



The CO & Adjutant, 11 th Army Dde & full complement of HQ took over command of Right Group Artillery at 4pm. from CO 5 th Brigade. Lt Col. H.W. Riggall DSO (CO) & Lt Kingmill (Adj) remained the night to assist if so required. All other officers & personnel moved to 526c r.s. (street 28) in the Mems area where comfortable billets were occupied. <i>Move Order No 4</i>	
Mertis Area	3.4.18	9am	Batteries were clear of Wagon Lines & on main Bailleul Road. The CO & Adjutant arrived from HQ in the line having completed the handover. The Brigade was inspected by the CO on the march. The general turnout was good. The trek occupied about an hour. 	4.4.18		Batteries were training in gunnery and preparing for an early move south. at 6.30 pm Dty commanders visited HQ & dined with CO during the evening matters relating to their individual commands were discussed.	" No 2

	6.4.18	10.15am	The CO & Adj. visited and inspected Batteries. Turnout was good. Steelwork of harness was good but leatherwork requires attention. 10 th Dty had dirty wagons. Orders were received to entrain at CAESTRE on 7 th & 8 th inst. Dde HQ & 2 nd Section DAB go on first train leaving at 4.18 pm. 13 th Dty train leaves at 7.18 pm 14 th Dty at 10.18 pm 15 th Dty at 1.18 am 8.4.18. & 105 th Dty at 4.18 am.	
	7.4.18	9am	HQ moved out and proceeded to CAESTRE where it entrained with 2 nd DAB for St Roch station AMIENS. Lt J. Roberts MC with a guide from each battery also proceeded in the first train to act as billeting party.	
	8.4.18	3.30	The first train arrived at ST ROCH after an uneventful journey and was met by Brigade Major with instructions to proceed to BEHENCOURT. Horses were watered just prior to their being trucked and were not again watered until arrival at POIT NOUVELLES at 11 am. They were none the worse for the trip. It rained incessantly all day and the trek was distinctly uncomfortable. Fortunately the roads were excellent. Good billets were allotted and cover for a few riding horses found. Wagon Lines were however placed in an open field adjoining Behencourt Chateau. Most of the inhabitants of the village had departed and the majority of the remainder were making hurried preparations to evacuate. The enemy having lightly shelled in the close vicinity during the previous night. Batteries entrained according to programme & were piloted to their respective quarters, the last, the 105 th Dty reported arrival at 6 pm.	
	8.4.18	8.30am	Batteries were busy cleaning up. Harness and vehicles being very dirty after wet journey. The CO & Adj. visited CRA at BEAUCOURT and at 9.30am with Dty's each accompanied by a Section commander and Telephone No 2.





1. Arrangements for taking over Anti-Tank Guns are as follows:-
 - (a) Left Group (3): To be taken over by the batteries of 19th D.A. relieving those from which personnel is drawn at present.
 - (b) Centre Group: Present D.A.C. detachments to be relieved by detachments from the 6th (Army) A.F.A. Bde. The D.A.C. personnel will after relief be attached to 4th A.F.A. Bde. until arrival in the MERRIS Area, when they will rejoin their units.
2. Reference Para. 8 and Table "A", Serials 1 & 4:-

All M.T.M. Bties, on leaving this area, will now take their establishment of 6" NEWTON Mortars with them. The following instructions therefore cancel those to the contrary in para. 8 and Serial 1:-

 - (a) D.T.M.C., 2nd Aust. Div., will hand over to 9th M.T.M. Sty. Five 6" NEWTON T.M's on April 2nd in place of those taken over in the line.
 - (b) 4th and 5th A.M.T.M. Bties., when relieved by the T.M. Bties of the 25th Div. Arty., will move from the line with twelve 6" NEWTON T.M's. complete.
 - (c) Reference sub-para. 2(a) above, Staff-Captain, 2nd Aust. D.A., will notify transport arrangements.

