

- (1) The 2nd D.A. Order 99. Reliefs and new Locations, as issued to Sections on 1st inst. are postponed for 24 hours (BM 95) : those below will be adhered to.
- (2) 1 Officer and party will be left behind in each section to clean camps.
- (3) 1K will send 5 empty G.S. Wagons to 10th Bde W.L. arriving there by 3 p.m. 3rd inst: 2K will send 5 similar to 11th Bde W.L. by 8 a.m. 4th inst. These will not be unloaded at Dump till just before issue. Each party will be complete with teams, wagon equipment, not necessarily covers, and 1 N.C.O. who will ride with the baggage wagons if concentrated, or with Bde H.Q. wagon if separated. These wagons will be asked for on arrival of the Bde at its lines. N.C.Os must be instructed in the bivouac localities of D.A.C.
- (4) Locations:-2nd A.D.A. BERTANGLES (10 a.m.) A.R.P. Road in N. 21.c. K.H.Q. & Den.Unit LAMOTTE-BREBIERE. D. T. M. O. M. 2. Locality of.
- D.A.C. Order of march: K.H.Q. with Technical Store Wagons. 1K, 2K. Pull on to road K.H.Q. 9 a.m.: 1K 8.55 a.m., Route AGNICOURT - FRECHENCOURT Church -2K.9 a.m. QUERRIEU - Road to BUSSY West of River HALLUE - Road Junction above "V" in VECQEMONT - if necessary owing to no field roads proceed by road leading from North into LAMOTTE - to bivouacs in N.9.d. and N.15.b.
- (6) 2K will keep 100 yards behind K.H.Q. G.S. Wagons will form rear group of each Section. Dismounted gunners will be instructed not to ride on the limbers unless with written order of an Officer, and will march in fours in rear of the A.L.W. groups, not of Section.
- (7) All drivers and mounted personnel will be dismounted at least 10 minutes in each hour. Halts will be normally at (1st) 9.50 a.m. (2nd) When the head of Column is 1 mile south of QUERRIEU where all animals will be fed: the move on to take place 4 hour later; (3rd) 12.50 p.m.
- (8) A mounted messenger from 2K to report to head of Column at 9 a.m. Reports to head of Column, where C.O. will ride till near bivouacs. Adjutant will catch up head of Column at QUERRIEU halt, M.O. will ride in rear of 2K and move to K.H?Q. after feed halt. Os.C. 1K and 2K will report to C.O. near the "V" of VECQUEMONT (AMIENS MAP)
- (9) The bivouac ground is bare field: Sections may break up into subsections if desired with horse lines of each concentrated: these to be set out diminishing danger from shell fire, and the usual banks to be commenced at once. If drainage admits men's dugouts to be partly excavated.
- (10)As relief of 169th and 96th B.A.Cs. is to be completed by 5 p.m. reconnaissance parties by that hour must have located the river crossing on direct route to A.R.P. : Guides must know the Bde W. Lines, and at least 1 per section attached there for duty and reconnaissance of gun positions.

new 41 Blg Bringing to your attention the devotion to duty of 1516 Dvr. WILSON J.G., No. 2 Section, 4th A.D.A.C.74/4 He carried one wounded man of the two and saw to the safety of both. His next care was equipment, which he attended to without retiring : collected 6 sets of harmess, reharmessed with wheel sets the two least wounded, and returned to camp complete. Retention of equipment is a matter that has often been neglected in the past. Dvr. Wilson's good work was drawn to the attention of his officers in the Ypres Salient, but there were so many specific acts performed there by D.A.C. men, that they are seldom called to meet, and his devotion to duty did not bear such outstanding comparison as it has here.

There have been no recommendations for Military Medal since October 1917, and I submit this as worthy of consideration for award of one.

- EXTRACTS: (a) Firing Bty and 1st Line Wagons of 10th and 11th Bdes will transport ammunition from A.R.P. to Bty positions. The 4th D.A.C. until further orders, will NOT carry out ammunition supply.
 - (b) Permanent working parties at A.R.P. will be, as from 10 a.m. 6th inst., 2 officers, 5 N.C.Os and 61 men, viz., 4th D.A.C. 1 Officer, h N.C.O. and 21 o/r: 4th D.T.M.B., 1 Officer, 14th, 179th, 86th and 23rd Army Bdes 4 N.C.Os 40 o/r.
 - (c) E.C.G. will not be accumulated at Bty positions, but be all returned to A.R.P.
 - (d) Left and Right Groups will salve serviceable ammn., and take into use. Each of these groups details a Salvage Officer. Areas are allotted, and might be had on application to C.O. 4th A.D. Arty will salve all E.C.C. in whole Area with 12 G.S. Wagons of D.A.C., parked in vicinity of A.R.P. under a D.A.C. officer and guard. Teams and drivers will be found daily by D.A.C., 10th Bde and 11th Bde in turn commencing on 6th instant.

