





Open Warfare Scheme for 10th instant.

RAL IDEA. (1) A state of tronch warfare has existed between our force (Blue) and enemy force (Red) on a general line.

GUERT - 10 BUISSON - COULDIBY - CAMPAGNE loz BOULOWAIS.

(2) Blue force has subjected Red force to centinuous attacks and bembardments, and to relieve our pressure and to delay our main attack, the enemy has retired Dastwards on front of Blue 1st Army (North of us) and shows signs of doing likewise on our front. (3) Enomy front line on 3rd Australian Division front runs

as follows:-BOIS du TERTRE - 10 BUISSON - point 400 yards East of HARLETTES.

SPICIAL IDEA. (1) On the night of the 9/10th May, the 11th Australian Infantry Brigado is holding a frontago of 2000 yards - frontage running from s to H, right flank in BOULOGNE - LUMBRES road - Loft flank 2000 yards I of this road. The front line tronch runs II & S, 200 yards East of HARLETTES.

(2) The dispositions of the Brigade are as fellows:-(a) 42nd & 45rd Battalions in the line, 42nd on the right & 45rd on the

loft, each holding a front of 1000 yards.

Jach of those Battalions is disposed as fellows:-

Four Sempanies in the line, each Sempany with one Plateen plus 2 Lowis Gun sections in front line, 1 Plateon in support and 2 Plateons (loss 2 Lewis Gun Sections) in Battalion reserve.

(b) 44th & 41st Battalions in roservo. 44th Battalion billottod at AL JUINES and 41st Battalion bivouacked and billotted at the West edge of DOIS FORTH TAILLE and BULLSCAMPS.

(c) Machine Gun Coy - 8 guns in the line

(d) Tronch Hortar Battery. 4 Hortars in line, 4 in Brigado Roservo. (3) On the morning of the 10th May, patrols of the 42nd & 45r Battaliens report enemy trenches on their front, have been vacated by onemy. Similar information comes to hand along the whole Corps front and is further confirmed by aeroplane observation at 5 a.m. on merning of 10th instant. Aeroplane reports enemy appears to hold line QUELHES - LUIBRES - ELMES - MAVRAMS, but has a strong outpost position on the lino ZUTOVE - NORDAI - lo VAL d'ACQUIN - N.D. des ARDENIS.





Monaction was taken but it will be under close observation during the day and will be again investigated to-night and an attompt made to bring it in..

OUR DEFENCES: General repairs were effected to front line, supports and communication trenches. Wire was repaired in many places and 50 yards of now wire was put in opposite the right of SUFFOLK AVENUE.

ATRORAFT: Active during the day and particularly so between 6 p.m. & B.30 p.m. when 13 were observed flying over enemy lines. At 4,40 a.m., on 25/5/17 one of our planes was seen to be hit and fall in flames thin our lines North of PLOEGSTEERT.
