			General (continued) These two latter men were working in the adjacent Workshops. After the accident they were at once removed to 15th C.C.S., Hazebrouck, and the remains of SGT. Batty were interred at Bailleul on 15th inst. The Christmas season was not allowed to pass unnoticed. The bill of fare was greatly enhanced by gifts—gif puddings from the War Department, chocolate from the Australian War Contingent Association, and sundries from private friends. On Christmas eve, and Christmas night, two very successful concerts were held, and were well attended. Good order was maintained, and proper discipline observed. Monetary gifts, amounting tof200 were received from organizations in Australia, for the Australian troops, who, however, allotted portion to their Imperial comrades. The health of the Unit has been good, and senitation well attended to.
