Date	Particulars.
1st.	Owing to the unfavourable weather conditions there was very little activity during the period. Practice barrage was put down as per instructions received from D.A.H.Q.
2nd.	Enemy Artillery showed increased activity during the day, and a deliberate destructive bombardment of Batteries in O.31.b. was carried out but no damage was sustained. Destructive fire against enemy personnel was directed against KIWI FARM and the WARNETON LINE in the vicinity of KIWI FARM. Practice Barrage as above was again put down.
3rd.	Despite unfavourable weather enemy intermittently shelled MESSINES Ridge with Guns of 10cm. and 15 cm. A Battery of 21cm. Hows. was also very active during the morning searching and sweeping for Battery positions in O.31.b.
4th	Enemy Artillery was again very active directing fire principally against Trenches, on whole of Sector. Effective fire was brought to bear on WARNETON LINE. Battery position at O.31.b.70.70 was again subjected to heavy fire.
5th.	Harassing fire was directed against enemy Roads and Approaches, as per Map attached. Enemy Artillery was much quieter during the period. 25th Battery was subjected to heavy fire by 21cm. Hows., but Counter-Battery work by Heavy Artillery proved effective.
6th.	During the day the enemy kept up an intense bombardment on MESSINES Ridge and Valley with Guns of all calibres, firing between 2000 and 3000 Rounds. Harassing fire was again brought to bear on enemy Roads and Approaches.
7th.	From 4.15 p.m. to 5.15 p.m. the enemy heavily shelled Trenches, D Sector (U.5.a) with 77mm, 10cm. and 15cm. from the direction of WARNETON and BAS WARNETON. Group Concentrations and Counter-Battery work by Heavy Artillery had the effect of quietening enemy. See Hostile Fire Report. Harassing fire was again carried out. At 11.20 p.m. S.O.S. Signal was fired from Bn.HQ. All Batteries opened on S.O.S. Lines and later concentrated on D Sector. Batteries ceased fire at 11.47 p.m. when 'all clear' was reported by the Battalion Commander.
8th.	Enemy Artillery was comparatively quiet during the period.
9th.	Enemy Artillery was again inactive during the period. At 1.22 p.m. the 107th Battery was shelled with 15cm Hows. and High Velocity Guns from direction of BAS WARNETON. Counter-Battery work was at once commenced by Heavy Artillery and Hostile Fire ceased at 1.30 p.m. Fire of a harassing nature was again directed against enemy Roads etc.

10th.	Enemy Artillery showed increased activity during the period. Registrations etc. were effected. From 10 am. Brigade passed from command of 3rd Aust. Divl. Arty. to 37th Divl.Arty.
11th.	From 10 a.m. the Brigade passed from command of 37th Divl. Arty. to 4th Aust. Divl. Arty. and covered 4th Australian Infantry Brigade.
12th.	Enemy Artillery showed a marked decrease in activity during the period. Our fire on enemy roads and approaches ceased on coming under the command of 4th Aust. Divl. Arty. This accounted for the decrease in activity of enemy Artillery. (See also following sheet)
13th.	Enemy Artillery still decreasing in activity.
14th.	Enemy Artillery showed an appreciative increase during the period, noticeably in Guns of small calibre. Retaliation for Minnenwerfer fire was given with effective results.
15th.	Activity of enemy Artillery continued on the increase. Several registrations were carried out by Batteries of this Brigade.
16th.	Enemy Artillery was not so active during the period, and his fire was scattered over the whole of the Brigade Sector. Our Batteries registered and tested junctions of S.O.S.barrages.
17th.	An intense bombardment in conjunction with operations on the 5th Army front was carried out at 4.45 a.m. - on 16th instant-. Immediately fire opened, enemy sent up S.O.S. Signal along the whole of the Sector, his Artillery responding very quickly. Hostile fire was very heavy on left of Sector but slackened considerably by 5.30 a.m. Previous to our bombardment, the 107th Battery directed a Gas-Shell shoot against Hostile Batteries, P.Y.27 - P.32.d.60.00 to P.32.d.60.40 - and V.W.39 - V.2.b.80.05 to V.2.b.71.00.
18th.	Enemy Artillery was much quiter during the period. Retaliation to Minnenwerfer fire was given.
	Enemy Artillery still showed less activity, fire being scattered over whole Sector. Minnenwerfer fire necessitated further retaliation, and several registrations were effected.
	Activity of enemy Artillery still decreasing. At 8.15 a.m. enemy put down a barrage on our front and support lines and Communication trenches on Brigade Sector. Batteries opened on S.O.S. Lines at slow rate of fire with satisfactory effect.

