrar.
4. 