1. The 5th. A.F.A. Brigade will be relieved by the 11th (Army) Brigade, R.F.A., in accordance with Table "A", attached.
 2. Moves of Wagon Lines will be carried out in accordance with Table "B", attached.
 3. In all cases where guns and howitzers are exchanged, they will be handed over stripped of all sights and stores, except aiming posts.
 4. All Maps, aeroplane photographs, O.P. Log-Book, Defence Schemes and documents relating to the Sectors batteries are covering, will be handed over and receipts obtained.
 5. On all marches, distances will be 500 yards between Brigades and D.A.C., 100 yards between Batteries, and 50 yards between Sections of Batteries. For Brigaded Transport - 25 Yards between every sixth and seventh vehicle.
 6. Battery Transport will proceed with its respective Battery for the move into MERRIS Area, and will remain with Batteries on all marches unless advised to the contrary.
 7. Circular white discs will be carried on every sixth wagon or vehicle.
 8. Further orders will be issued with regard to the number of Howitzers to be taken over by 105th. How. Battery.
 9. DRESS - OTHER RANKS.- Marching Order, hats turned up (to be turned down if raining).
- OFFICERS.- Caps, Haversacks, water-bottles, small box respirators, glasses and prismatic compass.
 10. Each Battery will carry one machine-gun with Battery, and one with ~~with~~ Battery transport.
 11. No more than two men per pair of wheels to ride on wagons &c., Dismounted men with portion of N.C.O's to march in rear of Battery under the supervision of an officer. Men will be changed at halts.
 12. Further Orders will be issued, giving Billeting Area &c., on receipt from 2nd. D.A.H.Q.

1. (a) The 2nd Aust. Division (less Artillery) is being relieved in the Right Div'l. Sector and Area of the Corps front by the 19th and 25th Divisions, (both less Artillery) between March 31st and April 3rd.

(b) Commands pass as follows:-

(i) Present Left Bde. Sector of 2nd Aust. Div. front: from G.O.C. 2nd Aust. Div. to G.O.C., 19th Div. at 10 am, April 2nd.

(ii) Present Right & Centre Bde. Sectors: from G.O.C., 2nd Aust. Div. to G.O.C., 25th Div. at 10 am on April 4th.

(c) On completion of reliefs, Div. H.Q.'s. will be as follows:-
19th Division - DRANCUTRE,
25th Division - RAVELSBERG.

(d) The Inter-Div'l. Boundary between 19th and 25th Divs. will be the line of the R. DOUVE Westwards to T.12.a.2.8., thence along the inter-area boundary between the PLOEGSTEERT area and the NEUVE EGLISE area and the KORTEPYP area and the NEUVE EGLISE area.

2. Reliefs of Artillery covering the present Right Div'l. Sector of the Corps front will be carried out in accordance with attached TABLE "A".

3. (a) The 13th A.F.A. Bde will withdraw from the line to Wagon Lines at 6 pm, April 1st, and will entrain with 9th A.M.T.M. Bty. on April 3rd.

(b) In place of the 13th A.F.A. Bde., one Bde., 19th Div. Arty. will come into the line to cover the (then) 19th Div'l. front on the night April 3rd/4th; batteries to be in action and registered by 6 pm, April 4th.

The positions to be occupied are:-

18-Pdr batteries: U.1.d.38.38.*; U.13.a.8.8.*; O.31.o.7.7.

4.5" How. battery: U.7.d.09.70.*

(* Positions evacuated by 13th A.F.A. Bde.)

4. In view of the withdrawal of the 13th A.F.A. Bde. unrelieved, the Centre Group, 2nd A.D.A., will from 6 pm, April 1st, place two 18-pdr batteries under the orders of the Left Group, 2nd A.D.A. These will continue under the command of the R.F.A. Bde. relieving the 6th (Army) A.F.A. Bde., until 6 pm, April 4th. Necessary arrangements will be made between Group Commanders direct.

5. Moves of Wagon Lines will be carried out in accordance with TABLE "B" attached.

6. In all cases where guns are exchanged, they will be handed over stripped of all sights and stores, except aiming posts.



ACTION IN THE EVENT OF A WITHDRAWAL. Headquarters,

2nd. Aust. Div. Arty.,

15th April, 1918.

(Cancelling sections 5 & 7 of "C" Div. Arty.
reference scheme, dated April 11th.).

