

On 23 Mar 18 a full stop is omitted from the file copy which effectively changes the location referred to.

(c) In at least one discrepancy, the file copy is correct. On 21 Feb 18, in a list of MM winners a hand amendment by Lieut J.B.O'Donnell has been made to the file copy, deleting Williams and inserting Umbers. This amendment is verified by other official records.


