3.19.	The 105th. Battery finished handing all Guns, Stores etc. to D.A.D.O.S.	
	2/Lieut. S.A. Gresves left for LONDON on leave. Lieut. R.J.R. Hurst left on leave for PARIS and NICE and Lieut. C.G. Roberts departed for SOUTHAMPTON where he is to attend a survey Course for 6 months under the Education Scheme.	
	All 'Z' Class Animals were offered for sale and 95 out of a total of 150 were sold. The prices at the beginning of the Sale ran up to 2,350 Francs (maximum) but kept an average of about 1,200 and 1400 Francs and then dropped down to something like 500 and 600 Francs. The sale ended today and the unsold animals were returned to their respective Batteries.	
3.19.	A party was detailed to assist in cleaning up the lines where the horses for sale had been assembled during the last afternoon of sale.	
.19.	Arrangements have been made for the 13th. and 14th. Batteries to return all Ammunition on charge to them tomorrow.	
.19.	Seven G.S. Wagons, Drivers and Teams reported to each of the 13th. and 14th. Batteries from the 2nd. D.A.C. to transport all 18-pounder and S.A.A. Ammunition on charge to the Corps Dump at FORGES-DE-RECQUIGNIES. The party moved off under Lieut. I.F. MacPherson MC. at 7.45 a.m. This now leave only the Guns, Wagons and stores of the 15th. Battery and Stores of Brigade Headquarters left to be sent to D.A.D.O.S.	
.19.	Lieut. R.A. ULCOQ MC. returned from U.K. leave.	
.19.	Lieut. J.R.S. EVANS MC. returned from U.K. leave.	
.19.	At 2 p.m. the Veterinary Officer inspected all 'X' and 'Y' Class horses and out of a total of 60 passed only 36 were fit to be sent to Base.	
.19.	Weather. Mild with occasional light rain.	
.19.	The 36 'X' and 'Y' Class Horses under Lieut. R.A. ULCOQ MC. proceeded by Route March to CHARLEROI and thence by train. One Sergeant, One Corporal and 17 other ranks accompanied the horses to Base. The 13th. Battery have now completed their move from LOBBES. They are billeted in THUIN, VILLE-BASSE.	
ndix 1	Although no feeling with regard to their having to move from LOBBES to THUIN has been expressed, one can imagine their reluctance after living in the most comfortable billets, they ever had in FRANCE or BELGIUM, for the past 2½ months. After this move, without the slightest trouble whatsoever with the men, everything points to the staunchness and determination to see the Brigade regimentally and honourably demobilized, in the same way as they have stuck to their guns during the existence of the Brigade.	
.19.	The Royal Garrison Artillery Band were given lunch by the batteries and then they gave a Concert in the Hotel de Ville from 2.30pm to 4.0pm. The Band consisted of a number of stringed instruments as well as Brass and the rendering of the music was a rare pleasure to the members of the Brigade who were lucky enough to procure seats.

EDUCATION SERVICE. - 5th. A.F.A. BRIGADE.

INTELLIGENCE SUMMARY.

The facilities provided by the Education Service of the I.F. were extended to the 5th. P.A. Brigade on 30th. October 1918. The first practical step in this direction was the appointment of Lieut. J.W. FERGUSON (105th. How. Battery) as Education Officer. Lieut. FERGUSON returned to the Brigade after having spent a month at CHESHUNT COLLEGE, CAMBRIDGE, during which period he had a unique opportunity to become acquainted with the policy and aims of the service he was to represent. On the 5th. November 1918 at ALLONVILLE, the members of the Brigade were paraded by Major DIXON acting C.O. and addressed by the Education Officer who gave a General and detailed account of the aims and aspirations of the Service. Any questions were asked and answered at this meeting.

Classes were immediately formed for Elementary English, Arithmetic, Bookkeeping and Conversational French. Within a few days the Brigade was ordered to move towards Belgium, the move of course temporarily interrupted the work of teaching.

The instructors for these classes were Sgt. BURRELL J. Elementary English and Elementary Arithmetic.

Sgt. STEEL E. Bookkeeping.

Sgt. DALY J. Conversational French.

The Brigade reached TERTRY on 11th. November (Armistice Day) and remained in that location for approximately 3 weeks.

The classes were continued under great difficulties with regard to accommodation, nevertheless the interest of the men was sustained. The attendance was largest in the French Conversational Classes their being upwards of 25 other ranks present.