Salvage working hours will be from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. (midday feed to be carried) Teams on completion of day will return to their wagon lines. E.C.C. Will be dumped under orders of O.C. A.R.P. (Lt. Mein) who will "bag" and return to Railhead. Returns will be rendered by 6 p.m. each Sunday, one showing serviceable ammunition salved and another E.C.C. returned to A.R.P., each made up to 12 noon, and the latter returned by D.A.C.

2. From above Extracts the D.A.C. duties are :-

- (a) Orders later as to Echelon of rounds to be kept at Lines.
- (b) A.L.Ws when the ground permits will be run into close order line against a bank, or edge of wood, to save space and visibility, if advisable covered with boughs. Lids to be open in daytime.
- (c) At 10 a.m. 6th inst., the following will be A.R.P. party:-
 - 1K 1 Sgt. and 6 men = 7

 2K Lt. Mein, clerk and batman, there now)= 15 and Also 1 Junior N.C.O and 12 men)1 offr.

 Parties will take kits. Rations to be carried daily by their own sections for the present. Os.C. may change their men but not more than 50% in the one day, and the Dump Sgt. will only be changed through C.O. and Lt. Mein.

(d) The 12 G.S.Ws will be 6 from 1K and 6 from 2K, to be parked in wicinity A.R.P. by 8.30 a.m. on 6th inst. The officer will be detailed by O.C. 1K and his name communicated to K.H.Q. and Lt. Mein. The Guard and personnel will be from 1K, viz., 1 junior N.C.O. 1 fitter and 5 men, of which 3 will be for guard duties and others for cleaning etc. The officer in addition, at least for a few days, should take 1 riding horse and 1 man for groom and batman, who will be returned with horse if not required. This officer and party will be at A.R.P. Wagon Park by 8.30 a.m. 6th inst. and lay same out, being ready for duty at 9 a.m.

(e) A.R.P. W.L. Officers duties will include the arrangements with Bde Officers for routes, hours, transport, in collection of E.C.C. He will learn the general requirements of each, draw up roster of indents for transport: arrange for counting of E.C.C. delivered at dump, possibly giving each lead driver a chit to sign as to number of wagons or ½th loads of each he has emptied: will count 3 or 4 standard loads of E.C.C. so as to make his return on Sunday at NOON of total for week; and get this return to Adjt. by 3 p.m. He will daily take roll of the teams reporting, their discipline, routine, and comfort, reporting all irregularities to Bdes direct, or K.H.Q. as desirable, particularly want of punctuality.

- (e) Contd. He will see to cleanliness of the horse lines, latrines, and kitchen; and will examine wagons daily for weakness, and clean same after 4p.m. and before 9 a.m. with the fitter and the men not on guard duties. The guard will be properly mounted, and sentries relieved and inspected.

 He will immediately report to sections direct any wagons broken and requiring replacement. He will watch the equipment if any on each wagon, and claim for removal of any.

 His tour of duty will end after Sundays, and relief Officer will report to him on Saturdays.
- (f) Os.C. will detail on 6th. 9th, and 12th. inst., etc. 6 teams and drivers from 1K and 6 from 2K, each of 6 mules with feeds and midday rations, to be at A.R.P.W.Ls. at 8-45 a.m. 1/c, 1 junior mounted N.C.O. who will return to camp after handing over to Officer. The wagons will be frequently inspected by their Os.C. who should send them stripped. see that they are cleaned, greased and kept in repair, and replace them from time to time for overhaul.

No. 1 Section will carry its proportion of ammunition supply: until further orders, all indents will pass through D.A.C. Hq. Officer & N.C.O. guide reconnaisance parties will ride out on 12th inst.

10th Bde day party of one Officer and 25 o/r on A.R.P. work, ceases after 12th inst: also teams for A.R.P.W.L., every third day. D.A.C. days for these teams will now be 12th, 14th, 16th insts., and each 2nd day after: 6 teams from Nos. 1 & 2 Sections.

These teams will be lead to A.R.P. by an N.C.O. from each section Tho will ask the O.C. for instructions as to leading the convoys during day: they will carry mid-day rations. 


