



Batteries zero lines and registrations checked. During early part of night a Minnenwerfer at M.17.a.0.6. was engaged by 18-pounders. MARTINPUICH and vicinity shelled from direction of LOUPART WOOD. Hostile aircraft active. Major J. PAUL temporarily Commanding Brigade during absence at 2nd. D.A.H.Q. of Lieut. Colonel H.W. LLOYD, DSO.	
	8.2.	17	During the night LOUPART WOOD, LOOSCUT LOOS CUT and various tracks etc. were subjected to bursts of fire. MARTINPUICH, LE SARS and DESTREMONT FARM shelled by 15cm. Howitzers during the day. MARTINPUICH and DESTREMONT FARM shelled by enemy. 7.45 p.m. and 10 p.m. Lachrymatory shelling of LE SARS. 8 p.m. Small operation carried out.	
	11.2.17	3.45 p.m. SHELTER WOOD CAMP was shelled by 4.2 H.V. Gun from direction of ACHIET-LE- GRAND. Counter pattery Group notified and shelling ceased at 4 p.m.

FLERS.	24.2.17	2nd. D.A.H.Q. advised Brigade that it is suspected the enemy is vacating vcertain country on our front. Registrations were obtained on the BUTTE Trench. Suspected machine guns and trench mortars were fired on at M.16.b.85.55 and M.10.c.20.80. During the night GALLWITZ (M.10.c and d) GALLWITZ SUPPORT (M.10.a) and LOUPART WOOD were harassed. Visibility low, observation poor.	
	25.2.17	1.15 a.m. Corps message states front system vacated by enemy. 1.45 a.m. 13th. Battery moved forward to new position at M.28.d.50.80; considerable difficulty was experienced in moving, several guns being bogged-and was not in action until the afternoon. 3.10 p.m. 105th. Battery warned to be prepared to move forward tonight.	
	26.2.17	14th. Battery moved forward and were in action at noon. 11.30 a.m. to 3.45 p.m. MALT TRENCH kept under constant bombardment in support of our Infantry who have so far made two unsuccessful attempts to capture it.	
	27.2.17	2.25pm.No firing to take place on MALT TRENCH in M.4.d. after 5 p.m. by request of Left Inf. Brigade.	
	28.2.17	1.25 a.m. Another attack by our Infantry on MALT TRENCH supported by our Artillery again proved unsuccessful. 1 p.m. 13th. Battery fired 250 rounds to cut wire on LOUPART Road at M.5.c.55.50 to allow a patrol to get through. 3 p.m. 105th. Battery engaged points 5 p.m. 105th. Battery engaged point M.5.a.30.20. and M.5.a.15.65. 6.11 p.m. S.0.5. reported. 6.13 p.m. Brigade opened at slow rate. 6.17 p.m. Ceased fire.
