

WEEKLY VETERINARY REFORT FOR : WEEK ENDING 14.11.18.

The whole of Divisional Transport has had a difficult time, owing to break down in railways whilst moving to this area (the permanent way having been blown up by enemy mines). This resulted in long waits in trains, and difficulties in horse rations. No ill effect was noted, and very few minor casualties for the week. On march from Le Cateau area to Bohain area, the long coats were a great tax on all animals. The outbreak of lice in Divisional artillery has been stopped by clipping, and treating animals. No evacuations for the week, and the whole of the Transport animals are under review at present in order to cull out any useless animals or animals unlikely to stand march through to the Rhrins.

Weekly Veterinary Report week ending 21st, November 1918.

During the week's Light Draughts were reseived from Remounts and alloted to Diw. Engineers, and 54 were evacuated. These latter were heavier than under normal conditions as instructions were given to delete all animals unfit to march to the Rhine.

Clipping has been in progress throughothe Infantry Bdes.

during the week, and good progress has been made under the circumstances 274 amimals have been clipped during the three working days to to-night The unclipped draught animals are falling off in condition, as it is found impossible to dry them off after work, and cases of skin disease are found to be starting when some animals are clipped out. Lice has been prevalent but in all caipped animals there is no change for parasites to harbour. Shortage of motor transport has put extra loads on horse transport. The roads passed over on march off. Division from Bohain to Cartignies were in places bad, but the situation was saved ny frost. As usual the mules show less wastage than the horses. This fact stands out more and more as the Australian driver has got used to dealing with theseanimals. In the early days of the war he did not take kindly to the change from horses to mules, but today the relations between the Australian driver and his mule team is one of good comradeship- more marked than with the horse driver, and a every effort is made by Veterinary Officers to foster this, with satisfactory results. To-day unmanageable mules are rare, which condition did not attain two years ago.

Notification from Ist. A.WW.S.that a motor horse ambulance was available for use was received with great satisfaction. The Ist, Australian Diwision is very greatful to the Australian Purple Cross for their generous gift.

During the week the Division moved into a new Area. Clipping was consequently interfered with. In addition great difficulty has been experienced with unsatisfactory clipper heads, which in some cases would not clip when new. The result has been unsatisfactory. Sharpening is now mostly done at the M.W.S., and it is hoped better resilts will be obtained,

The Divisional Artillery rejoined the Division in this Area haveing marched firom the Arraines to present Area.

mfantry animals show improvement in majority of both horses and mules; clipped horses show marked improvement. Allanimals are underscover, which is in most cases satisfactory, though there is a lack of air in a a few stables. In the latter the animals are picquetted outside during the dady time.

One case of auspicious mange has occured which has not yet been ***** definitaly diagnosed.


