

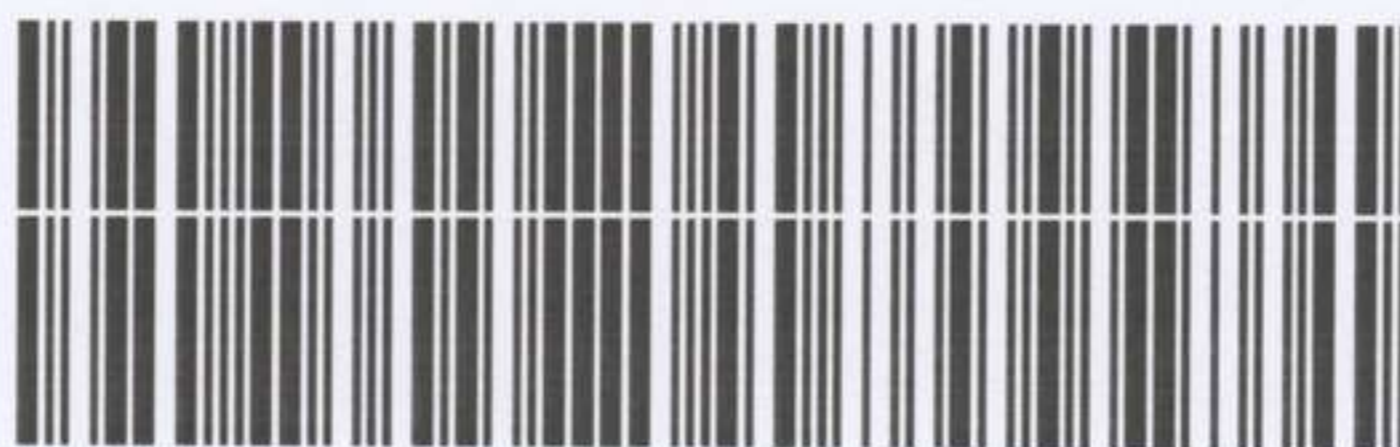

<p>MONASH VALLEY, ANZAC</p> <p>July 15<sup>th</sup></p> <p>July 16<sup>th</sup></p>	<p>Day passed quietly</p> <p>Auckland Battr. relieved Otago Battr. in Courtney's Post, Otago then finding 50 rifles to complete the garrison of Quinns, + 130 of all ranks to complete the garrison of Courtney's</p> <p>Heavy bombing during night 15/16 at Quinns, + a few high explosive shells thrown into night of Courtney's. Otherwise quiet day.</p> <p>Orders from Div. transmitted to Canterbury Battr. at IMBROS to practise at least one night march, advance + attack over hilly ground.</p>	
<p>July 17<sup>th</sup></p>	<p>Supply of bombs on beach low, but 50 friction tubes for Quinns, + 70 cricket ball bombs improved matters in Sect.</p>	
<p>July 19<sup>th</sup></p>	<p>Canterbury Battr. returned from IMBROS, + Otago with some details sent off. 14<sup>th</sup> Austr. Inf. Battr. brought over to act as reserve during the night</p>	
<p>July 20<sup>th</sup></p>	<p>Canterbury Battr. relieved Wellington Battr. in Quinns, Wellington finding detachments required to complete garrisons of Quinns + Courtney's.</p> <p>Secret Orders received from Div. to prepare for an attack on 23<sup>rd</sup></p>	<p>NZ G 623 d- 20/7/15 G.P.C.G.</p>

Dressing Station to be left in present position. Continuance of mining considered essential &amp; fatigues kept going.</p>	
<p>July 22<sup>nd</sup></p>	<p>mess' of 22/23<sup>rd</sup> passed without incident.</p>	
<p>July 24<sup>th</sup></p>	<p>all quiet</p>	
<p>July 25</p>	<p>Otago relieved Auckland in Courtney's. Auckland to form one company to garrison his inner line defences.</p>	
<p>July 28</p>	<p>Wellington relieved Canterbury in Quinn's</p>
