

" R.G.M.S. 1567 R.Q.M.S. J.B.Watt, 6th. " With the exception of the Asst. Adjt., wh ose appointment was confirmed by Division, the provisional appointments are shown in Appendix 1 attached. Operative H.Qrs. were formed at 2nd. Aust. Div. H.Qrs., and ADministrative at TAHUNA CAMP. The Work of taking over the existing M.G.Coys i.e. 5th. 6th. 7th. and 22nd., and forming them into the 2nd. Australian Machine Gun Battalion was proceeded with. Owing to being a new estaborganisation a H.Q. Orderly Room had to be establis hed. A wire was immediately despatched to Stationery, BOULOGNE, for the necessary equipment. Meanwhile, Sufficient gear, owing to the generosity of the surrounding units, was procured.

Order that the tasks for guns are stated but choice of position and gun is left largely to the discretion of the Coy. Commander who is better able to judge on the positions. During the day the N.C.Os. and men detailed from the various Coys. to form H.Q. Establishment reported. As Capt. H.L. Beale, 6th. Field Ambulance, who had been provisionally appointed R.M.O. had been evacuated sick, Major E. Culpin reported in his place from Reinf. A.A.M.C. The C.O. and Adjutant visited the gunst of the left sector. Returns showing the strength of the Coys. were obtained and a memo forwarded to Division reporting the formation of the unit, together with a statement showing the numbers of O.Rs. required to complete establish ment, i.e. 66. OPERATIONS - MACHINE GUN DEFENCES.

1. Reference to the M.G. S.O.S Barrage across the South West of WARNETON provided by guns numbered 28. 35 to 40 qnd 43 to 48:
This barrage will be put down

(a) At any time that an unusual amount of Lewis gun or Fifle fire is heard on that portion of our front which is opposite to the above S.O.S. barrage.

(b) On S.O.S. signal from above portion of our front.

(c) On S.O.S. telephone message.

2. The following preparation will be at once made by Company Commanders concerned:-

Construction of Fighting Maps showing the full arc of fire to extremen range and, as the ground to be covered is pra Practically all on the one level, both the Q.E. and the range will be shown on the arc for each loo yards from 1500 yards up upwards.

A. B. and C. Batteries- Probably covering from FRELING-HIEN TO HOUPLINES.

D. Battery - 2 Fighting Maps (1 from position of U.22.a.57.44., to be the left gun position of the battery and one from U.22.a.75.12. to be the left gun position for alternative battery site)

This map will probably cover from WARNETON to PONTEROUGE.