The Divisional Artillery was divided into two Groups, Northern and Southern, each Group with a Sub-Group. 7th F.A. Brigade formed Sub-Group of Southern Group and covered 4th Infantry Brigade Sector. Counter-bombardments, Liaison Barrages and Battery Sectors were arranged.

Date	Particulars.
19th	Decrease in activity of enemy Artillery still noticeable. Retaliatory fire was given during the period, and a Balloon registration carried out.
20th	Enemy Artillery still less active. 107th Battery was shelled and one Howitzer put out of action. Retaliation was given to enemy Minnenwerfer fire.
21st.	During the period enemy Artillery activity was normal. At 10 a.m. a bombardment was opened on our lines in U.5.a. with 10cm and 15cm guns. A counter-bombardment was placed on enemy's trenches and had the desired effect.
22nd.	Enemy Artillery activity during period normal.
23rd.	Enemy Artillery activity during period again normal. From 10 a.m. the 29th and 108th Batteries of 8th F.A. Brigade, were attached to 7th F.A. Brigade for tactical purposes until their withdrawal from the line on 26th/27th August 1917 in accordance with 4th Divl. Arty. Instructions.
24th.	Instructions issued that the 7th F.A. Brigade would be relieved on the nights of 29th/30th and 30th/31st August by the 26th Army Brigade, R.F.A., and that on 31st August the command of the Northern Group left Sector would pass to the C.O. 26th Army Brigade, R.F.A. Enemy batteries were fairly active; no less than four Batteries were located from O.P.s.
25th.	At 12.18 p.m. a very heavy barrage was put down by the enemy opposite "X1" Sector. It was immediately replied to by this Group with satisfactory results.
26th.	Enemy shelling was carried out over a fairly large area of our sector including positions pecul occupied by the 25th, 26th and 27th Batteries. No material damage was done to any of the guns or personnel. An enemy Battery situated in P.31.d.4.5 was observed and the Group was concentrated on it with good effect.
27th.	Raining, and cloudy weather rendered visibility poor. Enemy Artillery was noticeably inactive. 29th Battery and 108th Battery, both A.F.A., which were attached to this Group withdrew from the line in accordance with O.O.No.4.



28th	Hostile fire was very inactive and weather unfavourable. See Intelligence Reports.
29th	Enemy observed to be fairly active in the COMINES and WERVICQ area, although his Artillery was quiet.
30th	Enemy Artillery fairly active. Aircraft generally inactive owing to indifferent weather conditions.
31st.	Brigade ordered to march to BLEQUIN Area in accordance with attached March Table. Two Batteries, 25th and 26th, handed over their Guns to the relieving Brigade (26th, R.F.A.), 27th and 107th Batteries retained their Guns. Relief completed night 31st Aug./1st Sept. and Batteries withdrew to their own Wagon Lines.

2. MOVES.

(a) On night of 27/28th August the 29th and 108th Batteries will withdraw to their Wagon Lines and the 27th Battery will occupy the position now occupied by the 29th Battery (at 0.32.c.95.42 and 0.32.c.40.60)..

The 108th Battery will withdraw from the Line at 8.30 p.m.

The 29th Battery will withdraw by sub-sections as relieved by the 27th Battery.

On change of position the 27th Battery will continue to cover its present sector (X.2) and not that now covered by the 29th Battery. Registration of 27th Battery is to be completed as early as possible on morning of 28th inst. and reported by telephone to this Headquarters.

(b) On withdrawal the 29th Battery will hand over all communications, at the position to the 27th Battery.

(c) Advice of any of 7th F.A. Brigade Guns not likely to be on positions at time of transfer is to be forwarded to these Headquarters as early as possible.


