

- 1. The FIFTH AUSTRALIAN INFANTRY BRIGADE is moving to Australian Corps
 Area, between the 2nd and 5th instant.
- 2. (a) The 17TH BATTALION, less Transport, will entrain at LUMBRES, and detrain at STEENWERCK on the 4th instant.

(b) The Battalion will fall in ready to move off at 6, 15 a.m., and

will arrive at LUMBRES Station at 8, 20 a.m.

(c) Transport, less 4 cookers, 1 G.S. Wagon (Supply), 1 Water Cart, 1 Mess Cart, and 1 Maltese Cart, will move to New Area Under Brigade Transport Officer.

- (d) Cookers, water cart, bicycles, etc. and baggage with accompanying personnel, will move by Omnibus Train from WIZERNES,
 arriving at Station at 7.50 a.m. on the 4th instant, and detraining at BAILLEUL.
