

D.A.C. has 2 G.S. Wagons with 2 G.I. Tanks, carrying about 250 gls water each, attached from other units. Nos.1 & 2 Sectns. will take one each, as a supply, not to be broached until required by loth. & llth. Bdes.

I leave DAOURS for future VAIRE Dump taking O.C. Dump & some personnel to dig trenches in same, also telephone box & sign boards for erection in the Village. Also the Technical Stores and a small staff. Arrived there at 8.15 p.m. & parked wagons 50 yds. North of A.R.P. on which the 38th. Bty. had their Guns. Dug trenches under the wagons & sent the 14 animals to a bank near the river. Strength, 83 other ranks surplus.

On leave, 2 officers & 14 other ranks. Issued to 6 p.m.: - loth. Bde. 1292A, 988AX, 300BX 11th. Bde. 760A, 608AX.

HVU August 8th. VAIRE. xxxxxxxx.Weather very misty from 3 a.m. till clearing about 7 a.m.: fine & hot.

12.15 a.m. Instructions from D.A., inter alia, to provide two Officers and detachments for two 15-pr. anti-tank guns to be taken over at Zero plus 4 hrs. from 3rd. Aust. D.T.M.O. HAMEL, the officer to reconnoitre positions behind final objective; aprox.1100 yds. ahead, & move the guns up when ordered. 2/Lts. Grylls & Campbell are detailed on this.

Zero Hour 4.20 a.m.: The Barrage continues in 10th. Bde. to about Zero plus 130 minutes, when they limber up in sucession & move forward, followed by the 11th. Bde .. 3 p.m. Anti-tank gun officers report their locating the gun? limbers & their need for men to dig the guns out of the pits they were dropped into. 80 rds. of ammn. each. The muns were moved forward after dark to Q 23 & 24 about 2000

yds. South of MERICOURT-sur-SOMME. 2 other ranks wounded in action & evacuated.

2.30 p.m. Instructed as to position of front line, and I issue D.A.C. Order No. 22, below, ordering move to GAILLY.

Order No.22:-"(1) Front line midday runs K 18 b 8 0 - K 29 cen. Q 5 central-Q 12 a 0 2-R 7 d 3 0-R 13 a 8 0-R 26 d 5 4-R 17 a 8 8.

(2) Nos.1 & 2 Sections will move forward to GAILLY selected bivouacs today, using road 400 yds. North of HAMEL. Report hour of departure to C.O. who with Tech. Stores and R.A.P. will also move to vicinity of GAILLY A.R.P.

(3) VAIRE Dump party, less 1 Bdr. & 2 men of 1K will move to GAILLY A.R.P. at same time as last Section.

(4) Gas & Smoke round should be on dumps ordered by 8 p.m.. How. rounds in field will still be guarded till further orders. No rounds or personnel other than A.R.P. & parties will be left in VAIRE.

(5) Forward I.O.M. established at VILLERS-BRETTONEAU, Shop No. 53, send repairs there.

(6) O.C. No.1 Sec. will transfer today 12 other ranks to loth.

11.10 p.m. Orders that D.A.C. will not move across the river tonight. Wounded in action, 2,0/Rs. Strength, 81, 0/Rs. surplus. On leave, 1 officer & 17 other ranks.

August 11th. CHIPILLY. Weather fine & hot. llth. 148BX.

At 10.30 a.m. S.C.R.A. calls at A.R.P. (which is on the telephone) and I receive instructions to move D.A.C. & A.R.P. to valley to the West of CHIPILLY.

I issue message K.V. 610, extracts herewith: - "Information received front line is West of BRAY-PROYART. (aaa) New A.R.P. at CHIPILLY, K 34 c 4 0, Sections will move at noon in order, No. 2 & No.1 using CERISY Bridge. (aaa) New W.Ls. West of CHIPILLY

near river. (aaa) C.O. & Tech. Stores at A.R.P." On arrival I find valley in use by loth. & 11th. Bdes. in action but ammn. convoy arrives by roads N of SOMME and is unloaded at a quarry. A line of captured enemy 4.2 guns situated in MALARD WOOD were inspected had and assistance was given to D.T.M.O. in turning them round and firing them on line North East of BRAY.

Range 11,200.

Several unburied dead on road & fields near A.R.P. & bivouacs. Driver Bertelsen to Queensland on transport duty, married with wife in Australia & embarked 1914. Despatched 4 gnrs. & dvrs. to King's Inspection at COISY for to-morrow.

E.A. in evening drop bombs in vicinity of bivouacs.

S.A.A. Sec. moved complete to VAUX-sur-SOMME & carted 20 wagon loads of Ammin. for U.S.A. Troops, as well as Their own Inf. Strength 31,0/Rs surplus. On leave, 1 officer & 21, 0/Rs. (#10)

August 12th. CHIPILLY. Weather, fine.

D.A.C. Hqrs. Office, Horsemaster, P.O., Pay Sgt., etc. move up from DAOURS to MALARD WOOD, near river, leaving a small bulk stores at DAOURS. No.11 Dental Unit move from DAOURS to VAIRE. Collected samplesof .77, 4.2", and 5.9" shells and charges, of different classes & sent them back to D.A.H.Q. at CORBIE for instructional purposes with the guns that the loth. Bde. sent back.

