

RESUME Of EVENTS.

On the 26-12-18 a Warning Order was received from 3rd D.A.H.Q. concerning a move of the D.A.C. from FERRIERE LA GRANDE to HAUTMONT? with instructions for billeting parties to report to the Town Major HAUTMONT at 1400 on the 27-12-18. This order was promulgated.

At 1200 on the 27-12-18, a report was received at D.A.C. Headquarters that the men were raising objections to this move, and that an organization, consisting of delegates chosen from each unit for the purpose of redressing grievances, was moving in the matter. On this report the strength of the billeting parties was increased, as it was thought that on their return, the advantages to be gained by a move to HAUTMONT would be widely circulated amongst the men, and that no trouble would occur in connection with the move.

On the 27-12-18 3rd Aust.D.A. Operation Order No 115, definitely fixing the move for the 28th, was received at 12 noon and promulgated. At 2000 on the 27-12-18 a report was received that delegates from the D.A.C. had conferred with delegates of the Brigades, and that the D.A.C. as a whole were going to refuse to turn out the following day.

Section Commanders reported that no preparations had been made in regard to packing vehicles for the move.

The matter was then referred to D.A.H.Q.

A muster parade wasm held by the Commanding Officer. Officers and N.C.Os were dismissed, and the men called upon to give their reasons for refusing to move, which were as follows.

- (a) Billeting accommodation in HAUTMONT was inferior to FERRIERE LA GRANDE.
- (b) If this move was necessary, why could not the D.A.C. have been put into HAUTMONT on the arrival of the 3rd Aust. Divisional Artillery in this area?
- (c) Undue hardship would be caused by the move, as there were a number of men sick with influenza in No 1 section. This would necessitate double journeys being made, and the sick men would be evacuated, and would not return to Australia with their unit.

As regards (b), it was explained to the men the original scheme of billeting was to enable each Artillery Brigade and D.A.C. to be affiliated to and Infantry Brigade Group for facilitating the A.I.F. Education Scheme.

As regard (c), No 1 Section Commander had already been instructed to move as best he could.

This muster parade was held at this hour with the object of ascertaining, and endeavouring to satisfy the mene so called reasons, and enabling the move to be carried out according to orders.

The men however unanimously declared their refusal to move at 1200 on the 3-1-19 during stable hour, men left the stables without permission, and on being ordered to turn back, refused to do so. Sixty men were immediately put under arrest.

It was then ascertained that the D.A.C. had declared a general strike in sympathy with the 7th F.A.Brigade, in connection with two men of that unit who had been put under arrest for refusing to obey an order given by an Officer, to wear white lanyards.

This strike continued all day, men refusing to parade, but watering and feeding their animals

at 0930 on the 4-1-19, men commandeered G.S. Wagons with a display of force, and proceeded to HAUTMONT to put mms forward their complaints to the C.R.A.

RESUME of EVENTS. (Conta)

This state of open mutiny existed until 0930 on the 7-1-19, when on promulgation of the order releasing the men under arrest, normal work was resumed.

It is considered that recent troubles within the D.A.C., as outlined in the RESUME of EVENTS, were due in the first place to a big mental reaction amongst all ranks which set in on the declaration of the Armistice on November 11th 1918, after the severe and continuous fighting that this Divisional Artillery had taken place in since their arrival in the SOMME on March 28th 1918. The particular phase of this mental reaction was not

appreciated by Regimental Officers or by higher Commands.

The MONTBREHAIN area, where the D.A.C. were billeted for six weeks after the signing of the Armistice, was devoid of any facilities for entertaining and amusing the men, and canteen stores and comforts were unobtainable.

Orders issued regarding burnishing of harness and polishing of guard irons gave opportunity for certain agitators to work upon the mens minds, and to form an organization to redress their so called grievances in connection with these orders.

.These grievances were put forward to the C.R.A. at a

mass meeting at MONTBREHAIN on the 12th December 1918, and conciliations made by the C.R.A.

From that day the organization grew in power, and degenerated into an organization whose object was to stir wilful defiance of authority, as was clearly shewn in connection with the D.A. CIS move to HAUTMONT on the 28th December, and the trouble in the 7th F.A. Brigade on January 3rd 1919.

It is almost certain that 90% of the men were loyal, but were either terrorised into following the minority, or persuaded to support the minority by a false spirit of loyalty to their

comrades.
