

Working party U.29.b.20.70 was fired on by the 25th. Battery woth effect. 26th. Battery fired on Sugar Refinery U.17.d.40.60 and obtained three direct hits on Tower portion

of the building. 26th. Battery fired on enemy cookhouse U.15.c. and obtained 1 direct hit. Searchlights observed from SURRY FARM 116°30' and 329°30' true bearing.

Suspected Machine Gun position U.30.c.03.75. From observation it appears that this position is not

in use at present. At this time enemy shelled position occupied by the 107th. Battery with 5.9 H.E. A gum flash was observed from MOLLY True Bearing 81°. Time from flash to report from same place was 35 seconds. This bearing intersects a 5.9 Battery at V.20.c.55.00. The heavy Artillery engaged this Battery and immediately silenced them. The maly summer am control station at the Battery was destroyed also a telephone. No injuries were sustained by personnel. The wire out by the 27th. Battery during experimental shoot on the 3th. March, has been repaired

by the enemy and made stronger.

Emerg's Artillery has not been to active as usual during the day. Visibility fair.

in No.5 pit was struck and set on fire and projectiles forced from cases, but no explosion
occurred. At 11.50 a.m. the enemy commenced shelling position again. Four rounds fell in the
Battery position and a number in buildings further along the road towards PLOESTMERT WOOD.
During the first Bombardment a hostile aeroplane was flying over Battery position. At 9.15a,m.
our planes appeared, and the shelling immediately cased.
New enemy wire observed behind support line between V.28.d.28.52 and V.28.d.28.32.

During the day enemy's Artillery was not active on our trenches, but was very active on the back areas of the Sector.

Dugout previously located 0.24.a.90.48 has now been reinfered with congrete. Visibility bad owing to Enowsterms.

Most of the traffic seemed to come down the read to FORT ROWE, and then round the cross reads to the south.

Large motor transport observed going south on LES MCLUMME road in C.6.b.20.50.

Steam observed from a train in the direction of QUMCBOY proceeding in a south easterly direction. Supported C.P. in house at U.SO.s. 85.05 was fired on by the 27th. Battery and four direct hits obtained.

A shoot was strengted by the 107th. Battery with Balloon observation on Bridge at U.29.b.20.40. but owing to bad observation the shoot could not be completed.

Aeroplanes were very active during the day.

Hostile Artillery was inactive during the period.

Traffic on the PORT HOUSE road was fired on by the 25th. Battery, but the range was very great.

Remarks 3/00 a.m. Machinesum located C.4.d.22.44 was fired on by 25th Battery and silenced. 10.00 a.m. Werking Party observed U.23.b.50.35 engaged by 26th Battery and dispersed. 11.05 a.m. Enemy Herseman and men observed moving about U.23.b.50.35. 11.10 a.m. Party observed U.23.b.50.35 were fired on by 26th Battery and 2 casualties inflicted. 12.00 noon Ememy Working Party Observed in Front Line U.21.b.90.90 fired on by 26th Battery and dispersed. 1.30 p.m. A beard was observed in front of Ememy's Trenches U.22.b.90.90 on which was written the number 177. At 3 p.m. it was noticed that this beard had been remeved. 10.30 a.m. Party of Enemy observed erecting wire U.30.a.87.90. This Party was fired on by 27th Battery and immediately took refuge in MYSTERY HOUSE U. 30.a. 87.90. This House was then fired enand one direct hit obtained. 5.20 p.m. 27th Battery carried out a shoot on X Roads C.11.b.33.93 with Balleon Observation. This shoot was carried out with success. 9.00 a.m. Party of Germans were observed mear-Bo beneath POWT ROUGE Bridge engaged on what appeared to be a Penteen. 4.55 a.m. 25th Battery epened fire S.O.S. in response to rockets and telephone message from Company Commander but 'Cease Fire'was given shortly afterwards when it was ascertained that S.O.S. was not required. It appears that an Enemy Patrol of three men approached within 10 yards of our parapet and one of our men seeing them exclaimed 'Let it go boys there here'. This was repeated and mistaken for the S.O.S. hence red reckets being fired and telephone message to the 25th Battery. 88 rounds were expended in consequence. 5.30 p.m. 26th Battery engaged Targets 40 and 41 with aereplane observation and received O.K. from Observer for both targets. Enemy's Artillery was again active during the day. Most of the fire was directed against our Trenches in C.4.a. Group retaliation was given several times during the day and had the effect of silencing Enemy. Visibility fair. 6.00 p.m. Z. Z. A. M. T. M. Battery carried out a shoot on U. 16. c. 30.00 . 20 rounds work expended and much damage done to Enemy's parapet and wire. Retaliation was slight. Adada Adam

Method of ranging appears to have been by

Aeroplane in the morging, and sound ranging in the afternoon.

Battery. Enemy Working Party U.21.b.85.80 was fired on by the 25th. Battery with effect. 4 p.m. Considerable amount of work appears to have been carried out by the enemy from FACTORY FARM South to the BIRDCAGE. New Sandbags timber revetting frames, and screens have been erected. Fire of the 107th. Battery on Sugar Refinery was effective and several direct hits obtained. 3.45 p.m. Medium Trench Mortars carried out a shoot on Bniper's position in house C.10.b.70.30. Thirty rounds were expended with good effect. A considerable portion of the wall of the house were blown in, and the trenches in the vicinity were damaged. Enemy's retaliation was fairly heavy. 12 Mingnyerfers were fired and fell in the vicinity of C.10.b.13.65. Our Trench Mortar was hit but and amaged. Searchlight observed from SURREY HOUSE True bearing 45°. 9.30 p.m. Enemy Observation Balloon ascended near WARNETON but descended after a short time. 10.30 a.m. The 26th. Battery was again shelled, from the direction of V.19.b & c . The Heavy Artillery 6.10 p.m. engaged Batteries in this area and Hostile fire ceases soon afterwards. Enemy's Artillery Fire was not so heavy during the period. Visibility good. Registrationson U.38.b.15.45, U.29.b.73.35 and U.23.a.75.95 were carried out by Balloon 10 a.m. observation by the 26th. Battery position in U.1.4.10.50 with 4.2 and continued for 24 hours, firing 1 wound about every 5 minutes. Three direct hits were obtained damaging carriage of No. 2 Gun, and blowing in a dugout destroying some bedding and clothing. About 2 hours later enemy fired 50 rounds of 5.9 on to position but no further damage was done to material. After enother interval of 15 minutes enemy fired 50 rounds 5.9 gun fire. This was followed later by 40 rounds of 4.2 Cas shell. Enemy continued until about 7 p.m. to fire a

few rounds of 5.9 H.F. on to position at intervals.

Information received that considerable amount of work was being carried out in enemy lines from FACTORY FARM to 200 yards Borth. This part of the line was brought under fire and the work immediately consed.

Enemy's fire was mainly directed against Batteries in the Back Areas of the Sectors.

Visibility good.