(d) At the conclusion of transfer each Battery of the 7th F.A. Brigade must have six serviceable guns in the firing line.

(e) Guns will be transferred with sights and component parts complete and receipts exchanged.

(g) Battery Commanders concerned will mutually arrange Guides and minor details.



Identification Trace for use with Artillery Maps.



NOTE.—(1). These traces are intended to facilitate the communication of information as to the position of targets, which have been located on a squared map.

(2). The squares on this trace are 500 yards in length on the 1/10,000 scale, 1,000 yards in length on the 1/20,000 scale, and 2,000 yards in length on the 1/40,000 scale.

(3). The squares on the trace are fitted to the squares of the map showing the targets, which are then drawn on the trace. Sufficient letters and numbers must also be added to enable the recipient to place the trace in the correct position on his own map. A little detail may also be traced, but this is not essential. The name and scale of the map to which the trace refers must be always given. The trace can be used for the 1/10,000, 1/20,000, or 1/40,000 scale.

1. RELIEF.

The 26th ARMY BRIGADE R.F.A., will relieve the 7th F.A. BRIGADE on the nights 29/30th and 30/31st August, 1917, one Section per Bty. being relieved on the night 29/30th and remaining Sections on the night 30/31st August.

Completion of Relief will be reported by outgoing Battery Commanders to this Office.

2. COMMAND.

At 8 a.m., 31st August, the command of the Northern Group, Left Sector, II ANZAC Artillery will pass to C.O., 26th Army Brigade R. F. A.

3. MAPS AND SCHEMES.

Battery Commanders will hand over all 1/10,000 Maps and aeroplane photographs of Group Sector, also all Group schemes, orders and 4th Australian Divisional Artillery instructions.

4. AMMUNITION.

All Batteries will withdraw with full echelons, and 18 pounder Batteries will keep a proper proportion of L. and A.H. (75% L. 25% A.X.).

Receipts for all ammunition handed over will be obtained from incoming Battery Commanders and will be forwarded to this Office.

5. WITHDRAWAL.

On completion of relief of Sections on the nights of 29/30th August and 30/31st August, sections will withdraw to Battery Wagon Lines.

This Brigade then comes under the command of the C. R. A., 3rd Australian Division.

6. CHANGE OF POSITION.

The 7th F. A. Brigade Operation Order No. 3, re changes of position is cancelled.

1. INFORMATION.

The 7th FIELD ARTILLERY BRIGADE will march to BLOUWEN Area in accordance with the attached March Table.

2. BILLETING PARTIES.

A Billeting Party, consisting of Lieut. COLQUHOUN and 2 N.C.O.s., from Brigade Headquarters and Batteries, will proceed 24 hours in advance for purpose of making Billeting arrangements.

During march of 2nd September one Officer per Battery will proceed in advance to meet Lieut. COLQUHOUN at CROSS ROADS at 5. B. 80.64, in order to ascertain routes to billets.

3. RATIONS.

Rations for 1st and 2nd September will be carried.

4. TRANSPORT.

One Motor Wagon will be available for each Battery. Batteries will be permitted to include one G.B. Wagon each in their Transport, in addition.

5. TENTS & EQUIPMENT.

All Tents and Camp Equipment will be handed over to Batteries and Headquarters of 26th ARMY BRIGADE R.F.A., and receipts obtained for the same. This order cancels all previous instructions on this subject.

6. STATES.

Marching Out States will be handed to an Officer of Brigade Headquarters at the Starting Point on each day.

7. ORDENLIES.

One Orderly per Battery will report to Brigade H.Q., Wagon Lines at 8 a.m. on 1st September, and during the march, to Brigade Headquarters immediately on arrival in billets.

8. IRON RATIONS.

Battery Commanders will carry out an inspection of Iron rations on 3rd September and report any shortages to Brigade H.Q. on that day.

9. DISCIPLINE. (MARCH).

Not more than 50% of Gunnery will be mounted on vehicles. All personnel who are not mounted will march in front of Units.

10. SYNCHRONISATION.

Watches will be synchronised at 8 a.m. at Brigade H.Q. on 1st and 2nd Sept.