Lt. Hutchinson ordered to be transferred from S.A.A. Section to 110th. Bty .: owing to two officers still being in field 3 with Anti-tank gun detachments, ix I am not able to replace an officer in his sub-section, and am daily expecting Lt. Dickinson from Base.

4 p.m. A 43, from D.A. informs me of LAISON Force, & I warf all units for a possible move.

11 p.m. Received A 52, instructing move into action on 13th inst. in LIHONS Area. I issue orders to pass A.R.P. at 4.15 a.m., 13th. inst. & march via CHIPILLY-CERISY-to GAILLY. E.A. drops bombs vicinity bivouacs.

11th. Bde. 512A, 400AX. Strength 71 other ranks surplus. On leave 1 officer & 24 other ranks.

24th Aug. GUILLAUCOURT. Cool, dull. Issued 476 A, 332 AX, to loth Bde. Strength, 26 O.Rs surplus. On leave, 1 Officer, 49 O.Rs. I issue D.A.C. Orders No 26 & No 27 (attached). BIlletting officer & parties leave for LONGUEAU area. Capt. D.E. Aikins goes temporarily to 43rd Bty & Lt McKeown is placed as O.C. No 2 Section. A new forward A.R.P. is established by Lt Mein, Dump Officer, south of HARBONNIERES. O.C. S.A.A. Section & "K" Subsection move from CAYEUX to RIVERY. Ammn salvage proceeds during night, 1 QR. being wounded by shell fire & 1 by bombs. Two bombs fall at Headquarters wounding 1 O.R. (on picket duty). No 416 Dr Lye L.A. (emb 1914) at once rides out though E.A. are active & in 2 hour arrives with Amb. lorry: wounded man dies on 25th. (Total casualties, 3).

28th Aug. LONGUEAU. On leave, 1 Officer, 52 O.Rs. Inspections of harness, vehicles & clothing: these are not unduly affected by the work in the line, & generally are in E good state. Horses and mules are well & in excellent condition: galls or sores confined to 3 or 4 cases.

29th Aug. LONGUEAU. On leave, 1 Officer, 55 O.Rs. L.M.G. classes; map-reading refresher course, all N.C.Os; driving & saluting mounted parades. Capt. Heatley, Dental Officer to England.

30th Aug. LONGUEAU. On leave, 1 Officer, 51 O.Rs. Inspections and training.

1. Cases have occurred in which gas casualties have been caused by men entering dugouts abandoned by the enemy in which Yellow Cross Gas Shells have been exploded.

In one case a dugout was found to contain a 180 m.m. Yellow Cross Gas Shell, by the side of which were laid two slabs of "PERDITE" fitted with a firing device. The explosion of the "PERDITE" would break up the gas shell without doing much damage to the dugout, and as a result the dugout would be filled with a cloud of gas in high concentration.

All troops should be warned of this practice on the part of the enemy, and captured dugouts should not be entered without the

necessary precautions.

During a raid recently, the enemy dropped a number of smoke generating tubes and 77 m.m. Yellow Cross shells into the ventilating shaft of a tunnel. To guard against such action in future, the entrances of tunnels or ventilating shafts should where possible, be protected by thick barbed wire entanglements, and an adequate system of ventilation should be arranged to prevent an accumulation of poisonous gas in the tunnel.

BRIEF NARRATIVE of OPERATIONS of AUG. 7th .- 10th. 1918. inclusive.

(In reply to A/114)

D.A.C. Factors prior to Attack of 7th/8th.

Sufficient Warning of Operation was given to allow of complete preparations in detail, & duties & positions at various hours of individuals: & to allow of full supply of ammunition to be deposited in the secret positions and at same time allow a period of rest for the animals before their march out at Zero.

Secrecy appeared to be generally well maintained by subordinates and ranks, & a sensible conception of the task, & preliminary arran-

gements which were many.

Strengths of personnel & animals were good.

Ammunition to be deposited was 640 rds. per 18-pr. & 582 per Howitzer to be completed on night of 5/6th .: total 23040, 18-pr. and 6984 How .: D.A.C. carried approx. 1/3 of this.

On 6th. inst. position of 1st. Dump & Bivouacs immediately after

attack were selected & signboards errected.

II. Prior to & during Attack night 7/8th.

Aug.7th. I moved up with small field staff & the Technical Stores Wagons, and dug in adjoining the proposed New Dump at J 32 c 8 5, VAIRE, on which were the 38th. Bty. Guns. Most Btys. were acquainted with this position of Stores during the night.

III. THE OPERATIONS.

12.15 a.m. Instructions received to provide two Officers and Aug.8th. detachments for two 15-pr antitank guns, to be found in rear of HAMEL, & taken over from 3rd. Aust. Div. at Zero plus 4 hrs.: and to be ready to move them forward when ordered.

4 a.m. Dark and apparently misty. No enemy shells fall near

Dump during night.

4.20 a.m. Zero hour: barrage commenced on North of River by

some three seconds . No return fire from enemy .