New classes were formed at TERTRY for German Conversation, one for Officers and one for other ranks. The former were conducted by Gnr. BAILEY K.H. (105th. Battery)

Gnr. BEILEY C.E. (14th. ")

The men's class was also conducted by Gnr. BAILEY K.H.

The general impression at this time was that the Australian Corps was going to occupy German Territory, consequently the interest in acquiring a knowledge of German Conversation was keen. When it was known that the Australians were not going to the RHINE this interest immediately waned except for about other ranks who continued their studies until February 1919 when Gnr. BAILEY was recalled for repatriation. Whilst at TERTRY the classes and operations slowly acquired strength.

The work was again delayed for nearly a week during the journey to CARTIGNIES. At this place comfortable quarters were obtained for class rooms and the attendances grew considerably. New classes were started as under:-

- Elementary Electricity - Sgt. RICKARD - 14th. Battery .
- Applied Mechanics - " " - " "
- Shorthand - Cpl. DALE - " "

While at Cartignies Sgt. BURRELL the instructor in English and Arithmetic was transferred as Educational Officer to take charge of the whole work of education of 4th. Brigade. Corporal BAILEY then took charge of the English Class and Cpl. DALE the Arithmetic Class.

Upon reaching THUIN the work continued to steadily develop and the interest of the men to be maintained.

Our first serious set back was the loss of the services of instructor Cpl. BAILEY who was granted Early Repatriation to enable him to continue his University Studies.

A month later 17.2.19 the service of two more instructors were lost by Repatriation these being Sgt. RICKARD and STEEL.

These three N.C.O.'s gave very able and valuable help in their various subjects.

The set backs referred to concerned the teachers above, in addition to the attendance at classes suffered as the various drafts were despatched from the Brigade for Australia.

At THUIN valuable classes of a semi-practical nature were started and in Forestry and Wool Classing, these being under the charge of Sgt. PHILLIPS and Gnr. BANCROFT respectively.

These two instructors were loaned by the 4th. Brigade for the purpose. The average attendances at these classes ranged from 12 to 20 men.

The early work of the Education Service of the Brigade was effected by the absence of the necessary text books. Most of the work of the first two months was consequently a steady drain on the reserves of knowledge of the instructors.

The manner in which they faced and stuck to their task and their willingness to at all times assist their fellow comrades merits ~~are~~ approbation.

Since the receipt of books the work has been speeded up and advanced. Text books are available for the men attending classes at cost price and approximately 60 books have been sold. The demand is steady. Books for the study of French have been greatest in demand, but the general demand has been well distributed.

In February additional classes were started in Algebra and Agriculture. Cpl. DALE voluntarily added the task of teaching the former as the demand for instruction in Algebra arose from the men in his arithmetic class. Cpl. MILLIGAN of 4th. Brigade undertook the work of teacher in the science of agriculture. His class though not large was very keen and averages 6 men.

Towards the end of February with the aid of Sgt. SMITH an effort was made to restart the German classes but without success.

It is worthy of note that every week new students present themselves for instruction in one subject or another, indicating that the effort made does not fail to reach the men.

To a great measure this tendency counteracts up to date the effect of demobilisation.

A good deal of clerical assistance has been necessary for the work this being rendered at first by Cnr. HODGSON of 14th. Battery and later by Cpl. S. GRESHAM of the same Battery.

The co-operation always existing between all the units of the 2nd. Aust. Div. Arty. in Educational matters was a marked feature of their work. Until about 12th. December 1918 Lieut. FERGUSON did practically the whole of the organisation of the Division at which time Lieuts. BURRELL and REID were attached as Education Officers for the 4th. Brigade and 2nd. B.A.C. respectively. In connection with this feature of harmonious working the debating society and literary circle established with the aid of Chaplains Colonel MERRINGTON, Capt. SLACK and Capt. TONGE are great aids to education. The former meets once each week and the latter twice, ~~each~~ the attendance averaging 75 for the debates and 8 to 12 for the literary circle.

One feature of Educational effort in an artillery Brigade which came strikingly to notice was the difficulty of obtaining regular attendance of classes. This was solely due to the nature of the Brigade, which almost up to the last moment was burdened with its animals and equipment. This permitted ~~only~~ only irregular intervals of freedom for personnel to attend classes. The great majority of classes were held during the evenings.

Through the agency of the Education Service many members of the Brigade - both Officers and other ranks - were enabled to pursue courses which are of direct benefit to them in their avocations in civil life.

The Brigade ceased to function in the early days of April 1919 by which time its personnel were greatly reduced by repatriation.


EMBARKATION QUOTA NO. 23.




