

			a good many men fell out - this was chiefly due to a heavy fog, also when the fog lifted to the heat of the day. Column reached Mashama about 4 p.m., and bivouaced for the night.	
ashama	28th		Left fer Meascar about 6.30 a.m. Owing to the intense heat of the day the march was a failure - men lasted well up to mid-day, but from then on to Meascar, they began to fall out	
			ewing to the very heavy going ever the soft sand, and also to the intense heat. First party of the Bn., reached Meascar about 5 p.m. The remainder arriving at irregular hours up to	
			10 or 11 p.m. The men who fell out were mostly genuine cases of fatigue - this was due to the weak condition of the men after the fortnight's ineculation, and also to the time of day