Zero plus 60 mm. 1st. batch of prisoners (about 16) approached VAIRE: Mist obscured party at 15 to 20 yds.

Zero plus 120 mm. or about: 10th. A.F.A.Bde. teams & limbers come up in sucession of Batteries from the rear & move forward in the mist.

No technical stores were asked for or appeared to be required during this phase of the Operations. I commence to salve cables,

camouflage etc abandoned on Bty. positions.

Zero plus 140mm. No.1 Section arrives followed by No.2: the Dump Officer, Lt. Mein, & personnel allot tracks & spots for depositing ammunition: each sub-section allied to its Bty. of 10th. or 11th. Bde. has it's allotted task in, normally, dropping it's echelon of 6 Amm. Limb. Wagon loads on the Dump & collecting at once the ammn. abandoned. The Howitzer Sub-sections form bivouac on the 110th. & 111th. Bty. positions behind HAMEL Ridge & stack neatly & camouflage the rds. & charges left.

A refill of ammn. is asked for by some Btys. early in the day &

these are sent to B.W.Ls. vicinity GAILLY & South of same.

9 a.m. Dump is connected by telephone & now constitutes A.R.P...

Some Battery positions are cleared.

1 p.m. I ride out with messenger staff & view roads & tracks running Easterly in view of further advance of Sections & A.R.P. Appears to be one road only - running parallel with river - in very good state -, but once the front line trenches are passed the open country appears suitable for transport work.

2 p.m. 60 lorries commence to arrive at A.R.P. with more ammin. 3 p.m. Antitank guns found- Officers report, no crews with them: they are in pits requiring 3 to 4 hours digging ramps to haul them out Limbers found eventually in FOUILLOY. After dark Guns were ordered forward & I allot vicinities @ 23 @ 24 & personal reconnaissance forward of these.

Brief Narrative of Operations of Aug. 7/10th. 1918, inclusive.

Continued: -III.

The S.A.A. Section are at AUBIGNY with S.A.A. & Grenade dump at FOUILLOY: I Sub-section delivers 14 wagon loads of ammn. to 4th. Infty. Bde. under Lt. Hutchinson, leaving at 8 a.m., 5 of the wagons unloading after being fired on by the enemy, in the red line, arriving back at AUBIGNY at 5 p.m.: & starting again at once with 14 more wagons, unloaded them between MORCOURT & MERICOURT & arrived back at midnight: J Sub-section, under Lt. Elliston delivered 14 wagon loads between 10 a.m. & 5 p.m. at WARFUSEE ABANCOURT, & a similar amount between 7.30 p.m. & 3.30 a.m. (9th.inst)

During 8th. inst. 2,0 ranks (N.C.Os.) were wounded, one of whom died on 9th. inst.: and one A.L. Wagon complete with equipment

is transferred to 38th. Bty.

Aug. 9th. 9 a.m. VAIRE; Weather fine.

I leave with S.C.R.A. & M.T. Officer & a new A.R.P. is selected near GAILLY X roads at Q 7 a 3 4, about 3 miles by road.

10 a.m. I lead up an M.T. convoy of 13-pr. ammn. taking A.R.P.

Officer & a party to errect signboards.

11 a.m. Issue orders to D.A.C. to advance at 4 p.m. to GAILLY: advantages being, proximity to river for the animals, & to A.R.P. for refilling.

3 p.m. Am given position of front line North of River & issue message to Sections promulgating this, cancelling move forward, and forbidding watering of horses forward of Q 2 central.

Arty. Ammunition delivered to loth. & 11th. Bdes. from noon 7th.

inst. to 6 p.m. 9th. inst.:-

3436 Shrap & 2508 H.E. to 18-pr. B.W.Ls. & 900 how. rds., total 6844 rds.

Aug. 10th. VAIRE to GAILLY. Weather fine.

Both A.R.Ps. are well stocked; classes include 18-pr.

Shrap, H.E., & Smoke: Howitzer H.E., & Gas: and 13-pr.

The O.C. A.R.P. has telephone at GAILLY. At 2.30 p.m. I issue Order No.22 giving front line: ordering move forward at 4 p.m.; leaving guards on VAIRE & A.R.P., & Howitzer dumps and ordering all gas shell to be placed part on VAIRE & part on GAILLY

Dumps. 5 p.m. Am located on telephone at GAILLY A.R.P.; No.1 Section at P 11 d, & No. 2 at P 6 c, awaiting orders to follow the Batteries

North of the SOMME.

Trench Mortar ammunition is sent forward at 8 p.m., & at

9 p.m. I reconnoitre the approaches to & bridges at CERISY.

At 11.10 p.m. orders are received that D.A.C. will not cross the river to-night.

Sections are in touch with their B.W. Lines & also deliver direct to 111th. Bty. position. 11th. Bde. W.L. Officers state supply is satisfactory.

S.A.A. Section is still at AUBIGNY & is to move to VAUXsur-SOMME on 11th.

Wounded in action on 10th. inst. 2,0 ranks, (1 N.C.O. evac. & 1 gunner returned to duty.)