1. Traces have been issued showing the "Forward Zone", "Corps (or Second) Zone" and "Army (or 3rd) Zone" of defence. The Divisional policy is to fight to a finish in the "Forward Zone". If however it becomes apparent that the Forward Zone cannot any longer be successfully defended a definite and complete withdrawal to the "Second Zone" may be ordered by Divisional Headquarters.
2. (a) The attached Table "A" shows the various positions selected for the various systems of defence.
 - (b) Batteries will withdraw in succession in co-operation with the Infantry withdrawal and under orders issued by the Group Commanders. At all stages the utmost support is to be given to the Infantry.
 - (c) Group Commanders will issue a definite scheme, detailing routes to Batteries. Although it may not be always be possible to hold strictly to any pre-arranged plan, as a general principle, orders should be issued which provide for a withdrawal in echelon of batteries. The Superimposed Group will not withdraw until the other Groups have withdrawn.
 - (d) Group Commanders will, during the withdrawal, keep in close touch with the Infantry Brigadiers, and act in conjunction with them, varying their dispositions as occasion demands.
 - (e) All Officers will be required to know the location of their respective B.A.C.'s and M.A.C.'s, and all M.A.C. and B.A.C. Officers, the location of Refilling Points for the Rear Lines. The latter will be notified later.
 - (f) Locations of H.Q.'s., B.A.C.'s and M.A.C.'s will be notified later.
3. MOBILE BRIGADE :- The Brigade kept as mobile Reserve at the disposal of the Division will be used as the occasion demands under orders from the C.R.A. Its role will probably be to deal with any break in the line or to watch the flanks. All officers are to make a thorough reconnaissance of the Divisional Area so that Batteries may be brought into action at any point without delay. These units must act boldly, risks can be taken and ground can be manoeuvred over, which would be impossible in the face of an enemy who has had his guns emplaced for long periods with excellent C.P.'s and communications. Officers of these units must remember that they will have to act quickly and will have to find targets by their own reconnaissance.

4. All batteries will maintain an S.O.S. sentry, whose duty it will be to watch for signals from the vicinity of battery position.

6. On receipt of an S.O.S. signal or message, fire will be opened at once at the following rates on the S.O.S. Barrage lines and Howitzer objectives :-

- First five (5) minutes -- 3 rounds per gun or how. per minute.

- Next five (5) minutes -- 1 " " " " " "

Ammunition 18-pdr. 75% A, 25% A.X.
4.5 How. 106 fuze when available.

Fire will cease after 15 minutes unless the S.O.S. signal is repeated when the programme will be at once started afresh as for the first 5 minutes.

The above provisions are not to be taken in limiting either Group or Battery Commander from developing the full fire power of their Batteries in the event of their knowledge of the situation demanding it.

7. If an S.O.S. call is received by signal it will be confirmed by wire as soon as possible.
If a signal is seen or a S.O.S. message received, all Units from Batteries upwards will inform the corresponding Unit on each flank and then their immediate superior.

8. All Officers must clearly understand that it is their duty to obtain immediate information as to the situation and to forward timed reports as to the situation to their superior ;
e.g., Batteries to Groups, and Groups to D.A.H.Q.
It is only by this means that the necessary concentration of artillery can be procured.

9. In the event of G A S being received the ordinary warnings will be sent, precautions taken and Howitzers turned on to trenches or points whence the gas is being sent.
If S.O.S. is sent later the ordinary S.O.S. procedure will take place.

10. All 18-pdrs. Batteries must be prepared to cover any portion of the S.O.S. lines.

11. Superimposed Group will not open fire on S.O.S. unless ordered to do so from D.A. Headquarters.
On receipt of an S.O.S. all Batteries of this Group will stand to and be ready to open fire at once.

12. In foggy weather when there is a doubt of the possibility of an S.O.S. signal being seen, a heavy hostile bombardment of the front will be treated as an S.O.S. signal and fire will be opened, opposite the front affected, by the Group Commanders' orders.

With Infantry Brigades:-

A Senior Liaison Officer is provided by the RIGHT Group to act as Liaison Officer with RIGHT Infantry Brigade Headquarters.

With Infantry Battalions -

An Officer from the Group concerned will sleep at each Battalion Headquarters.

By day these Officers may perform the duties of Observing Officer for their Batteries.

These Officers must be provided with a map showing the Zones of all Batteries in their Group and the Battery next on their Group's flank in the case of Batteries of this Division.






